NBS LOVE OFFERING



THOUGHTS ON THE JOURNEY

In Matthew 5:13, we are told that we are to be the "salt of the earth." As we have learned, part of what salt does is act as a preservative. So, what was Jesus saying to his followers when he said we are to be this salt? He was, in part, telling us that we are to preserve what is right and good. The question then becomes, how do we do this?

In a society such as ours, part of this preservation happens through political engagement. By the grace of God, we live in a land that operates democratically. This means that we can engage our government in order to bring about change. We see this pattern of engagement throughout scripture. Whether it was God's prophets, or simply people who had been strategically placed, we see the people of God engage their leadership.

Of course, there are good and proper ways to do this. We do not have to give ourselves over to the frenzy that culture as a whole seems to involve itself, nor do we simply have to sit on the sidelines and watch things unfold. The truth is, we should engage with wisdom, care, and intention. We must pray about, seek, and be willing to sacrifice to bring about the change that needs to come in our society. Sometimes, this will be at great personal cost, but it is our calling nonetheless.

I would encourage you, as God gives opportunity, to engage in the political process. When appropriate, write to your representatives. When given the opportunity, speak to issues in a well thought out and intelligible way. If God so leads, maybe run for an office – locally, statewide, or even national. And at the very least, vote. Vote for candidates that hold values similar to your own.

One more word of exhortation – make sure that we hold all leadership accountable. Do not let poor values, weak efforts, or bad behavior get a pass simply because the individual represents our party of choice. Let's be the sort of people that will both extend grace and hold others accountable. In short, let us honor God in the way we engage politically.
