Houston Lutherans For Life Revitalized

Not many people are aware of the legacy of Houston Lutherans For Life. HLFL formed in 1988 by a group of faithful from Bethlehem Lutheran Church (Houston), and earned non-profit tax status with Department of Treasury in 1994. Cynthia Chappa was president during this time period with Jane Almquist, Jewel Look, Elmer Zoch, Julie Burgess, Helen Konz, and Robert Look holding various offices. At some point, Bethlehem closed with many members transferring to Immanuel Lutheran Church (Houston). HLFL apparently went dormant.



In 2006, under the leadership of Mike Jolley, the tax exempt status, which had expired, was reinstated using OSL as the address of record. Russell Wernli, Sandy Fritsche, and Kevin Hobart were also officers during this time period. Mike was an invigorating force for the group which organized many activities such as marches in Austin, praying at various abortion centers, and raising awareness in Lutheran schools. With Mike's passing and the isolation of COVID, HLFL once again went dormant.

More recently, the core group of HLFL workers, such as Gary & Ruth Schmidt, Ethelene Marshall, Dean & Barbara Mushinski, James Kriegel, and Linda Friedrich (among many others), have revitalized HLFL with a mission to equip Lutherans and their neighbors to be Gospel-motivated voices For Life. We work toward seeing every Lutheran, both individually and in community, upholding the God-given value of human life and influencing society to do the same.

HLFL wants to provide the means to do this through:

- Increased cultural awareness and engagement
- Focus on further life issues, activities, and service from fertility to forever
- An area-wide network of volunteer communities

I hope that you too are interested in being Gospel-motivated voices For Life. *What can you do?*


Brothers & Sisters in Christ:

The world will continue to attack the Church and every Christian. The world is an accomplice of the devil and your sinful nature. Its desire is to tear away the people of God from their Savior. They do that by destroying faith. They do that by destroying the Word of God. The nations rage and the enemies of God scowl, fierce as they will against you and me. It is the place of the Church to remain steadfast in the Word and the teaching of our Lord Christ, despite the silly, absurd, and dangerous teachings and stances of the World. AND the teachings of the world are pretty dangerous. They attack God's gift of family, of sex, of new life, of elderly life, and of marriage and children. They attack the Law and the place of sin. They destroy repentance and the work of the Holy Spirit. Saint Paul tells us to stand firm in the faith. He calls on us to remain faithful to the Word of God.

So, the Word of God is your safe place and your weapon. It is a place of power and might to stand against the devil's schemes. And therefore, the work of a Christian father is never done. The Holy Spirit has fit you, gentlemen, for the work ahead. He gives you his Word. Teach it to your wife and your children. Moses encourages you to talk about it when you get up and when you go to bed, to discuss it when you drive to work and school, and when you sit down to eat (Deuteronomy 6). Make a habit of asking your family what it is they have been taught in their school and how this compares to the Bible. Be good at comparing the world to the Bible. Instead of asking, "How was school?" or "How was your day?" ask questions about their faith and their Savior.

Parents, I urge you to have conversations with your children about Jesus. We don't need to be ashamed of the Word of God or the Truth that it teaches. If we believe that the Word of God is actually the power of God to save and destroy death and the devil, which it is, then it's the trusty shield and weapon each of your family members should walk with everywhere. But also bring your family to the place God promises

to give you forgiveness and life: bring them to Church and to Bible class and to Sunday School. Come to the Worship Services of your God to be bound together in the forgiveness of Jesus' cross. Come to the Lord and be renewed for each and every attack. Come to the normal of the Word of Truth so that you have a shield for the abnormal attacks of the world. The gates of hell shall never prevail against our Lord Jesus.
