


Perhaps. Indeed, the past was smaller, more local, and involved problems that average people could actually do something about. Now we live in a world of AI, of war on industrial scales, of global economies. Our families are scattered across the country or even the world looking for work and the best opportunities. The scale of the world has grown, and that makes us all individually small. And so maybe we hope for something small, something simple, some easy fix to go

back to a time where individuals could find meaning locally and where simply changing the heart of one industrialist like Ebenezer Scrooge would transform a whole community.

For some church is part of that nostalgic past with memories of simple times, simple messages, and a simple vision of how the world is related to the supernatural. And so, church feels as old-fashioned as a model Dickensian Christmas village. It's just too simple to address the problems of today. Its message, its blind hope in some 2000-year-old guy and a 2000-year-old book feel quaint and outdated in a rapidly changing world. We're too grown up now, too jaded, too technological to take it very seriously.

But what if we are still simple ones? The message of Christmas in the Bible is not about some nostalgic time of a quaint little family. It's the story of the most disruptive event of human history, the invasion of God into the world of human affairs. It's the divine challenge to human order, to the simplistic story that we are managing our personal and civilizational affairs well by ourselves. The Gospel of John (1:14) puts it this way, "The Word became flesh and made his home among us." The "Word" here can mean "an account". It's a word that has its origin in how people value things. The message here is the one who gives things meaning, who gives value to things, has come to the world as light, but people prefer to live in darkness and reject the light of truth. Darkness is simple.

It's about control of information and thus control of value, control of stories and people. It's about keeping people in the dark, keeping secrets, telling simple stories to create alignment with some side or other.

The story of Christmas, of Jesus Christ coming into the world, isn't a story about how amazing the miracles were, but a story of God coming to disrupt the ways humans control each other and his creation with a challenge. It is God coming with what Jesus will call his kingdom—a different order of living in God's world, a different way of seeing other people, valuing others, and seeing the light triumph over the darkness. Never before has the control of information and the modes of distribution been more simplified and owned by so few. Celebrating the coming of the Word of God is celebrating the freedom brought by the light. Jesus later says, "If you have your living in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth and the truth will set you free" (John 8:31-32).

Christmas is anything but a holiday of the simplistic and nostalgic. It is a celebration that God has sent us the one who can set us free to a different future, both in this life and hereafter.



Greetings Grace Family,

I hope this message finds you well and enjoying the blessings of the holiday season.

As I write this on November 7th, I've been home for a week with sick children. Any parent knows how hard it is when one child is unwell — but when all of them are down at once, it's a whole different level of exhaustion.

It always starts the same way: a slightly glassy look in their eyes, followed by the dreaded words, "Mom, I have a sore throat." Instantly, your heart sinks. You start praying, *Please, God, bring healing now*. "Let's try for school," you say, hopeful.

But before the backpacks are zipped and the lunches are packed, the coughing begins — and doesn't stop. So you unpack the lunches, knowing full well this is the beginning of a very long week.

I rarely get sick myself, but I was down for two weeks toward the end of October. Somehow, I made it through Trunk or Treat, though I remember lying on my back in the media room upstairs, staring up at twenty buckets of candy loaded onto carts, thinking, *How am I ever going to get through this day?*

So when the kids began showing symptoms, I knew exactly what it meant. I knew what to expect, and I knew how it would progress. That Monday, I called the doctor and said what any desperate mom would say: "I know you haven't seen the kids, and this is probably breaking protocol, but I was sick and had exactly what they have. I need Z-packs for them now. This is going to get worse and turn bacterial, and I need to get ahead of it."

Of course, the nurse replied, "Unfortunately, we don't prescribe antibiotics until we've seen the patient. And we wouldn't prescribe anything at this point. When they've been sick for six days, let us know and we can get them in."

Six days?! I'd have to wait until my kids gradually got sicker before they'd even consider calling something in? I was so frustrated. I kept trying to explain, "Look, I know what this is! I can tell you exactly how this will go — from bad to worse overnight." But it didn't matter what I said.

