I wonder if you might sometimes find yourself crying out, "Jesus, do you not care that I am perishing? "I wonder if you might sometimes pray, "Jesus, help me! Save me! Do something!" That, by the way, is a good prayer. Sometimes we find ourselves in a situation where we can hardly imagine a solution. Please remember that we don't need to tell Jesus how to solve our problem. We don't need to say, "Do this, Jesus!" or "Do that!" It is quite sufficient to pray, "Jesus, help me! Jesus, save me! Jesus, please do something!"

Sometimes, the Lord answers our prayers in the way we desired. Sometimes we pray to recover from an illness, and we recover. Sometimes, we pray for a relationship to be restored, and it is. But, at other times, the Lord helps us in another way. Sometimes, the Lord makes it possible for us to live joyful, productive live in spite of the storms raging around us and within us. Someone put it this way:

"Sometimes the Lord calms the storm; Sometimes He lets the storm rage and calms the believer."

CARE TALKS

Only 3 weeks away is Care Talk Sunday. October 19, 2025

A gentleman with meager means who lived in England desired to leave his homeland and sail to America for a better life. He saves enough money to buy a ticket for a ships passage.

During his 14 day voyage, he ate nothing but Cheese and Crackers that he had packed for the trip. Everyday of the voyage, he would watch his fellow passengers make their way to the dining area that was always filled with sweet aromas. On their return, he would hear the same express how delicious the meals were and could hardly wait until the next.

Near the end of the voyage, one of the ships staff expressed to him, "Sir why do you never come to eat in the dining room?" He replied rather shamefully, "Sir, I had only enough money to buy a ticket to sail but not for food." The reply was "Your ticket included all meals to daily enjoy a banquet of fine food and drink." My what he had missed out on that entire trip!

The core message of this tale is that it serves as a parable about the many within Christs body who have and presently are missing out in fully enjoying the generosity of Gods grace through Christ. Sadly, I believe that overall many of Gods children are in the same boat as our Cheese and Cracker friend.

To be sure the words of Jesus in John 10:10b declaring "I have come that you may have life, and have it abundantly are claimed. Yet this fullness of life is so often not felt to its fullest. We have sips of it but too often much of life is settled as "Whatever." Is that abundance?

The scriptures share numberless ways to partake in abundant life. On Sunday October 19, the focus of the Care Talks will be on 4 of those Pathways tucked away in the scriptures to experience more and more the abundance of the immeasurable riches of Gods boundless grace in kindness towards us in Christ Jesus. Ephesians 2:7.

In the Sunday School hour we will focus on two paths. The first is tapping what constitutes the full sufficiency of Gods everyday providing for us. The second is on the cultivating of piety. It is an essential aspect of spirituality in the Christian walk. We study this pathway to a deep relationship with God and the blessings which flow.

The message for the 10:30 service centers on a Weight Reduction ministry Christ introduced in Matthew 11:28-30.

The post worship Care Talk starting during lunch will focus on Psalming known as the bearing of soul.

Each of these Care Talks are dedicated to enjoying more and more the promised abundant life. The fruits are a boosting of our physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being and contributes to freeing us from the freezing state of "Whatever." Life is far more than cheese and crackers, though it is a tasty evening snack.

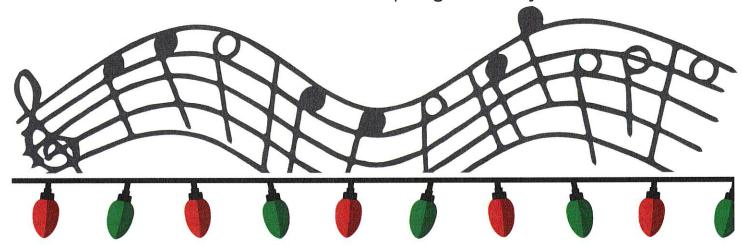

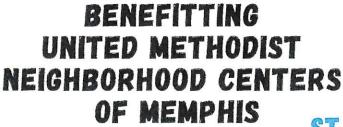
