
Hebrews 12:14–17 – The Warning from Esau

Read Genesis 28:6-9 aloud as a group.

This passage zooms in on Esau—his patterns of impulsive, flesh-driven decisions and how they led to regret and spiritual failure. Esau sought approval and blessing but went about it on his own terms. His story is both a warning and a call to seek God in humility, not just religion or routine.

Gen. 25:29–34 – Esau Sells His Birthright

- 1. What does Esau trading his birthright for stew reveal about his priorities and values?
- 2. Why is it dangerous to live by impulse or emotion rather than God's truth?
- 3. Can you think of a time when impatience led to a choice you regretted? What did you learn?

Gen. 26:34-35 - Esau's Canaanite Wives

- 1. Why were Isaac and Rebekah grieved by Esau's marriage choices?
- 2. How does Esau's disregard for his family's legacy and faith show a deeper spiritual issue?
- 3. What influences or desires tempt you to compromise what you know is right?

Gen. 28:6–9 – Esau Tries to Fix It His Way

- 1. Why do you think Esau added another wife from Ishmael's family? What was he trying to do?
- 2. How does this decision reveal the difference between genuine repentance and self-effort?
- 3. When have you tried to "fix" a mistake without truly going to God first?
