The Bible as Art

If you have not yet seen Our Savior Lutheran Church's latest addition of ecclesiastical art, it is in the bible classroom behind Pastor White. Artist and calligrapher, **Anne nee' Davis Richmond, of P. O. Box 104, Eden, TX 76837**, has donated her magnum opus to Our Savior.

Richmond studied calligraphy at Reed College in Portland, Oregon, where she met her husband, the now deceased, Reverend Lawrence Richmond (LCMS). For nearly her entire life she has designed banners, quilts, knitted, sewed, and created tapestries.

A few years ago, after her husband passed, she decided to create a massive tapestry of Genesis Chapter 1. She studied Rabbi Moshe David Umberto Cassuto's observation of repetition in Genesis, his division of the text, and designated specific colors to each word. For example, for Elohim (God) she selected gold beads with a black border. The letters are each 1.25" to 2" inches high. She employed approximately seventy various colors of thread.



The first four words read, "And God Said, let the waters collect."

She embroidered on upholstery cloth so that the fabric could hold the stitching. There are three panels, each eight' by four.' She began by creating what appears to be three giant pillowcases that fit over Owens Corning FOAMULAR F-250 series purchased from Home Depot. It is light, strong, and moisture resistant. She then glued thin wood strips on the back in key locations for added strength.

Once she realized she had terminal cancer, she was eager to find a permanent location for her tapestry using the Bible as art. To her immense joy and relief, she found that Pastor White and Our Savior Lutheran Church were interested in displaying her tapestry. There were many conversations about where it would best be displayed. Fortunately, the very front of the bible classroom was a perfect fit.

The next hurdle was to find a way to transport the artwork without damaging it. Her neighbor, Tom Venzor, a coast-to-coast semitruck driver, volunteered but he would have to find an open weekend. On Saturday, November 22, Tom, his wife Cindi, 18-year-old son Angelo, the youngest of five, and Annie left Eden at about 9:00 AM and arrived at about 3:00 PM, greeted by Pastor White and maintenance supervisor, Ed Witt. Thankfully, they could worship and attend Bible Class before returning to Eden, TX.

Any written comments about her artwork to the above P.O. Box would be greatly appreciated. She will be survived by her two older sisters' and brother's families. She currently attends Bethel Lutheran Church in Ballenger, TX. We are quite certain that there is not another church in the country that displays such a unique presentation of Genesis Chapter 1.

New Year's Resolutions

Pick a goal for yourself. That may be to read a chapter from the Bible everyday. It may be to read through the Psalms or a specific Gospel. Ask your brothers and sisters in Christ what they do. Parents and couples, read the Scriptures to each other. Start your day or end your day together with Jesus’ Word.

Gathering Together—The writer of the Book of Hebrews instructs us to not neglect gathering together around the Word of God (Hebrews 10:25). Make Church attendance, in person, a priority. You need the gifts proclaimed and placed upon your tongue as well as the mutual consolation of the brethren. The Saints of God build one another up. Throughout the year there are opportunities to gather as a people of God around prayer and fellowship. Reach out to those you miss. Work to encourage one another to attend in order to lift one another up.

Prayer—Christians speak the language of their faith. As the Father has spoken to us through his Son, so we speak back to him. Christians pray. They are intercessors for the needs of others. Christians pray for their families, for the church, those in need, and many others.

This January, let's bind ourselves together as God's holy people and encourage one another in Godly living. Let's teach our children the ways of the Lord.

An appeal—Reading the Bible can be overwhelming when you start. Reordering your life and events so you can be in church can be challenging. Praying for others and praying in front of your family can be scary. If you need help in any of these areas, your pastors are here to help you. Please ask! 