There are few times in life when you can predict exactly what's about to happen — a play-by-play. This was one of them. I knew how it would start. I knew what would happen at night, in the mornings. I knew when the headaches

would begin, when the appetite would disappear, when the light sensitivity would kick in. I knew which days would be the worst. I could predict every symptom and the exact sequence they'd follow.

Why am I sharing this story? Because it was remarkable how much comfort my children found in knowing I had gone through the same thing. There was reassurance in knowing that before their next symptom hit, I had already experienced it — and could help them through the next phase.

It was comforting for them to hear me say, "Tonight the cough will get worse, so we're going to start taking dextromethorphan at bedtime." It helped when I said, "Keep drinking fluids now, before your throat hurts so badly you won't want to." They trusted me because I had walked the same path just days before.

Deuteronomy 31:8 reminds us that "The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you." God is leading us. He has gone ahead of us, preparing the path for what is to come. He is with us in every circumstance and every journey — and He will never abandon us. We trust Him on the path, knowing He already knows what happens next.

Psalm 139:16 says, "Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be." I find this tremendously comforting. Not only is God going ahead of me, but nothing that happens to me is catching Him by surprise.

And not only can I rest in the knowledge that God knows what's going on in my life — I can come to Him and ask for wisdom to prepare for what's next. James 1:5 promises, "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him."

As we enter this season of celebration, reflection, and togetherness, may we remember that just as our children find comfort in knowing we've walked the path before them, we too can find peace in knowing that God has gone before us. Whether we're facing illness, uncertainty, or simply the chaos of holiday schedules, we are not alone. God is already there — preparing, guiding, and sustaining us.

This holiday season, I encourage you to lean into that truth. Invite God into your plans, your parenting, your quiet moments, and your chaos. Ask Him for wisdom, strength, and peace. And when things feel overwhelming, remember: He sees you, He knows what's ahead, and He will never leave you.

May your home be filled with warmth, your hearts with peace, and your days with the gentle assurance that God is with you — leading, loving, and lighting the way.

On January 13, 2023, my girlfriend Tracy passed away. Although she had more than her share of health challenges, her passing was unexpected. The church staff and Deacons did a wonderful job of being supportive and taking care of so many things related to her Celebration of Life.

To put it in perspective: most people spend at least a year planning a wedding. A Celebration of Life shares many of the same elements—but we're usually given only a few days or weeks to prepare. The Deacons and staff here at GPC are well equipped, and they take pride and joy in assisting with the planning and fulfillment of the service and all that surrounds it. At a time when friends and family are overwhelmed with grief, fatigue, and a whole range of other challenges, the staff and Deacons provide great relief by making things happen. I know I'm being repetitive here, but I cannot emphasize enough how much of a blessing it is to be cared for in this way during such a difficult time. As I would find out later that same year in December, the care and love from the Deacons doesn't end after the cleanup from the Celebration of Life.

One day in December 2023, while at work, I received a text message from one of the Deacons, Peggy Steere. She said she had something for me and wanted to set up a time to bring it by. I had no idea what it might be—maybe a Christmas gift, I thought. When Peggy arrived, she was carrying a small gift bag. I was still racking my brain about what might be inside. When I reached into the bag, I was greeted by a

waxed Amaryllis bulb. Peggy explained how it worked, and I began anticipating what it might bloom into. Also tucked inside the bag were two pamphlets—one offering guidance on caring for the Amaryllis bulb, and another sharing ways to ease the pain of losing a loved one during the Holidays.

Peggy shared that the Deacons offer these waxed Amaryllis bulbs as a heartfelt gift to those they supported through Celebrations of Life in the past year. Holidays can be especially painful for those who have lost someone. They can be a conspicuous reminder of someone's absence. I try to turn that acknowledgment into an opportunity to speak or reflect on the ways we enjoyed holidays together—but I digress. (That could be an entire article unto itself.)

As Peggy was getting ready to leave, I told her I definitely wanted to help with the distribution of bulbs next year as a way of giving back. This year as a Deacon, I look forward to being able to assist in the distribution of this beautiful gift.

I placed the bulb on the kitchen windowsill. I watched it slowly sprout and grow. I wondered when it would bloom, and what shape and color it might be. A few weeks later, it did indeed bloom into something beautiful.

