Pearls, Prodigals, and the Power of Love

Dear People of God,

This summer we have been taking a fresh look at some of the parables of Jesus. We began our summer worship series on June 1, when we read the parables found in Luke 15 about the lost sheep, the lost coin and the lost (prodigal) son. Then on June 22, Marty Yohn shared about the parable in Matthew 13, often referred to as “The Pearl of Great Price.” Then on July 20, we read about the Good Samaritan in Luke 10, the third parable in our series. And along the way, we have drawn insight from a Bible scholar named Amy-Jill Levine to help us understand the parables according to first century Judaism.

According to Amy-Jill Levine, Jesus’s parables are short stories that tell us something about God’s kingdom – about what’s really important in God’s kingdom. Jesus’ parables are meant to make us think about kingdom values that we hold deep within us. When Marty Yohn spoke about The Pearl of Great Price, he asked us to consider what we hold most dear in life. What is it that we would give up everything for in order to find it? Marty went on to say that to God, each one of us is like a pearl of great price. God goes to great lengths in order search for us when we stray because he loves us so much.


Mentor Program

Thank You...

From the bottom of our hearts, thank you to every member of Faith Lutheran who supported our 2025 Mission Trip Team. Whether you donated, participated in fundraisers, prayed for us, or simply encouraged our youth, you were part of this journey. And what a journey it was.

This year's mission trip to New York City was unlike any we've taken before—immersive, intense, meaningful, and deeply moving. We met people from all walks of life, listened to their stories, shared our own (and even shared some cheese!), and reflected on what it means to live out God's love, forgiveness, and grace in real time.

God's Work, Our Hands wasn't just a slogan—it was our lived experience. In the heart of a city known for its size and speed, we slowed down to notice the sacred. To serve with compassion. To offer grace and receive it, sometimes when we least expected it.

On this trip, we had the privilege of serving at three incredible ELCA congregations in New York—Advent Lutheran (our host site), Trinity Lower East Side and Trinity Place Shelter—where doors are flung open in true Christ-like welcome.

Two congregations feed hundreds of hungry neighbors each day or week. The other provides LGBTQ+ young adults experiencing homelessness a safe place to sleep, eat, and be seen as beloved children of God.

We partnered Pastor Fabian in Queens to help deliver fresh produce to more than 600 people living in a food desert.





And yes, we had some fun along the way—exploring the city, walking a collective 50 miles, and even seeing a Broadway show.

We packed a lot into those four 17-hour days. And after two 28-hour train rides... well, you can imagine how good that Chicago photo above on the way home felt!

But mission trips aren't just about what happens during the week—they're about what happens after. The experiences we've had will shape how we pray, serve, lead, forgive, and love moving forward. As we often say, life-change might launch on a mission trip, but it grows in the days and months after.

We invite you to hear more about that transformation at our Mission Trip Reflection Service on Sunday, August 3. You'll hear directly from our youth and adult leaders as they share the stories, challenges, and grace they encountered in the Big Apple. Can't make it? The service will be available online to watch later as well.

Until then, know this: your support helped make this life-changing experience possible. You helped feed the sheep. And the seeds of faith you've helped plant are still growing.

Financial Updates

Treasurer's Report

FROM TREASURER KENT MUELLER

General giving for June 2025 was \$22,733, compared to \$17,948 for 2024 and \$19,926 for 2023. June's giving was the highest of the last four years. The June general giving was \$8,095 lower than the breakeven point for general giving. The breakeven point is the amount needed to have a balanced budget for the year. June expenses exceeded income by \$357.

Halfway through 2025, year-to-date expenses now exceeded income by \$6,421. Year-to-date income is lower than budget by \$7,192, expenses are lower than budget by \$10,171, and interest earnings are higher than budget by \$1,142, resulting in net loss that is \$4,121 lower than budgeted.

Mission Team Updates

Facilities Management Team

CHAIR PAM JOHNSON

Highlights

Caring for Our Building & Grounds

The Facility Team met on July 7 to discuss ongoing care for our church building and property, as well as several updates and improvements. Here's a look at what's happening behind the scenes to keep our shared space welcoming, safe, and functional.

Parsonage Recommendation

A major topic of discussion was the parsonage. After reviewing two demolition bids, the team is recommending Bach Excavating, LLC to the Church Council. The proposed cost is \$21,715, with a contingency of \$8,285, totaling \$30,000 to cover any unforeseen issues. This recommendation was presented at the July 27 Council Meeting for approval. It was approved. Additional parsonage considerations included concerns about possible asbestos, fluid in the oil tank, and coordination for furniture removal. Habitat for Humanity may be able to assist with some of these items.

Furniture Policy Discussion

The team discussed the need for a clear policy on loaning out church furniture. A proposal will be developed for the next meeting to discontinue lending church furniture for outside use.

Cleaning & Custodial Improvements

- Carpet shampooing in the Gathering Area and Sanctuary will take place in the coming weeks.
- The team is addressing toilet float issues, AED training, and sourcing paper towels from a new vendor.
- The choir room pews are slated for removal.
- The elevator repair cost is being confirmed, and we're exploring whether a policy might help cover future repair costs.

Electrical Work Identified

The following areas have been identified for repair by Mueller Electric:

- Light in Gathering Area
- Multiple basement outlets and switches
- Exit light in Fellowship Hall
- Heater near the youth room
- Various outdated or non-working outlets

Plumbing Updates & Gratitude

We're incredibly grateful to Terry Prust for donating his time and skills to replace faucets in:

- The basement kitchen
- The women's restroom (basement)
- The Sacristy
- The kitchen in the Upper Room

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING - AUG. 17TH

Special Congregational Meeting to be held on Sunday, August 17, 2025 following the 9 AM service.

Here is the proposed agenda:

- Discuss and vote on the bid and contingency for the Parsonage razing. \$21,715 + \$8,285 contingency.
- Discuss and vote on the monies coming from Undesignated Savings.

Rationale:

- There was much discussion on the Parsonage at the Facilities Meeting. Discussion included dealing with possible asbestos, fluid in the oil tank, empty furnishings out of the house, etc. Jeff Tisdell brought two bids, as a third contractor did not submit a bid.
- The Finance Team and Council proposes to use monies from Undesignated Savings to cover the cost of the Parsonage Razing:
 - As of the end of June, our Undesignated Savings balance was \$101,403. Assuming a cost of \$30,000 with contingencies, our Undesignated Savings balance would decrease to \$71,403. This would result in using almost 30% of our Undesignated Savings balance to raze the parsonage. Using Undesignated Savings would decrease our interest income and give us a smaller reserve to use in years when our income falls short of our expenses. While this results in a decrease in our savings balance, we feel that it is the best source of funds for this project. Please note that we also have an Emergency Savings fund of \$80,000 set aside, in addition to the \$71,403 that would be left in our Undesignated Savings. Potential ideas to discuss in the future would be how to replenish our savings if there are concerns.


We Need Your Help!
