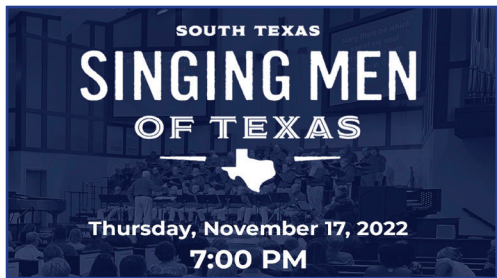

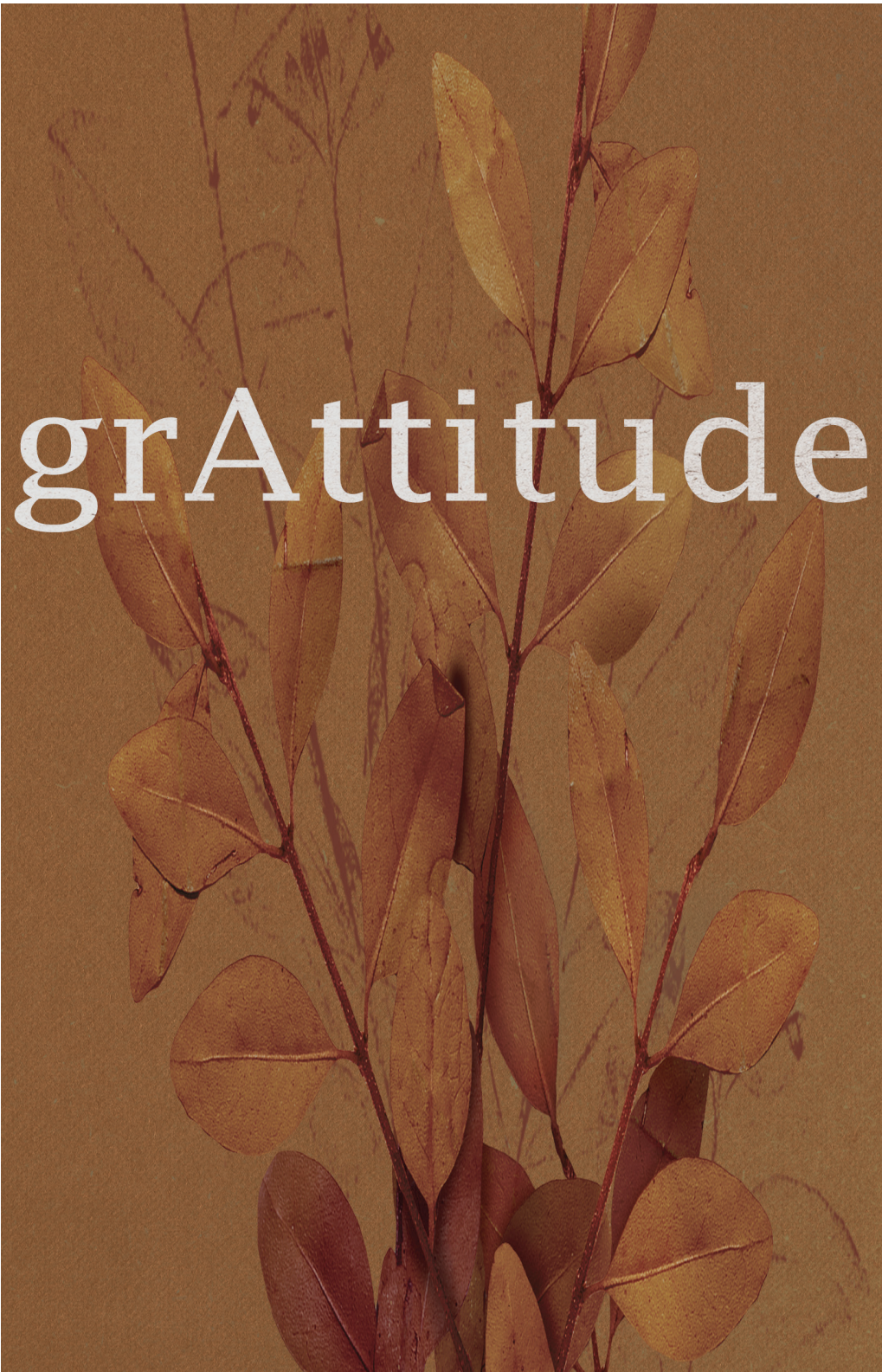


SUMMIT STUDENT FRIENDSGIVING

THOUGHTS ON THE JOURNEY

Today we will continue our series **grAttitude** as we find ourselves in this season of Thanksgiving. While each of us have plenty to be thankful for, it is easy to take some of the blessings in our life for granted. In so doing, we can neglect both the blessing and the giver – we do not want this to be true of us.

“We, like the psalmist, have a determined response of rejoicing. We will not always feel like it, but we can always be determined to praise.”

As part of our study, we will look at Psalm 118 today. This is a peculiar Psalm in that, we are not sure when it was written or who wrote it. We can clearly pick up some context clues, but it is hard to be sure. It seems that this Psalm was written by a king, potentially David, that had been exiled from Jerusalem. Whoever this king was, had longed to see the city once again. In time, by God’s providence, he is allowed to return home. When he sees the gates of that beautiful city, he breaks into praise toward God.

