### **Stewardship in the First Commandment**

The greatest gift that Martin Luther gave to us was his Small Catechism. The word "enchiridion" is part of the original title of this work. This is the Greek word for "handbook." The Small Catechism is a handbook of the Bible. All the basic knowledge that a Christian person needs to understand the faith and live a godly life has been taken from the Bible and distilled into this beautiful little book of Christian piety.

Luther starts with the Ten Commandments.

The First Commandment: You shall have no other gods. *What does this mean?* We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things. (SC I)

We have a God above us. He is the Lord God and we are not. He is Almighty and in control. He is righteous and good. And therefore, we should fear Him.

This God is also our heavenly Father. He wants us to be saved. He does not want us to suffer His just wrath. He has provided salvation for us in His Son, Jesus Christ. And therefore, we should love Him.

Our heavenly Father will never leave us nor forsake us. He has promised as much — and the Bible shows us that He always keeps His promises. So, we should trust Him.


In the Large Catechism, Luther explains how money and possessions form one of the greatest temptations against the First Commandment:

This I must unfold somewhat more plainly, that it may be understood and perceived by ordinary examples of the contrary. Many a one thinks that he has God and everything in abundance when he has money and possessions; he trusts in them and boasts of them with such firmness and assurance as to care for no one. Lo, such a man also has a god, Mammon by name, i.e., money and possessions, on which he sets all his heart, and which is also the most common idol on earth. He who has money and possessions feels secure, and is joyful and undismayed as though he were sitting in the midst of Paradise. On the other hand, he who has none doubts and is despondent, as though he knew of no God. For very few are to be found who are of good cheer, and who neither mourn nor complain if they have not Mammon. This [care and desire for money] sticks and clings to our nature, even to the grave. (LC I 5–9)

These words of Dr. Luther should call us to repentance; sometimes, we live and act like we don't have a Father in heaven. We seek our comfort and peace outside of His gracious promises. But we do have a Father in heaven. He does love us. All His promises are true. And the Lord will surely provide. If that is our belief, then our outward lives will reflect our belief in our acts of generosity and mercy. We will see money and possessions not as gods but rather as tools for doing God's work.

#### **YESTERDAY & TODAY**

Since 1994, the Central City Lutheran Mission (CCLM) of San Bernardino Since 1994, the Central City Lutheran Mission (CCLM) of San Bernardino has operated the only large-scale shelter of 16 skind for men experiencing homelessness. In 2015, CCLM became part of the Lutheran Social Services of Southern California (LSSC) family of community sites and program services. LSSSC immediately began providing more than just shelter. With a team of more than 15 staff and hundreds of decilcated volunteers, we also offered case coordination, housing counseling, employment search selfstence. Staff and support training, and much more assistance, street outreach, peer support training, and much more.

Over the last 5 years, the San Bernardino Sun newspaper has reported Over the last Syears, the Son Bernordino Sun newspaper has reported that the number of people in the Inland Empire experiencing homeless-ness has grown by over 175%. While the demand for temporary shelter and services grew at LSSSC, the demand for more stable longer-term housing and services also grew. Our steady growth has produced new challenges, yet even greater copportunities to make a lasting difference for men to achieve stability and lasting self-sufficiency.

#### OUR PLAN FOR THE FUTURE

For the past two years, LSSSC has planned for, and now has undertaken of the most forward-thinking solutions to not just end homelessness but to

While maintaining the legacy and appreciation for CCLM, we will transform the current site's nearly 3 acres of land in the vicinity of the Interstate 215 corridor into a Community Wellness Campus. This project will revitaize the community and allow for housing and supportive services to be delivered.

#### CAMPAIGN MILESTONES 1. Quiet Phase - Celebration Goal \$22,800,000

At this point, we will have raised 60% of project funds & begun new construction with reconstruction of existing building near completion. Major naming opportunities will be available to initial donors.

#### 2. Public Phase - Challenge Goal \$10,100,000

At this point, we will have raised an additional 30% of the total goal with mid-range gifts between 5k-25k. A portion of men will be housed in both the shelter and the portion of housing units that have been completed. Naming opportunities will have been made publically available.

#### 3. Final Phase - Transformational Goal \$3,100.000

This final phase will conclude with gifts from \$100.\$5,000 and will include opportunities for memorial and honorary tributes such as on pevers and bricks. The last touches, such as landscaping, art, and decor. will be completed. A celebratory open house will include all suppo






