- How can we guard against making disciples of "us" instead of disciples of Christ?


## Personal Application

### Read Acts 8:26–40

- What stands out to you in this passage at first glance?
- Why do you think Luke includes this story in Acts?

### Vs. 26-29 – Be Available

---

Philip obeyed God's call even when it didn't make sense.

- Why do you think God sometimes calls us to do things that seem illogical?
- Share a time when you felt prompted by the Spirit to do something unexpected. How did you respond?
- Which of these practices—keeping your eyes on Jesus, meditating on His Word, serving, prayer—do you find most challenging? Why?
- Why do you think God often works in “desert places”—times or places of stillness and solitude?

- How do you personally respond when God leads you into a season of waiting or quiet?

### Vs. 30-36 – Be Prepared

---

- Why is asking questions such an effective way to share the gospel?
- The eunuch was wealthy and influential, yet humble enough to admit he needed help. What does this teach us about the posture required to follow Jesus?
- How can we model that same humility in our own lives?

Philip was ready because he knew Scripture and was Spirit-led.

- How are you preparing yourself to make disciples?
- What practical steps can you take this week to grow in biblical knowledge and spiritual sensitivity?
