- **1** In this week's message Pastor Glen mentioned the documentary, Have a Good Death, that categorized people's final words into words of comfort, regrets, love, or hope. How does thinking about your own "final words" shape the way you want to live today?
- **2** Jesus' first words from the cross were a prayer for those who were killing Him. What does it look like in your life to forgive others, even those who hurt you deeply? Can you share an experience where forgiveness brought peace or healing?
- **3** The thief on the cross found salvation at the last moment. How does the idea of a sinner getting into heaven at the last moment, make you feel? How does this promise bring you hope?
- **4** Jesus' words of Love for His mother are a great example of love even while he was suffering. How can we practice love for others during our own difficult times? Are there specific relationships where this is particularly hard for you?
- **5** How would you explain Jesus' word of Agony (My God, why have you forsaken me?) to someone who had not heard them before?
- **6** Jesus' final words, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit," shows ultimate trust in God. How can we cultivate that same trust in God for our lives, both in everyday decisions and in facing the uncertainties of life and death?
