



Financial Updates Finance Team Highlights

FROM INTERIM CHAIR ALICIA HEINRICH

- The Finance Team met on April 2 in the Upper Room, quickly approving February and March minutes before diving into a full agenda.
- We updated the Endowment Fund disbursement policy to allow 50% of the prior year's General Fund earnings to be used annually, with unused amounts rolling over.
- Available funds included:
 \$853 Maleug Fund
 - \$3.609 Sabrowski Fund
 - \$2,448 General Fund
- New Endowment Team officers: John Campbell (President), Sheveney Verhulst (Treasurer), and Kathy Tremelling (Secretary).
- Care Fund and Memorial Fund balances remained strong at \$6,649.97 and \$29,086.77, respectively. A note on the Music Ministry Fund: it supports special, non-budgeted items and is managed by Linda Nelson-Schreiber.
- Total church assets as of the meeting: \$281,855.06. Thank you to those who directed Thrivent Choice Dollars—
 \$2,075 has been received so far in 2025, supporting ministries like Piece Corps.

- Pam Johnson had the idea to create giving envelopes and numbers to confirmation students to encourage stewardship early.
- Contribution statements were scheduled to go
 out digitally by April 15, this included a letter
 from Pastor Heather and President Diane Herron.
 If you missed it, please get a copy at the church
 office.
- While March giving was below expectations, year-to-date finances remain stable thanks to reduced expenses and solid interest earnings.
 The Finance Team remains focused on faithful stewardship and transparency.

Treasurer's Report

General giving for March 2025 was \$20,406, compared to \$25,481 for 2024 and \$24,502 for 2023. The March general giving was \$10,422 less than the breakeven point for general giving. The breakeven point is the amount needed to have a balanced budget for the year. March expenses exceeded income by \$4,483. Year-to-date income exceeded expenses by \$3,269. Year-to-date total income is lower than budget by \$2,435, expenses are lower than budget by \$7,135, and interest earnings are higher than budget by \$508, resulting in net income that is \$5,209 higher than budgeted.

The Facility Team continues to work hard to maintain and improve our church building and grounds. Here are the latest updates from our April 7th meeting:

Garage Clean-Up Day – Saturday, May 17th at 9:00 AM

 Volunteers are needed! We'll be organizing and cleaning the church garage. Please join us if you're able — many hands make light work!

Lower Level Window Replacement

 We are currently gathering bids for the replacement of eight windows in the lower level. This will help with energy efficiency and maintaining the building's integrity.

Bathroom Fan Replacement (on roof)

 Plans are underway to replace the fan in the outside bathroom to improve ventilation and overall function.

Faucet Replacements

• Thanks to gifts to the Restoration Fund (Memorial and Other Funds), six faucets will be replaced throughout the building. A special thank you to Terry Prust, who has generously volunteered to complete this work in May

Insurance Renewal Update

 Good news — our insurance renewal was finalized with less than a 5% increase, helping us stay within budget for the coming year.

Thank you to everyone who continues to support the care and maintenance of our facilities. Your efforts and generosity help keep our church welcoming, safe, and beautiful for all!.

FLC Kitchen Restoration Committee:

As an update on the ongoing restoration effort in our kitchen, I wanted to make you aware that FLC facilities team has suggested we coordinate the replacement of aging faucets throughout the church. We purchased two faucets from Menards at \$114.81 and \$149.00 for a total of \$263.81. These will replace the aging faucets on sinks #two and three in the main kitchen. These funds have been approved to be transferred from the kitchen restoration fund and moved into the memorial fund so that Kent can pay the credit card bill as this was the method of payment. This will be subtracted from the restoration fund for May 2025 (ending balance as of 10/05/2024-\$2989.36). The faucets we purchased will resemble the current faucet in the kitchenette in the Upper Room. Terry Prust has offered to donate his time and talents. and will be installing the faucets while he is working on other plumbing projects within the church. - Judy Rhodes, Kitchen Co-Coordinator



Parsonage Committee Update

The Parsonage Team has contacted three contractors for estimates and giving them until May 15th to provide details bids for the razing of the parsonage.

Kent is contacting Habitat for Humanity for a list of items they take for donations. Kent and Renee will be taking inventory of the items in the parsonage. We will then itemize what needs to be removed and what needs to be done with them.

We decided not to pursue reconnecting electrical service from the church to the garage at this time. We felt it wasn't necessary at this time for the cost of approximately \$3,800.00. We may obtain a solar panel for electricity at a later date.

The Communications Team gathered on April 2 with a packed agenda and plenty of ideas. We began with updates to our weather cancellation policy, including plans to incorporate pre-recorded or live messages from Pastor and the Praise Band in the event of a service closure. We're reviewing procedures with other teams to ensure alignment. Volunteer appreciation is on our hearts with National Volunteer Week (April 27–May 4) coming up. Look for a special slide recognizing all who give their time and talents! Speaking of volunteers, the Puppet Ministry continues to expand, now officially syndicated through the Public Access Channel network. We also discussed the exciting improvements to our internet bandwidth and livestreaming. Thanks to some great troubleshooting, our streaming should now be more stable. We're also planning to create both a public and private Wi-Fi network for better security and speed.



Faith's mobile app is live and working on Android platforms again! Please take a moment to download it if you haven't yet—this will be an increasingly helpful tool for staying connected. On the outreach side, we brainstormed QR code ideas that would link to a "Plan a Visit" or welcome page on the website. We're working toward a more engaging website experience and continuing updates to our Education, Finance, and Youth pages. We also began rolling out our Gantt Chart for event planning and marketing, which helps ministries coordinate upcoming events and ensure proper promotion. Teams can request support with social media, slides, printed materials, and even light paid ads through our communications budget.

Finally, we're pleased to share that our Capital Campaign card fundraiser has already raised \$280, with a goal of surpassing \$500 this year. Thank you to everyone who's supported this initiative—cards are still available on Sundays.

If you have been scammed any monetary value then you also must report it to the Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3.gov) or the Federal Trade Commission (ReportFraud.ftc.gov).

It is the central hub for reporting cyber-enabled crime. It is run by the FBI, the lead federal agency for investigating crime.
