A (Possible) Way Forward

Years ago, I attended a seminar led by a well-known church consultant. He had taught classes around the world on how to help churches grow and be spiritually healthy, and I only remember a couple of things he said (it was a <u>long</u> time ago). One thing I remember him saying is that what goes on in most churches is like hooking a horse up to each corner of a wagon and saying "giddyap".



What he meant by this quip is that many churches don't always plan and co-ordinate their activities well, so that as a result they go off in too many directions and don't accomplish a lot. From my experience, I would also add that many churches spread their energies too thin by trying to do too much.


So I have a suggestion to make – a possible way forward for First Lutheran. I suggest that for the next couple of years your congregation focus a big part of your energy and attention on being the care and spiritual center for the church's immediate neighborhood. This is not a new or radical idea. In the Book of Acts, Jesus tells his disciples that after they had received the Holy Spirit, they were to be witnesses to Jesus' resurrection first in Judaea, then in Samaria, and then "to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). In other words, they were to start serving and evangelizing right where they were, in their own backyard, before going anywhere else.

This has been an effective method for growing churches ever since. The word "parish" is not a word used only by Roman Catholics. Throughout history "parish" has referred to the area around a church that a congregation can effectively serve. It's the radius around the church's facility where members can easily care for each other and for the church's neighbors. In that way, these unchurched people can experience God's love and be open to hearing God's Word. I am not suggesting that First Lutheran ignore its members who live outside of the neighborhood, but I am proposing that your congregation focus on its "parish" – its immediate neighborhood – for purposes of outreach and evangelism.

There are all kinds of ways to do this, and your Mission Development Team has already begun to try a few things out. I am sure that they and you can come up with a lot of great ideas in the future. But I am convinced that pursuing this strategy will bring new growth to First Lutheran – and new excitement, too, as the Holy Spirit offers fresh opportunities to bring the Gospel to our community!

Our mortgage loan is getting smaller! Since we began the campaign to retire the church mortgage, members and friends of the congregation have contributed \$30,026. Some gifts have been small, some large, and some members are contributing monthly beyond their regular giving. We thank God for all gifts. The loan balance stands at \$178,154. We pray that 2021 will be another year of blessings for our congregation, its ministry, and each member. We strongly feel that wiping out the monthly mortgage payments of \$5028 would enhance ministry.



Friends in Deed

Thanks to the people who have donated gifts of their time, money, and grocery items to the Pasadena Friends in Deed Food Pantry. We have not weighed the December collection, but the year's total at this point is 5005 pounds. The pantry helps the economically challenged, the disabled, senior citizens, the working poor, and the homeless. When I buy groceries, I know I am helping someone to better manage their limited monetary resources. The pantry exists because many people from the community contribute hours of

volunteer time, donations of food items, and money. It is very easy for me to throw into my shopping cart items that are treasures for the needy. Let's focus on soups, stews, and other items that are nourishing and tasty on cold winter days.

Mission Development Team

The Sunday before Christmas, seven members and friends of the congregation walked and distributed a packet with a message and a small gift to at least 160 residences in our defined neighborhood. Our defined neighborhood includes homes near the church. We are following Pastor Frese's Mission Proposal 2021, and hope to distribute packets monthly. The purpose of this endeavor is to let our neighbors know that we are a caring and loving group of people who want to reach out to others.

Two Thrivent Choice Grants of \$250 each were recently awarded to Jo Tschopp. The first grant will be used to fund a community chalk event in the spring. The second grant will be used to cover expenses involved in the monthly defined neighborhood outreach.

The Community Prayer Box is installed and being checked regularly. We have received a number of requests and have passed them on to the church prayer chain. The Little Free Library is another outreach into the neighborhood. Neighbors are taking books and are also contributing them. Those of us who are on site regularly have been visiting with some of the neighbors who use our grounds to exercise. One of the exercising ladies even joined us to paint rocks. 
Our First Lutheran ROCKS! project has two goals:
