



Our Philosophy of Missions

S KINDS OF TRIPS

Our mission trips fit into these three categories.
Some trips may combine elements from each.



Outreach

Outreach trips are designed with the purpose of evangelism in mind. On outreach trips we will go into the streets, schools, churches, parks and plazas bringing the Gospel to a lost and hurting world.

Don't worry, you don't have to be Billy Graham to be effective on these trips. You just have to have a willing heart to love on people, share your story, and step out of your comfort zone. We will provide you with all the training you need so that you are ready to take the message to the world.

In the Past we have done Outreach trips to Kenya, Honduras, Ghana, Columbia, Belize, Alaska, Scotland, Haiti and others.



Care

Care Trips are a great way to "get your feet wet" so to speak, if you are new to missions work. On a care trip we go with the specific mission to be a blessing to a specific group or organization. Sometimes this could include working with and loving on children in an orphanage or providing relief to the hungry and homeless.

We have organized care trips to the Canica Orphanage in San Marcos, Guatemala and to the Gulf Coast for Hurricane Katrina relief.



Construction

Construction Trips are "built" for the purpose of improving, renovating or building for a particular church or missions organization. We have helped build churches, renovated ministry headquarters, and built playgrounds and bunk beds at orphanages.

You don't have to be a licensed contracter to go on these trips (although that's a bonus!) Sometimes the work may be as simple as painting, building shelving or cleaning.

Construction trips have included work in Scotland, Slovakia, Hungary, Guatemala and Venezuela, to name a few.














8 Steps to your missions trip

1. Start fundraising

You can find many great resources here in this manual. In addition there are also many resources to be found online to help you raise funds for your trip. Here at Mount Hope Church most of your fundraising will be done on your own. There may be some organized fundraisers that you can participate in as well.

2. Turn in your deposit

Your deposit goes towards the cost of your trip and lets us know that you are committed to going to the field. This deposit is non-refundable. Your deposit will keep your mission account active but you must understand that your spot on this trip is not guaranteed until the entire trip cost has been submitted before the proper deadlines.

3. Apply for your passport

Passports are required for all trips outside of the United States. If you do not already have a passport start this process immediately. It can take 6-8 weeks. Check with the Post Office for an exact price. To obtain a passport, you will need a certified birth certificate (not the hospital record), two passport photos, and a driver's license. In addition, you will need to pick up a passport application from the post office and turn in the requested information to the postal clerk for processing with the US Passport Agency. For further information on passports, check out http://travel.state.gov/passport/index.html. Visas may be required— this will be discussed in team meetings. If you currently have a passport make sure that it doesn't expire before your trips end date.

4. Make sure you receive the schedule of target dates & deadlines for your trip

5. Pay for your airfare

This date is several months before your launch date and will be approximately half of the remaining trip cost, depending on where the trip is to. Once airline tickets are purchased that money is non-refundable.

6. Attend all pre-trip meetings

These meetings will give you all of the information that you need; provide the support of your team mates, inform you of the cultural and practical trip information, and train and equip you with the needed skills to be a success on your trip.

7. Turn in all forms and paperwork

You must have all of your paperwork turned in, in order to go on a Mount Hope Church missions trip. This includes: Emergency and Release forms, Notorized Parental Consent form (for those under 18 years of age), a signed copy of our Rules & Guidelines.

8. Pre-trip prep and spiritual preparation

You will find information regarding the preparations you need to make in the remainder of this manual.

Other Requirements: Check with your team leader to stay updated of any other requirements that you need to complete before the 100% deadline.

I want to go on a missions trip but...



"I've Never Traveled Overseas." "I don't have the money."

"I'm not sure what I can do or have to offer."

Awesome! What better way to experience overseas travel than with a missions team!

Where God guides, He provides. What are your talents? Use them to reach the world.

Every team is led by an experienced leader who will prepare you each step of the way. Your team will meet regularly in the months prior to your trip. You'll be told what to pack, what shots you'll need, how to get a passport, and even what to expect cross-culturally. You will grow in your faith as you obediently take this next step.

As you pray about going, God will lead you in decisions on how to save and earn money, and how to ask for support from friends and family. He will also surprise you with financial support from people and places you would never have imagined.

