

Each week, we offer vibrant, theologically grounded services that inspire connection and fellowship. This area supports our pastor and music director, guest musicians, administrative needs, and technology that extends our ministry beyond our walls. Thanks to these efforts, our 2025 summer worship engagement increased 46% over 2024—evidence of God's work through our shared commitment to meaningful worship and digital outreach.

At EBPC, mission isn't just something we do—it's who we are. We believe God's work calls us to open our doors both outward, reaching into the community, and inward, welcoming partners to share in ministry and purpose.

Six percent of our overall budget supports this vital work through our Coordinator of Mission, Service, and Community Engagement, mission giving, and related outreach costs. Yet the true impact extends far beyond numbers—through the efforts of our preschool ministry, volunteer hours, and generous donations.

In 2024 alone, volunteer service was valued at over \$121,000, with even greater growth expected as we go "All In."

While seen as a small part of our overall budget, our work helping children and youth learn and celebrate the stories of God as they form their own identity is an important part of our work. We've deepened our commitment to this area through two part-time hires made in the last year: Chris Peterson who supports our youth and Kayla Esterine-Reid who nurtures our children and supports families. This happens as Chris Peterson provides a weekly gathering for youth to talk together and study in a stress free environment.

Family Spiritual Direction Project (FSDP) explores the potential of spiritual direction with families as a space for faith formation in the lives of children as well as their faith communities. Participating families will assist in their churches worship leadership - connecting their children's faith formation to fuller participation in the life of their congregation. We hope to develop two resources: a curriculum for congregations to implement spiritual direction in ministries to children and families as well as a devotional for parents to use as they nurture the spiritual lives of their kids.



"Over the course of this year our focus will be upon providing and supporting quarterly family events that strengthen connection and involvement within the church community. We will also focus on helping children engage deeply with a minimum of five foundational Bible stories and take an active role in worship leadership once a month, fostering spiritual growth and family participation in the life of the congregation." - Kayla Esterine-Reid, Coordinator of Children and Family Ministries.



East Brentwood Child Academy Offering high-quality early childhood education (Preschool Staffing, Instruction, Space Utilization Expenses: \$813,347 (63%)

Our self-funded Children's Academy is a vital part of EBPC's educational mission, impacting both children and their families. The preschool provides a nurturing Christian environment that promotes the development of the whole child through learning, creativity, and faith.

Weekly chapel, led by Kayla Esterine-Reid, Coordinator of Children's and Family Ministries, fosters early lessons in service through monthly offerings that support others. In addition to chapel, students enjoy art, music, library, creative movement, and our new Learning Lab—a space designed to support behavioral, academic, and developmental growth.

With enrollment growing from 150 to 166 students, we've added part-time administrative support to meet expanding responsibilities in curriculum, compliance, communication, and program development.

The Academy not only fulfills our mission to nurture young learners but also connects new families to EBPC, extending our reach and strengthening our church

community.

Every ministry at EBPC—worship, education, care, and our Children's Academy—relies on the vital network of people, systems, and spaces that sustain our shared life together. Through our administrative ministry, facilities, and technology, we serve both the spiritual and operational needs of the congregation with efficiency and faithful stewardship.

Our nine-acre campus includes the church building, East Brentwood Children's Academy, and the manse, which now houses the Pastoral Center for Healing, a trusted counseling partner. Maintaining these spaces requires continual attention to grounds, repairs, digital infrastructure, and communication systems.

This area supports the essential backbone of EBPC operations, including portions of the pastor's administrative role, office management (Becky Walton), accounting, property maintenance, and the technology that keeps us connected and engaged.

Highlights of 2024-25:

- Installation of security cameras and door access controls
- HVAC updates in the manse and main building
- Ongoing technology and property maintenance
