The second part of the church year is what are we doing with this new eternal life that Jesus alone has given us.


We are called to love God and we can challenge ourselves with how much do we let His Word – the Bible – cut into us?


#### **Friends in Deed**






#### First Wednesday Soup and Sandwich

#### New Organization for First Lutheran's tithe

It was voted during one of the Board of Directors' meetings to shift part of the tithes to the Lutheran Social Services of Southern California (<a href="https://www.lsssc.org">https://www.lsssc.org</a>) since the Lutheran High School in La Verne, CA has shut down. The following is a mission statement found on the website of Lutheran Social Services of Southern California (LSSSC) about their cause.

"Lutheran Social Services of Southern California (LSSC) began in December 1944 which a group of Lutheran congregations in San Diego came together to discuss how to better assist families in need. They began discussing how to form a Welfare Commission. Their vision expanded when they came together with another group of Lutheran congregation Los Angeles having the very same conversation. Lutheran Social Services of was officially incorporated in 1946 as a 501(c)(3) non-profit social service agency. The mission has stayed true to its earliest beginnings, to be a servant to those in need. Today LSSSC serves thousands of individuals and families throughout Southern California with over 70 different programs/services at nearly 20 different locations. We are part of the Lutheran Services in America (LSA) network and strive to serve those in need with dignity and respect."

Lutheran Social Services of Southern California serves people in need throughout Southern California with programs and services in multiple locations, such as: counties of Los Angeles, Ventura, Orange (where their corporate offices are located), Riverside, San Bernardino, and in San Diego. LSSSC is planning future services in the counties of Imperial, Kern, San Luis Obispo, and Santa Barbara."

In the Los Angeles County San Gabriel Valley area, the LSSSC's Avanti program in Pasadena serves developmentally challenged adults. LSSC's disabled adult clients engage the community through social and volunteer opportunities. LSSSC offers a range of services including recreational, educational, and one-on-one interaction with youth, seniors, and other neighborhood residents.

LSSC's Long Beach/South Bay center services more than 1,000 people each month providing emergency assistance such as food, clothing, hygiene items, and blankets. After client intake, LSSC refers many to additional resources throughout the community. LSSC also offers disability and housing assistance to homeless families, individuals, and veterans throughout their County Wide Benefits Program (CBEST).

There are many other programs and information listed on their website. Their next fundraising event – "Color of Hope Gala & Awards" shall be held on October 7, 2023 (Saturday) from 11:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Look for more details to follow on their website.