Can you smile, play with children, pray and/or care about the lost? Your presence and prayers can make a huge difference in parts of the world where people are broken, lost and in need of Christ. Additionally, your pre-trip training will equip you for mission trip activities.

Monetary Needs

Fundraising is a major part of your short-term missions trip. Don't let money keep you from going... God is waiting for an opportunity to show you just how big He is!

Here are some costs that are your responsibility and are separate from the cost of the mission trip:

Your Trip Cost Includes:

Airline ticket, hotel accomodations out-of-country, transportation, 3 meals (and water) a day.

Costs Not Included:

Passport and/or visa, vaccinations, meals in the airports, snacks & souvenirs, internet cafe, items you may have forgotten to pack.

Currency Exchange

Money will be exchanged by the group leader, the missionary, or by yourself at a money exchange or at the airport. We suggest that you bring only enough cash to cover shopping and personal expenses. Travelers checks can be very hard to change, if not impossible. Keep your money with you at all times. A money belt or a neck pouch will come in very handy. Your team leader will let you know when and where money will be exchanged.

Deposit & Balance

A non-refundable deposit is required with the application. In addition, the balance of the trip cost is due before the departure of your trip. You will receive a list of all dates that trip payments are due. The deposit will apply to the balance of your trip cost.

All money for airfare must be turned in before tickets are purchased. Your leader will announce in advance when the tickets will be purchased.

Travel Tips

- NO JOKES of any kind about safety or security issues in the airport.
- Take a money belt or neck pouch to keep cash, passports, and other important items.
- Always carry prescription medications in their original pharmacy-supplied bottle.

- When packing toilet paper, remove the cardboard center.
 It will flatten and require less space.
- If you carry detergent, buy small packets and keep them in their original container.

 Otherwise, customs may open your bag and find a baggie of suspicious white powder!
- Pack a small sewing kit with a few safety pins.
- Use travel size shampoos.
- Avoid taking wrapped gifts. Airport security has the right to open them.
- Wear comfortable clothes and shoes while traveling. Be sure to bring something to cover up with (even if your trip is in the summer) in case the airports or planes are cool.
- Don't bring any knives, fireworks, scissors, toys resembling weapons, or liquid corrosives.
- Remove your toiletries, food items and other items from their boxes and pack in zipper seal bags.

Why People Give

- Others give when they feel informed. Think about...Why am I going? How will the money be used to reach people? What impact will it make? What kind of spiritual growth will happen in your life?
- People give because they believe their gift will change lives. Help them understand how their gift will benefit God's Kingdom.
- People give if you make them feel as much a

- part of the trip as those going. Communicate with them before, during, and after the trip. They need to know you are depending on their prayer and support.
- People give when they see that you are completely committed to this and enthusiastic about it! People are excited to see others with a passion and are then inspired to support them.
- Remember, people are motivated by vision, not by need.

Raising Support

Make sure that your supporters know that in order to receive a tax deduction they need to make their checks payable to Mount Hope Church.

The Connection Between Prayer and Raising Support

You are about to step out on an incredible faith journey. This trip will challenge you and cause you to grow in many ways, including your faith walk.

Prayer is a huge part of your preparation. Unfortunately, it is often over-looked. Set aside some time each and every day between now and the date that you board the airplane to spend time with your Heavenly Father. He wants to provide for you. He will provide for you! You just have to ask in faith and do the natural things that He leads you to do when it comes to raising the funds for your trip.

One way that the enemy will try to discourage you and keep you from going on a mission trip is to get your eyes on the financial cost. Most trips range from \$1,200.00- \$3,000.00. If the devil can get you to worry and stress out about the money then he can possibly discourage you from going altogether. Remember it is *God who will supply all of your needs according to HIS riches in glory!* (Phil. 4:19.)

Following is a list of some things to take to the Lord in prayer...