The beauty of the bloom made me reflect on how the sharing of this gift—a beautiful act in itself—was later amplified by the flower and what it represented. It was a quiet reminder that even in grief, something living and lovely can emerge. That beauty can be wrapped in wax and still find its way to the light.



HUICHOL PRAYER PROJECT

Please join us in praying for this people group. Here is some information about them and why we want to pray for them.

The Huichol are an indigenous people group in western Mexico who are, according to www.joshuaproject.net, the last remaining unreached indigenous people group in Mexico, with fewer than 2% of believers in Jesus. Our proposal is to begin praying for this people group as a church. From time to time, we will give you more information about them to fuel your prayers. Will you join us in praying for the Huichol?

The Huichol refer to themselves as Wixárika or simply "people". They live primarily in western Mexico in the Sierra Madre Occidental mountains. This area includes some of the most rugged terrain in Mexico, with mesas, cliffs, and river valleys covered mostly by scrub and thorns. Historically, the rough terrain insulated them from outside influences. They successfully resisted Spanish colonialism for many years and always maintained a high degree of self-rule. Today the Huichol are no longer as isolated and are integrating into the general Mexican society and economy. The Huichol have a complicated relationship with the Mexican government which tries to tax them and enforce Mexican law. Since the Huichol have lived autonomously for centuries, this sometimes means conflict with their way of life.

Today there is an unprecedented opportunity to reach the Huichol with the message of Jesus through groups like The Seed Company. The New Testament and the JESUS film are available to the Huichol. The Huichol need much prayer and additional laborers to work with them so they may have adequate access to the message of Jesus.

Specific Prayer Points:

 Pray for a spiritual hunger that will lead Huichol leaders to the cross and the empty grave. Pray that God will save key Huichol leaders who will boldly declare the gospel to their people.

- Pray that God will strengthen and encourage missionaries presently working among the Huichol.
- Pray that God will give Huichol believers boldness to share the love of Jesus with their own people.

PROYECTO DE ORACIÓN DE HUICHOL

Los Huicholes son una etnia indígena en México quienes son, según www.joshuaproject.net, la última etnia indígena no alcanzada en México, con menos de 2% de creyentes en Jesús. Nuestro propósito es empezar a orar por esta etnia como iglesia. De vez en cuando, les daremos más información acerca de los Huicholes para alimentar sus oraciones. Únase a nosotros en orar por los Huicholes.

Los Huicholes se llaman Wixárika, es decir, "la gente". Viven primordialmente en la parte oeste de México, en las montañas de la Sierra Madre Occidental. Esta area incluye terreno muy escabroso, con mesetas, acantilados, y valles fluviales cubiertos de matorrales y espinas. Historicamente, el terreno los protegió de las influencias de afuera. Resistieron con éxito la colonización de los españoles por muchos años y siempre mantuvieron un alto grado de autogobierno. Hoy día los Huicholes ya no están tan aislados y están integrandose en la sociedad Mexicana y en la economía. Los Huicholes tienen una relación complicada con el gobierno Mexicano que intenta gravar impuestos y enforzar la ley. Porque los Huicholes han vivido autónonamente por siglos, a veces eso trae un conflicto con su manera de vivir.

Hoy día hay una oportunidad sin precedentes a alcanzar los Huicholes con el mensaje de Jesús por medio de grupos como The Seed Company. El Nuevo Testamento y la película JESÚS están disponibles en su idioma. Los Huicholes necesitan mucha oración y trabajadores adicionales para trabajar con ellos y que tengan acceso adecuado al mensaje de Jesús.

Oraciones específicas:

- Ore por un hambre espiritual que guiará a los líderes de los Huicholes a la cruz y a la tumba vacía. Ore que Dios salve a líderes Huicholes claves quienes declaren con audacia el evangelio a su etnia.
- Ore que Dios dé a los creyentes Huicholes una audacia a compartir el amor de Jesús con su propia gente.
- Ore que Dios dé esfuerzo y ánimo a los misioneros que están trabajando actualmente con los Huicholes.
