Cherish What God Has Given

In the Small Catechism, Luther follows a pattern when explaining the Ten Commandments. With each commandment, there is something prohibited, and something commanded. There is something wrong which must be avoided, and there is something right which must be done.

The one time this pattern is not followed is with the Sixth Commandment.

"You shall not commit adultery. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other" (SC I).

Here, the catechism focuses solely on the positive: we should live in a chaste and decent manner in both word and deed, and husbands and wives should cherish and honor one another.

Keeping this commandment, and all of the commandments, is a lot easier if you see your chastity and your spouse as a gift from God that is to be protected and cherished. In the same way, you will find keeping the Fourth Commandment easier if you see your parents and other authorities as a gift from God, given to you for your blessing.

This is the key stewardship insight that runs through all of the Christian life: Everything that we have has been given to us by God. We deserve none of it. All of it comes to us by God's fatherly kindness and open-handed generosity. If I know that everything I have — every possession, every relationship, every ability — is a gift from God, then my perspective changes. All of these things are both gifts to be cherished, and things that I should direct towards God's purposes. My possessions should be shared generously according to how God has called me in my family, church and community. My spouse should be cherished, loved and encouraged in faith. My children are on loan from my own Heavenly Father, and I have but a brief time to show them the path of righteousness. My neighbor is a gift from God so that I can imitate His kindness toward me.

No matter the gift, everything has been given to me by God so that I may participate in His own goodness and open-handed generosity.





<u>Lutheran Social Services of Southern California (LSSSC)</u> – March Highlights

LSSSC and City of San Bernardino Awarded \$35 Million Project Homekey Grant

Lutheran Social Services Southern California is overjoyed to announce that we have received a \$35 million dollar grant, in partnership with the City of San Bernardino and our developer – Dignity Moves. This grant



will allow us to greatly expand the capacity and services offered at the Central City Lutheran Mission – now known as our San Bernardino Community Wellness Campus. The result will be a comprehensive facility for individuals experiencing homelessness, low-income populations, and those with complex health and social service needs – all located in the existing site on G Street, San Bernardino.

The Project Homekey funding will provide 140 interim-term modular housing units and infrastructure upgrades along with ongoing funding for an onsite health clinic, case management, behavioral health treatment, job training and placement, rehabilitation services and long-term housing assistance. Many services will be available not only to the residents, but also to the surrounding community as well. Ground-breaking will be very soon, and the project partner and developer – Dignity Moves – estimates a completion date of spring 2025.

"What a breath of fresh air!"

"What a breath of fresh air!" – is referring to LSSSC's *Avanti* program for the developmentally challenged adults in Pasadena, CA. They were the first words out of the leader's mouth of a preaudit team from Lanterman Regional Center that had just toured the facility. The tour had been conducted by one of the Avanti's program participants, and provided a small picture of how the residents are involved in creating a program that is satisfying and beneficial to them.



For over 40 years, our Avanti program has served individuals experiencing intellectual and/or development disabilities. Avanti successfully engages participants in social and volunteer opportunities through the community while also reinforcing basic life skills and independence. Trinity Lutheran Church in Pasadena, CA has also opened their doors and hearts to the Avanti participants in a big way. Some of our participants and their families have been with Avanti for multiple decades.

As LSSSC seeks to show the love of Jesus by embracing, equipping, and empowering the vulnerable, we are thrilled to have outside institutions recognize the love and quality that embody our Avanti program.

Seniors Helping Seniors

Did you know that among LSSC's over 40 programs in six counties, we operate the Senior Companion Program (SCP) for the entire county of San Diego?

SCP provides transportation assistance, in-home assistance, and social-emotional support or companionship for homebound seniors (65 plus) throughout San Diego. For more than 26 years of service in the community, the program has prioritized enhancing homebound seniors' quality of life and assisting seniors to remain independent for as long as possible.

A unique element of the program is that it engages the aging community (50 plus) as Volunteer Companions to visit homebound seniors who will benefit mentally and emotionally from quality interaction with caring volunteers. Weekly activities will include grocery shopping, shared meals, community activities, hobbies, and transportation to medical appointments – ultimately leading to prolonged independence, reduction of isolation, and improved overall well-being.



Dr. Mehl began his ministry at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Lincoln, Kansas where he served eight years as a parish pastor, before being called by LCMS Board for Mission Services as a church planter

in Moscow, Russia, in 1993. He served as the pastor of two different congregations in Moscow and supervised the "Moscow Seminars," an ongoing theological education program for Russian Lutheran pastors. In 2004 he and his family moved from Moscow to Frankfurt, Germany, while serving with LCMS World Missions as the Regional Director for Eurasia. In 2006, the family moved to Hong Kong, where Dr. Mehl served as the Regional Director for Asia until 2013. While in Asia he was a member of the leadership team that started Concordia International School, Hanoi. From 2014 to 2016 he served as the Director of Mission Partnerships and Church Relations at Concordia University, Nebraska.