• peace that you are following His will

- growing faith as you rely on Him to provide financial support
- wisdom for your team leaders
- unity of purpose for your team
- clear vision of God's plans, and for the removal of all distractions
- opportunities to share your story with those who need Him
- insight and understanding for the people and culture you will be serving
- safe travel and smooth planning of all the details
- God to prepare the hearts of the people that you will encounter

Keep in touch with your supporters!

one-on-one conversations, letter-writing, email your partnership team, lots of Facebook posts & pictures, send out a newsletter, follow-up after the trip is over so they can celebrate with you!

Health & Safety

Safety is our NUMBER ONE PRIORITY! We want to create an environment that is secure, so that we can minister effectively. We have a couple of simple safety precautions to ensure each member of the team is safe. The first is NEVER BE ALONE. You will be assigned to a group before we travel. Stay with your group. An approved group is a minimum of 3 people, one of which is a male 18 or older.

By using a little common sense and a little care, you should have no problems with your health while on a mission trip.

We suggest that you bring a hand gel that is antibacterial, and Handi-wipes for use throughout the day, as soap and water are not always available.

The most common ailments experienced by visitors are an upset stomach and diarrhea. The major cause of this problem is the non-purified water. Carry bottled water with you and do not eat food from roadside vendors. Do not eat raw vegetables (including salad) that have not been washed in clean water (just ask your leader). Eat only peeled fruit. Sodas are generally safe to drink. Food in recommended restaurants is quite delicious and inexpensive—enjoy!

Remember....

- Report any illness to your team leader.
- Water should not be used for drinking unless you are certain it is purified and safe. This includes water in motels and restaurants.
- Use bottled water for brushing your teeth.
- Be sure to drink a lot of bottled water to avoid dehydration. Powdered Gatorade is great to bring and keeps you hydrated.

Immunizations & Vaccinations

Mount Hope Church recommends but does not require each person to get the proper immunizations that are recommended by the Center for Disease Control (CDC) www.cdc.gov/ travel/destinat.htm. Please check with your team leader to determine what may be needed for your trip. Consult with your physician or a local travel clinic. Some shots must be given 4-6 weeks prior to your trip!

Fees for immunizations and vaccinations are NOT included in the price of the trip. Tetanus/ Diphtheria vaccinations should be considered for ALL trips. You may also need to get a prescription from your physician for malaria medication. Depending on where you are going to.

Research Your Country and Learn the Language

Study the culture, people, history, religion, customs and anything else that will help you understand the people you will be ministering to. Also, learn some basic phrases and sayings to use on your trip. You will be amazed at how much your effort will be appreciated by the locals!

Leave valuables at home!

Talk to your team leader about specific dress requirements for your trip. Certain cultures have specific guidelines that you need to follow in order to avoid offending the locals and damaging the work of the ministry.

Dress Code

This dress code is given as a general guideline and may vary on certain trips. Always check with your team leader for a final word on dress code.

Dress Code for Men/Boys

Day Ministry Attire

- jeans or khakis
- missions t-shirt/or polo/button shirt
- walking shoes (no sandals or flip flops)

Church/Conference/Crusade Attire

- collared shirt
- slacks
- dress shoes
- suit & tie (if needed)

Hotel/Free Day

- shorts (no short shorts)
- t-shirts
- sandals/flip flops
- modest swimming suit

Dress Code for Women/Girls

Day Ministry Attire

- jeans or khakis, capris may be acceptable
- missions t-shirt/dress t-shirt/button shirt
- walking shoes (no sandals or flip flops or open toes)

Church/Conference/Crusade Attire

- skirt or dress below the knees
- dress slacks
- dress shoes
- no leggings or tights
- jacket or sweater

Hotel/Free Day

- shorts (no short shorts)
- t-shirts
- sandals/flip flops
- modest swimming suit

Always bring a jacket or sweatshirt of some kind on the trip. You never know if the weather will change.



Devotions & Prayer

Take advantage of the time before your trip to prepare your heart for the work that God wants to do in your life. You will not be effective in serving others until you completely surrender your heart to God and are open to what He wants to do through you.

- Make time each day to study God's Word and allow Him to make you the person that He has created you to be.
- Memorize scriptures that apply to missions and evangelism.
- Meditate on scriptures that apply to salvation and healing. (there are many in this manual)
- Pray daily for the people of the nation you will be going to.
- Pray for your leaders.
- Pray for team unity.
- Pray for extraordinary favor with all governing authorities.
- Pray for the safety of your trip.

