
Vs. 13-14 – Jesus Came to Bring Peace

- 1. When you hear the word "peace," what do you usually think of—absence of conflict, calm emotions, something else?
- 2. How does the biblical idea of *shalom* ("nothing missing, nothing broken") deepen our understanding of the peace Jesus brings?
- 3. Why do you think peace with God must come before peace in other areas of life?
- 4. How does knowing Jesus as the *Prince of Peace* affect the way we deal with anxiety or fear?
- 5. What might be holding someone back from receiving the peace Jesus offers? How can we encourage one another to live out the peace we have received from Christ?

Read Luke 2:1-14

At Christmas time we give and receive gifts which are meant to remind us of the greatest gift ever given – Jesus. The gift of a Savior surpasses any gift we could ever receive. Because God so loved us that He sent His Son to save us, everything is changed!

Opening: What's one Christmas gift you remember most clearly—either because it was amazing or because it completely missed the mark?

Vs. 9-11 – Jesus Came to Save Us

- 1. The angel calls Jesus a *Savior*. What does that word imply about our condition apart from Him?
- 2. Why is it important that Jesus came **to save**, not to condemn? How does that shape how we view God?
- 3. The angel tells Joseph that Jesus would "save his people from their sins." Why is sin the *real* problem Jesus came to address, even more than broken circumstances or difficult lives?
- 4. Salvation was compared to a lifeguard rescuing someone from a rip current to illustrate that we can't save ourselves. Where do you think people are most tempted to believe they *can* fix themselves spiritually?
- 5. In what ways have you tried to "save yourself" only to fail and realize you need a savior?

Vs. 12 – Jesus Came in an Unexpected Way

- 1. Why do you think God chose such a humble, quiet, and unexpected way for Jesus to enter the world?
- 2. How does Jesus' humble birth challenge our ideas of power, success, and importance?
- 3. What is it about Jesus' unique conception that makes Him the only One qualified to be our Savior? Why is it essential that Jesus is both **fully God and fully human?**
- 4. How does the unexpected way Jesus came prepare us for the unexpected way He lived and died?
- 5. In what ways does Jesus still defy people's expectations today including our own?