There is a lot that this unknown writer can teach us. Each of us is on our own spiritual journey. However, it is not the gates of Jerusalem that we long to see, but to be in a right relationship with our God. However, like the psalmist, we should give thanks to God as He opens gates for us. We, like the psalmist, have a determined response of rejoicing. We will not always feel like it, but we can always be determined to praise.

As we look at this Psalm today, consider what the Psalmist might teach you. What can we learn about prayer? What can we learn about waiting? What can we learn about praising? All of these are lessons that are embedded in this text.

Just a little side note: This Psalm is the last of six that were part of the Hallel (praise) Psalms that were sung at the Passover meal. It is likely that this is the very Psalm that Jesus and His disciples sang as they finished the Lord’s supper and headed for the Garden of Gethsemane. As you consider the message of this Psalm, it becomes rather interesting.

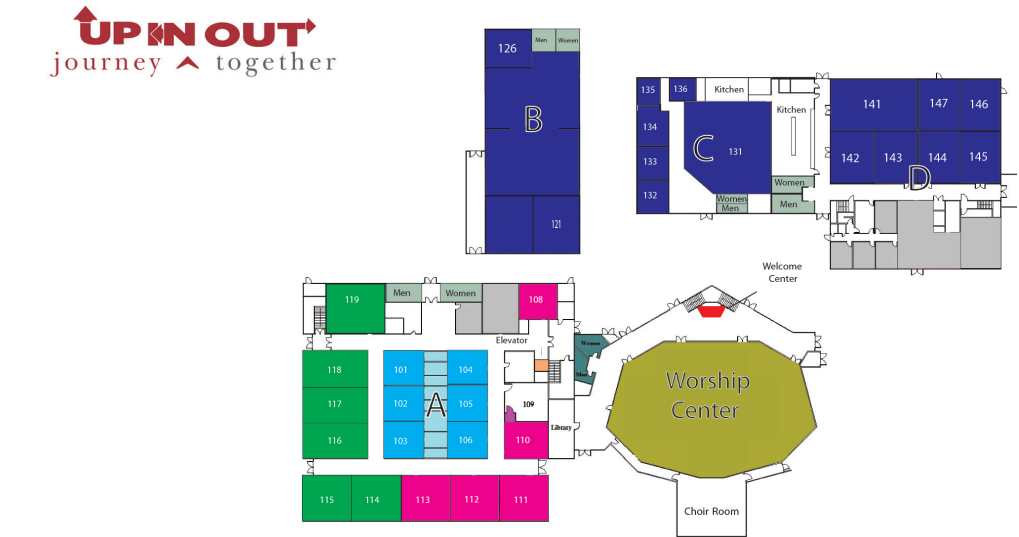