Journaling

Journaling may be something that you are not accustomed to but it can be a great tool for your missions trip. Journaling gives you the chance to document your trip for later reflection, record the miracles and workings of God that you witness, and to express yourself to God through your writings. You may want to consider taking a journal along on the trip with you, and maybe even begin journaling now as you prepare for the trip.

While journaling you can keep track of what you did and how you felt each day. Write down your prayers and requests. Ask God questions and record His answers. You will find that your journal entries will provide great encouragement to you in the future.







Goals

The first rule of any missions trip is to BE FLEXIBLE! Don't go into your trip with rigid expectations. Things are always changing; schedules, appointments, meetings....it's going to happen. So go into the trip knowing this and have a heart that can adapt and flow with the changes.

Take some time and think through your personal goals in these areas:
In what areas do you want to grow and be challenged?
How can you use and improve your spiritual gifts to help your team?
How do you want to see God work with you and your team mates?
What kind of insights do you want to come away with spiritually, practically and culturally?

Sharing Your Faith

Here is a simple yet effective 5 point plan to share the Gospel

1. John 3:16 - Describe God's love for everyone.

John 3:16- For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

2. Romans 3:23 - Describes "the problem."

Romans 3:23- For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.

3. Romans 6:23 - Describes "the penalty."

Romans 6:23- For the wages of sin is death but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

4. Acts 3:!9 - Gives us "the solution."

Acts 3:19 - Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the Lord.

5. Romans 10:9 - Gives us the "How to's."

Romans 10:9- That if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

10 Tips for effective Cross-Cultural Communication

Communicating across cultures can be confusing and uncertain—unless you have the right frame of mind and approach. These practical strategies can help you prevent misunderstandings and communicate effectively across cultures.

1. Slow Down.

Even when English is the common language in a crosscultural situation, this does not mean you should speak at normal speed. Slow down, speak clearly, and ensure your pronunciation is intelligible.

2. Separate Questions.

Try not to ask double questions such as, "Do you want to carry on, or shall we stop here?" In a cross-cultural situation only the first or second question may have been comprehended. Let your listener answer one question at a time.

3. Avoid Negative Questions.

Many cross-cultural communication misunderstandings have been caused by the use of negative questions and answers. In English we answer "yes" if the answer is affirmative and "no" if it is negative. In other cultures a "yes" or "no"may only be indicating whether the questioner is right or wrong. For example, the response to "Are you not coming?" may be "yes," meaning "Yes, I am not coming."

4. Take Turns.

Cross-cultural communication is enhanced through taking turns to talk—making a point and then listening to the response.

5. Write it Down.

If you are unsure whether something has been understood, write it down and check. This can be useful when using large figures.

6. Be Supportive.

Effective cross-cultural communication is in essence about being comfortable. Giving encouragement to those with weak English gives them confidence, support, and a trust in you.

7. Check Meanings.

When communicating across cultures, never assume the other party has understood. Be an active listener. Summarize what has been said in order to verify it. This is a very effective way of ensuring accurate cross-cultural communication has taken place.

8. Avoid Slang.


Even the most well educated foreigner will not have a complete knowledge of slang, idioms, and sayings. The danger is that the words will be understood but the meaning missed.

9. Watch the humor.

In many cultures business is taken very seriously. Professionalism and protocol are constantly observed. Many cultures will not appreciate the use of humor and jokes in the business context. When using humor think whether it will be understood in the other culture. For example, British sarcasm usually has a negative effect abroad.

10. Maintain Etiquette.

Many cultures have certain etiquette when communicating. It is always a good idea to undertake some cross-cultural awareness training or at least do some research on the target culture. Cross-cultural communication is about dealing with people from other cultures in a way that minimizes misunderstandings and maximizes your potential to create strong cross cultural relationships. The above tips should be seen as a starting point to greater cross-cultural awareness.



