#### Isaiah 40:1-8

[1] Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. [2] Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. # Epistle Reading

#### 1 Corinthians 4:1-5

[1] This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. [2] Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy. [3] But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by any human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself. [4] I am not aware of anything against myself, but I am not thereby acquitted. It is the Lord who judges me. [5] Therefore do not pronounce judgment before the time, before the Lord comes, who will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Then each one will receive his commendation from God.

As an apostle of Christ, Paul was accountable to the Lord who had called him. His faithfulness to Christ would inevitably bring Paul into ongoing conflict with the world. Nonetheless, the apostle was prepared to endure that conflict as he preached God's Word and waited for the return of his Lord and Master. The same is true of every Christian today. The world must attempt to suppress our witness to the truth of God. But that conflict will end when Jesus returns in power and glory as the Judge of all.

# Gospel Reading

#### St. Matthew 11:2–11

[2] Now when John heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples [3] and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" [4] And Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: [5] the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. [6] And blessed is the one who is not offended by me." [7] As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds concerning John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? [8] What then did you go out to see? A man dressed in soft clothing? Behold, those who wear soft clothing are in kings' houses. [9] What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. [10] This is he of whom it is written, "Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way before you.' [11] Truly, I say to you, among those born of women there has arisen no one greater than John the Baptist. Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

**P** This is the Gospel of the Lord.



The Baptist's expectations of judgement upon apostate Israel did not seem to have been fulfilled by the gentle ministry of Jesus. As he languished in prison, John could not help but wonder about God's plan. Jesus commended His cousin's faithfulness and gently reminded him of the prophecies which he himself had proclaimed. Salvation must always come on God's terms in a manner unexpected by men. We who often share John's perplexity about the way God works in our own lives may be encouraged by the Lord's patience with His messenger.





### Catechism Lesson

HOLY COMMUNION will be celebrated next on Christmas Day, December 25 @ 9:30 AM, and Sunday, December 28 @ 9:30 AM. "Let a man examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup." 1 Corinthians 11:28

The Word of God teaches that the bread and wine of the Sacrament are the true Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus Christ. This precious gift of God's grace is to be received in a sense of reverent awe after careful self-examination. The Bible defines that self-

examination as a personal recognition of the real presence of Christ's Body and Blood in the Sacrament, and a repentant acknowledgment of my own sinfulness recognizing my absolute dependence upon Christ as the only source of forgiveness for my sin. Scripture further instructs that our participation in Christ's Body and Blood together is the most profound and powerful way for Christians to acknowledge their unity in the faith. That is to say, when we share in the Body and Blood of Jesus at this altar, we are thereby indicating our common commitment to all of the doctrines of God's Word as they are taught in this congregation. Because of these Biblical convictions, we respectfully request that visitors, who wish to join us in receiving the Body and Blood of Christ and thereby identify with our confession of Bible truth, speak with one of our pastors before attending the Lord's Supper.






