

Keeping It Simple-A Note from Maria

I hope hearing the stories of others during the July "Soundtrack Sermon Series" encouraged those who heard. I know that as I shared my story, there was a lot to share in a little time! I left out some parts of what has most impacted my life. I am reminded of one of the biggest impacts as we approach the beginning of the school year, and parents release their children to be away for at least 8 hours of the day, influenced by school culture. So how can parents have a bigger influence than their child's peers? What can you do to build a foundation that cannot be shaken? In the parable of the wise man who built his house on the rock, contrasted with the foolish man who built his house on the sand, Jesus clearly states that it's the man who "hears my sayings and does them" who is the wise man. It's not enough just to hear the Word; we have to do it. When it comes to parenting, what you do speaks a lot louder than what you say. A pastor I remember used to say, "What you do in moderation, your kids will do to excess." So, then we need to be doers of the Word! Also, in my own story of some major impacts in my life, the way that I came back to God, after straying like a lost sheep, was through the love I saw in my parents. I could not believe that they could love me after all that had happened, but their love was the same no matter what. The thing that broke through to me was a Bible verse that I remembered learning as a child. Actually, it was only 3 words of 1 John 4:16," ...God is love." Those 3 words made me realize that the only way my parents could love me the way they did was because their love originated from God because God is love. That was when my life completely turned around! I learned that verse for Sunday School as a small child, and that seed of God's Word reaped a harvest in my life years later. Parents, please place a value on teaching your children the Bible at a young age. Bring them to church, where they hear it again in Sunday School and children's church. I pray that we have enough people in the church who will see just how impactful children's ministry is and choose to serve/volunteer in that ministry! That way, our children can be Godly influencers instead of being influenced!