The Reality of Spiritual Warfare

A Spiritual Warfare Study for Your Team:

When it comes to spiritual warfare most people are too hot or too cold. They are either the ones that say "there are demons behind every bush" or "I haven't noticed there was a devil and let's not talk about it lest he start picking on me." Often times we get out of balance when it comes to spiritual warfare. On a scale of one to ten, with one being no awareness of spiritual warfare, where do you fall?

Our secularized culture has disarmed us to the spiritual nature of life; we forget that we "wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers... and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Ephesians 6:12).

As a result, we rely on our own resources when we encounter adversity, and thus we are quickly discouraged and defeated. To be truly prepared for life we need to know how to be fed, nourished, and equipped with the resourceful life of Christ. We need to understand the reality of spiritual conflict

and know the resources that God has given us for standing firm.

When we read about the devil and the principalities of evil it can get kind of scary. Sometimes it is tempting to think that if we don't bother the devil, he won't bother us. Here's some good news and some bad news. First, the bad news—it doesn't work that way. The devil has declared war on you and if you didn't know it then he's been having a heyday with you. The good news is that the devil was stripped of all his power and Christ has given us authority over him and the sin he wants us to commit.



"Be self controlled and alert. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith because you know that your brothers throughout the world are undergoing the same kind of sufferings."

1 Peter 5: 8-9

Read 1 Peter 5:8. How does Peter describe the devil?
What things does Peter tell us to do in verses 8 and 9?
What things should you be alerted to while preparing for this mission trip?
Read Ephesians 6: 11-12.What do you think the schemes of the devil may be for your team?
List some spiritual battles you think are faced by the people to whom you are going to minister:
What do you think it means not to "struggle with flesh and blood?" Who should we struggle with?
Think back to the last time you were angry with someone or some situation. How could you have struggled with the enemy instead of flesh and blood?
People involved in other religions, paganism, demon worship, animism, etc., don't always think that what they are doing is the worship of Satan. If they did, they would certainly run. They see themselves as worshiping their god. They have simply been blinded to the truth; therefore we must RESPECT them and pray for Christ to open their eyes to the truth.
Read 2 Corinthians 10:3-5. How do people deal with things in a worldly way?

Thought to reflect on

Are you impressed with God and only aware of Satan, or are you impressed with Satan and only aware of God?

Read Hebrews 2:14:15. You do not receive your authority over the enemy at a certain age, or after you have been a Christian for a certain number of years, or even after you read the Bible. God gave you authority the minute you asked Him into your heart.

Most non-Christians think that God is equal, but opposite, from the devil. It is like this big tug of war with equal and opposing forces. This is a lie which tries to give us the image of a puny God and a powerful devil. The fact is that God created Lucifer, who then rebelled and became the devil. It is God who the devil has to answer to. It will be God who will put the devil in his place in the lake of fire. If we want to compare God and the devil it would be like comparing Niagara Falls to a drip from a faucet, or a heavy weight boxing champion to an ant, or a brilliant sunset to a pile of ashes.

Read 1 John 4:4. God has given us authority over the enemy.

Is there anything in your life that this truth does not apply to? Take some time and reaffirm God's truth in situations in your life that you may struggle with. Remember that God who is in you is greater than anything you face.

The Armor of God

We often enter the world wearing only the helmet of salvation, knowing that we are forgiven and saved through Jesus Christ. A helmet is great, but without the full armor we are thoroughly unprotected. God has provided us with all the authority we need to manifest his authority over areas that the adversary seeks to dominate. Knowing how to use these resources is a vital dimension of maturing in Christ and engaging in ministry.

What type of weapons do you think Paul wants us to

fight with? See Ephesians 6:13-17; 2 Corinthians 6:7
List the various items of armor, and describe the significance of each for our protection.

Take a moment to ask God to show you some areas where you and your team may be under attack, and then pray for that person or that situation.

IDENTIFYING SPIRITUAL WARFARE

Learn to use your spiritual eyes to identify spiritual warfare within your team. How does the enemy attack your team? By attacking your unity! Satan sows discontent within your team in any way he can. Just before Jesus was arrested to be tried and crucified, He prayed for His disciples to receive something that was essential to God's mission. What was it?

Unity is not the only issue the enemy will attack. List other ways the enemy will wage war within your team.

