

Day Camp Staff Cook

Every staff member at Camp Roger represents Jesus Christ and is a minister of the Gospel regardless of the department or position or job duties. God tells us in 1st Peter that we are a holy priesthood offering our daily work as a sacrifice to God. Scripture is clear that everything we do matters and we believe we are called to do it all to God's glory. All staff members at Camp Roger are expected to steward every opportunity for the glory of God and the advancement of the Kingdom.

Qualifications:

1. Professes Jesus Christ as his/her personal Savior and lives in accordance with God's Word.
2. Minimum age 18 years old.
3. Agrees to sign and to strive to live up to the standards outlined in the Camp Roger Staff Covenant.
4. Agrees to uphold Camp Roger's high safety standards and commits to living out Camp Roger's Belonging Statement.
5. Knowledge of all camp policies, government regulations, and state health standards that pertain to food service, preparation, and storage.
6. Ability to work closely with other camp staff to coordinate program details related to the kitchen.
7. Be ServSafe certified (certification will be provided if needed).

Duties:

1. Meal Planning and Preparation
 - a. Prepare well-balanced lunches for approximately 30 staff members each weekday.
 - b. Shop/order for meal ingredients and food for snacks based on the meal budget of \$2.50 per staff member.
 - c. Plan creative menus that are adaptable based on staff dietary restrictions, allergies, and preferences as well as ingredient availability and other limited resources.
 - d. Communicate and collaborate with the Overnight Camp Head Cook and Food Service Director on specific meal or ordering needs
2. Kitchen Management
 - a. Maintain a clean, organized, and efficient kitchen environment.
 - b. Monitor inventory and communicate supply needs to Day Camp Director.
 - c. Ensure compliance with health and safety regulations in food handling and storage.
3. Assist with other program, operational, and maintenance projects as needed.
4. Other duties as assigned.

Other:

1. Seasonal position, training starts two weeks before day camp sessions start and duties are completed after the last campers leave for the summer camp season.
2. Day Camp Staff are expected to live onsite in designated areas. Exceptions and accommodations may be made on a case-by-case basis. Housing is available for families or individuals, individual housing may be shared with others of the same gender. Day Camp Staff are allowed to use the Overnight Camp campus as home during the summer, and should be aware of the Overnight Camp program and not distract campers from their activities.
3. All meals provided during overnight camp sessions (breakfast and dinner at Overnight Camp and lunch at Day Camp) Food is also available but not served during time-off.
4. Hours are from 7 AM – 5 PM Monday – Friday including a meeting at 7 PM on Sunday nights prior to the session.
5. Will have opportunities to engage with an incredible summer staff community and make a positive impact on campers' lives.
