- 2 Jesus revealed his identity at Caesarea Philippi, one of the darkest, most pagan places in Israel. What does that teach us about where and how we are called to live out our faith today? Can you think of a "dark place" where God may be calling you to be light?
- **3** Read Matthew 16:13. The sermon noted that some people prefer a "truth-telling Jesus," others a "miracle-working Jesus," and others a "compassionate Jesus." Which of these aspects of Jesus do you most naturally connect with? Which one do you sometimes overlook?
- **4** Peter confessed that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the Living God. What does it mean to you that Jesus is not only Savior but also King? How does recognizing His kingship affect the way you live day to day?