List what you can do to protect your team against the enemy's divisive wiles.

Realize that the enemy will attack the project itself. If the enemy can't get at your team to make you ineffective, then he'll attempt to sabotage what you're trying to do.


- The flight is running late and you may not make your connection. Is this a spiritual battle?
- The connection at the airport is not there to meet you in this foreign land. Is this a spiritual battle?
- The generator, or projector, or computer, or _____ (add anything that is supposed to work) does not operate just before your team most needs it. Is this a spiritual battle?
- Rain has made getting to your area of ministry virtually impossible. Is this a spiritual battle?

Understand the people with whom you interact. You are encountering people who not only believe in the spirit world, they live with the spirit world. The Bible clearly states that Satan holds people without Christ as captives.

No amount of your own effort—not church planting, leadership training, financial enterprise, medical aid, no reducation— will change a person's heart condition toward Jesus Christ. Anything you do for people that originates from you and is separate from the Holy Spirit accomplishes nothing for God's kingdom.







4 principles for spiritual warfare

Every Sunday when I get in my car and drive the 20 minutes it takes me to get to the church, I put on the whole armor of God, and then I do it again before every worship service. I say, "Lord, I know eternity hangs on what I'm talking about today. There may be somebody who's in the worship service who will never come to church again." I recognize that I am in a spiritual battle, so I use four biblical principles in the fight:

First I acknowledge the adversary

Satan is real (1 Peter 5:8-9). When you're being attacked, welcome to the club. It's proof that you're a believer. The fact is, the more you make an impact for God, the more the devil is going to fight you. You never outgrow it. It just gets more intense. If there were no devil, why would God send His Son to fight what does not exist? The Bible says God sent Jesus Christ to defeat the works of Satan. The Bible says that Satan is the prince of this world. Jesus said so. He never disputed Satan's right to work all across the world. The Bible says in 1 John 3:8, "The Son of God came for this purpose: to destroy the devil's work."

Second, I accept God-given authority

Most believers are very ignorant about the authority they have for use against the devil. Matthew 28:18-19 says we have all authority in heaven and earth. Then Jesus says, "Therefore go and make disciples..." He transfers the authority to you and me. He does that because He's given us a specific mission (2 Corinthians 5:20.) When you send an ambassador to another country, the ambassador has the full authority to represent that country. The Bible says that you, as a believer in ministry, are Christ's ambassador.

Third, I put on the full armor of God

Take a look at the famous passage on spiritual armor in Ephesians 6:11-17. When the Apostle Paul wrote this, he was in prison. He was

chained 24 hours a day to a Roman guard. Sitting there chained to this centurion, Paul looked at him and saw a model for spiritual armor. The Roman had on a breastplate -- a piece of metal to protect his chest from spear attack. He had a strong, leather girdle around his waist to protect him. He had on boots, a shield, a helmet and a sword. Paul says just as the Roman soldier goes out to do battle, when you're in ministry you'll need to be dressed for battle. You put it on before you teach that Bible study, before you teach that Sunday School class, before you play that note in worship. In all these things, you need to put on your armor of God. I do this every time I speak. I mentally run through this list, putting on the full armor of God. I say, for instance, "Lord, I put on the helmet of salvation that will protect me from the thoughts the devil will try to give me. I don't want to think the devil's thoughts. I don't want to think my thoughts. I want to think Your thoughts, that I may be a voice for You. I put on the belt of truth. Lord, I want to share the truth, not falsehood. I want to lead people into righteousness."

Fourth, I aim the weapons God gave me for warfare

Not only do we have some armor, but also we have some weapons to use when we're involved in ministry. Remember, we're not fighting against physical people. We're fighting against spiritual forces. The battlefield for spiritual warfare is primarily in the thought life; in your mind (2 Corinthians 10:4-5). Notice what Paul says the weapons do: They demolish arguments—that's the way people think. They pull down pretension—that's the way people think. We take every thought captive. In this battle for thoughts, you have four weapons: humility, faith, truth and praise. I use them every day, but especially as I'm preparing to teach God's Word.

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep

on praying for all the Lord's people.
