

Join the Music Ministry!

It's that time of year again. The Music Ministry is gearing up for a new season and we'd love to have you in any or all of our groups.

OSL offers various groups for anyone to share the talent that the Lord has given them to help enhance our worship. Below is a schedule and brief description of each group. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me or anyone in the music ministry. We all can help. Belonging to one of these groups is an awesome way to build friendships, renew old ones or become involved in the life of the church. Please prayerfully consider where you might fit in.

- 1. Jubilate Choir: Adult choir. We practice every Thursday from 7:00pm to 8:15pm in the choir loft. We sing on the 2nd and 4th Sundays and all Feast Days. We work hard, but we laugh lots. Practices begin on Thursday, September 7th.
- 2. Laudate Choir: Women's choir. We practice on the 2nd and 4th Sundays following Bible class. We practice for about 30 minutes. This choir sings about once a month. Practices begin on Sunday, September 10th.
- 3. Carillon Ringers: *Handbell Choir*. We practice on Thursdays from 6:15pm to 7:00pm in the choir loft. You do not need to be able to read music to play. Just know your right from your left and be able to count to 6 and you'll be fine. This group plays once a month for most of the church's Feast days. *Practices begin on Thursday, September 7th.*
- **4.** Cantate: String and Woodwind ensemble. This group meets as needed, usually on Thursdays following choir practice or Sundays following Bible class. There is a spot for anyone who can play, no matter the level. If you play either a string instrument or woodwind, please consider joining us. Practices begin on Thursday, September 7th at 8:00pm and will last about 30 minutes.
- 5. Exultae: Brass ensemble. This group practices on the 1st Sunday of each month following Bible class. This group plays about once a month in church. There's a place for everyone in this group. Practices begin on Sunday, September 3rd.

The Christian Life Series — Worship

The Lord sets the solitary in families. He bids that you not be alone. Even in the Garden of Eden so long ago, God said, "It is not good that man should be alone." Thus our God in his wisdom has put you in a Christian community. He chose to make you a member of Our Savior Lutheran Church and School. Over the next couple of months, I will be writing about the various aspects of that Christian community. We'll look at issues of worship, stewardship, evangelism, catechesis, and fellowship.

As we observe the start of another school year, the Bible stories that are taught to the youngest of our pupils at Our Savior Lutheran Church and School start over at the beginning of the Bible. The Early Childhood Center classrooms learned about the days of creation the first two weeks of school. On the seventh day, God rested. God does not get tired. He definitely doesn't slumber or sleep. On that seventh day, God stopped. He set aside that day not for his own benefit, but for his people. He knew they needed the rest and nourishment —both to body and to soul.

He reminds the people of this when he gives them the Ten Commandments. "Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy" (Exodus 20). The New Testament Church started gathering around the Word preached and the Sacraments given on Sunday, instead of Saturday. They did so because of the great importance that Sunday now has because it was on Sunday that the Lord triumphed over death and the devil. They called Sunday, "the Lord's Day." And yet, the Church all along understood that the Lord is giving us a Sabbath every time he gathers his holy people together around the Word preached and the Sacraments given. Every proclamation of the Gospel, every service of the Word, every gathering of God's people is God giving rest and nourishment to YOU.

God's people at Our Savior Lutheran Church and School rejoice in the continual proclamation of the Word in our midst. We rejoice that God has sent his Holy Spirit into the midst of us to plant faith, to nourish and feed, and to make new by Jesus' work and merit. Thus, we gather around the Word daily. We encourage one another to gather whenever we can. We encourage one another to come to Sunday morning services and to partake of the sacrament when it is offered. Christians find themselves in communion with their God and with other Christians. This is by divine design. Thanks be to God that he loves us so much that he continues to forgive our sins and give us the gifts of heaven.


Thank You!

Since we are all beggars before the Almighty, Holy and Self-giving heavenly Father, let us turn again, as always, to His Word for assistance on how to pray.

Jesus on the cross prayed, Luke 23:34, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Who votes for self-genocide and increasing insignificance? As the Architects and Organizers of the OSL Nativity,

We work together to prepare the many aspects of this event: the literature we hand out, the scripted words and actions of the volunteers, the crafts, foods, costumes, props, sets, and scenery... it's a lot of work to bring this event together, but the proverbial saying, "Many hands make light work," proves true in the OSL Nativity.

it is our express purpose to illustrate the love of God

From its earliest conception, we've used the term "living illustrations" in reference to the scenes depicted from Scripture in the OSL Nativity. Children's Bibles have pictures to help young readers see what the words describe, and that's what we want our Bible scenes to do.

poured out on our fallen world

The world is indeed fallen, and we dare not forget that fact as we plan and prepare for the OSL Nativity. Because both the Law (which points out the sin and brokenness of each of us) and the Gospel (which declares God's grace in Christ, forgiving and restoring us) are essential in any discussion surrounding God's plan of Salvation, we strive to hold both in everything.

in the Incarnation of His Son, Jesus Christ,

Christmas is all about the Incarnation. This is the linchpin holding together all that takes place in the OSL Nativity. Yes, it's neat to see how people lived at that time and sample some new-to-me snacks in Bethlehem, but it all must support the mission of sharing the Incarnation of Christ.

as detailed in the Holy Scriptures, God's inerrant Word.

God's Word is not only where we learn about Him and His plan of Salvation. It is the place where we meet Him, we are fed and filled, where we draw strength and life. Remaining true to our purpose as the Body of Christ is as important in the OSL Nativity as in any. The Word must be the center and foundation around and upon which we build.

Did you know...

The word "Chrismon" is a contraction of "Christ" and "monogram". Chrismon ornaments have been used for years to illustrate the significance of Christmas for God's people and for the whole world. We have carefully selected eighteen Chrismon designs, Bible verses for each, and crafted a short devotional to coincide with each ornament.

A special keepsake...

Over the course of the year, members of the congregation work to stitch these ornaments. Each takes about one to two hours to complete. After an ornament has been stitched, we cut it out and layer it into a frame that has been designed and 3D printed just for this project, gluing the pieces in place and allowing the ornament to dry overnight. Finally, we wrap it carefully to give it a little protection as it is transported home.

Over the years...

Ornaments will be given to the Sunday School children in their classes, a different design each year. Keep an eye out in the newsletter for how to complete your child's set if he or she started Sunday School before we started this program. And if you've passed age 18 already, there will be opportunity to order your own Chrismon ornaments.

Join us...

We welcome you to join us in any or all stages of the creation of these ornaments. The patterns are simple, and only use three colors of thread – they are great for beginner cross-stitchers! Or if you have a good eye for cutting on the line, you might be just the person we need for helping cut out the stitched fabric or the printed backing. Or maybe you'd enjoy helping wrap the finished ornaments. If you are interested in assisting us with
