Reading through the Bible

Have you ever thought about reading through the Bible in a year? Maybe you have thought about it, and that's as far as you got. Or maybe you tried it once, and you bogged down and gave up.

I admit that it can be tough. I had, only, read through the whole Bible once in a



year, and that was as a part of the $60^{\rm th}$ anniversary of First Lutheran, Venice. That year a group of us committed to doing it together, so we had group support, which helped. But doing it all by yourself, as I just said, can be a tough go. I know, because I had tried it a couple of times and gave up each time.

But there are real advantages to doing it, as I have found out this year. With all of the conflict and problems in our country, something (or Someone?) prodded me to commit to reading through the Bible on my own in 2021, and I am glad I did. Using the reading plan that I will discuss in just a moment, it only takes me about 20 minutes a day, and as of the end of January I am doing great and really enjoying myself!

I look forward to it every day for several reasons. For one thing, I get in touch with the Big Picture of what God is doing in our world. We worship and serve a big and wonderful God, and reading through the whole Bible gives me a sense of the sweep of God's great plan of salvation. But I also get in touch with the intriguing details of God's activity too. By reading through the entire Bible I discover things in it that I never knew were there: little stories and insights that light up my mind and heart.


Most important of all, reading the Bible in this way puts me directly in touch with God through the Holy Spirit. The 20 minutes a day I give to this project are special times when I let God tell me whatever he wants to through his Word. I don't pick what I am going to read: God does, and God always has something relevant to tell me every day. These 20 minute reading periods also strengthen me for facing the problems and conflicts of today's world.

If you are going to attempt it, it's important to have a good reading plan, and the plan I am using is the best one I have run across. With this plan you read a portion of the Old Testament every day, a part of the New Testament, a Psalm (or part of one), and some verses from Proverbs. It's a good mix (like a good meal), and it builds a pleasing variety into every session. You can download this free reading plan from *OneYearBibleOnline.com*.





Burn the Mortgage!

We praise God for the gifts totaling \$1,486 in January to retire the church mortgage. The remaining balance stands at \$172,229. Slowly but surely this debt is being reduced. When we started to intentionally pay off the mortgage by making principal only payments, in addition to the monthly payment, we owed \$315,469. Members and friends of the congregation have contributed gifts monthly, occasionally, or one-time gifts. Thanks to all who have participated. It is easy to designate your gift by writing on your check or envelope "debt reduction."



Friends in Deed

First Lutheran began contributing to the Friends in Deed Food Pantry in 2017. Members have monthly consistently donated food items and sometimes cash to this outreach. Before the pandemic, volunteers would work one Saturday a month. I consider it a privilege to be able buy food to help a financially challenged family. Everyone needs to eat, if the pantry helps them with some food items the family can dedicate their scarce funds to pay rent, buy gas, and

pay utility bills. Many of the recipients of this aid are senior citizens on a very limited budget, while others are the working poor, each has a story and a need.

Papua New Guinea

January 2021

Dear Praying Friends,

When Mandita was in the Ipili area from July through September 2020 some Ipili people gave money to help with building the translation office/house there. Mandita sent me this expression of their thanks:

"On behalf of all the Ipili people we want to thank Janet Borchard and those in charge of Lutheran Bible Translators, USA. Along with the prayer groups and partners you pray and help us by giving money, and so we think of you as parents of our faith. You have given us many things such as the Ipili New Testament, audio Bibles, memory cards, Faith Comes By Hearing Proclaimers, and the Jesus video. Now we see that a building has been built in the Porgera district, and so now we rejoice and thank you very much."

In my November prayer letter I told you that I was hoping to be able to work with Mandita and Margret on the team check of Exodus chapters 10-14. I am thankful that we were able to work together several times during November using the Skype program. There were two times when the internet connection from Ukarumpa was broken for several days at a time, but otherwise I was very pleased with working over the internet.

The next step is for Mandita to look at comments that Margret and I have put in chapters 15-21 of Exodus, and to make any needed changes in those chapters. Then I will go through his changes to see if there are any more places where the meaning is not yet correct. At that point those chapters will be ready for the team check. *Please pray for wisdom as we do this work*. Besides going through Mandita's changes in Exodus chapters 15-21, I plan to continue working on the first advisor check of Exodus chapters 35-40.

There are two verses in Exodus chapter 13 that we still need to finish. They are verses 9 and 16 which both present similar difficulties. In the ESV version verse 9 says "And it shall be to you as a sign on your hand and as a memorial between your eyes, that the law of the Lord may be in your mouth. For with a strong hand the LORD has brought you out of Egypt." There are several parts to this verse, and we need to make sure that all the parts are in the translation, and that the relationships between those parts are correct and clear. It seems like when we fix one part another part gets messed up.

Margret has gone out to the Ipili area to take care of a family land issue. While she is there she hopes to show the Ipili videos to people. She also plans to work on increasing awareness of the translation work among the people by showing them how we use the Paratext computer program to do the translation. She plans to be there through January. We have heard that there is a lack of food in the Ipili area, so ask the Lord to provide for all her needs, and for the needs of everyone there.

Pray that Mandita will make good progress on the translation in January. He wants to go to the Ipili area to do more work on the translation office/house. I'm guessing that he will want to go in February after he gets all his children into school for the new school year. He has a list of things that he would like to do on the house. Ask the Lord to give him and me wisdom about what items should be done on the house.

I am hoping to go to Papua New Guinea sometime in 2021, and to stay there for several months. When I go depends on the coronavirus, and what the clinic doctors at Ukarumpa in PNG say about my going there.

Like me, I'm sure that all of you are looking forward to a time when life can get back to being more normal. How blessed we are to know that our lives are in the hands of our loving Lord! Your Partner in Bible Translation,


