## THOUGHTS ON THE JOURNEY

"I hate my job." "Is it seriously only Tuesday?" "I just don't know if I can stand working with these people another day." Have you ever made a statement like this? Certainly, the work-a-day world can be challenging, but have you ever stopped to think that maybe we are looking at it all wrong. The typical perspective is one where I see myself as working for the individual or corporation that owns the company I work for. When I view it this way, it has little meaning. The only real reward from the job is the check that I bring home.

But what if we alter our perspective just slightly? What if we accept the perspective that Paul puts forth in Colossians 3:23? Paul says, "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men." He is calling us to adjust our perspective. We are not there to work for an individual or corporation. We are there as a representative of the one true God. We are there to honor God through our work ethic and our availability to others. If we can make this shift, we will no longer see it as a job, but a ministry. No longer will it be devoid of meaning, but it will be full of purpose.

This does not apply to our jobs alone. Many of us are retired and no longer go to the workplace. However, the call stays the same. Wherever we go, whatever we do, wherever we play – we are there as a representative of our Lord.

Today, as we take a look at being intentional as it relates to impacting our community for Christ, I hope we will view our community as much more than where we live. Your community is not solely defined by the neighborhood or city you live in. Your community could be the people you play golf with. Your community could be the people you craft with. Your community could be the places you volunteer. Anywhere you come into contact with one or more people, that's your community.

As we walk through today's message, I pray that you would give careful consideration to your community. Again, not just the place you live, but any place you come into contact with others. I hope that you would pray about how God would have you to be His representative in those circles. I pray that you would engage with our Lord on His mission.


