



STEPPING INTO THE SUPERNATURAL

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MESSAGE SUMMARY

We're kicking off a new series: "Stepping into the Supernatural."

Everyone is drawn to something beyond the natural—psychics, horoscopes, crystals—but God designed us to experience the real supernatural through Him. The problem is that most people don't realize Christianity *is* supernatural.

In this message, we learned:

1. God wants to use you—not just pastors or "super spiritual" people—to show His power and love to others.
2. You're not too young, too imperfect, or too unready to experience God's supernatural power.
3. God isn't looking for perfect people—He's looking for willing people.

If you've ever thought, "God can't use me," this week's message reminds us that God can and wants to use you *now*—even while you're still learning, growing, and figuring things out.

Questions & Responses:

1. Why do you think so many people—Christians included—look for supernatural experiences outside of God (like crystals, astrology, or psychics)?

Potential Response:

People have a built-in desire for something beyond this world, but they often look in the wrong places. God created that desire so we would find true power and peace in *Him*.

2. What do you think holds most people back from believing God can use them in supernatural ways?

Potential Response:

Most of us feel too young, too imperfect, or too unready. But God doesn't wait for us to "arrive." He uses ordinary people—students, teenagers, even people with doubts—to do extraordinary things.

3. What do you notice about the boy who gave his lunch to Jesus?

Potential Response:

He didn't overthink it—he just believed Jesus could do something big with something small. God loves to use people with simple, bold faith like that.

4. Who does Jesus say will do supernatural things—just pastors, or *anyone who believes*?

Potential Response:

Jesus said *all who believe*. That means you. God's power moves through belief, not titles or perfection. If we believe, we can see God move through our prayers and actions.

5. Why do you think people say, “I’m not ready,” when God calls them to do something bold?

Potential Response:

Because feeling ready is rare! Even Moses didn’t feel ready when God called him. God isn’t asking for perfection—He’s asking for *willingness*. When we step out, He promises, “I will be with you.” (Exodus 3:12)

6. What would it look like for you to “get your mind right” this week—replacing limiting thoughts (“I’m too young,” “I’m not holy,” “I’m not ready”) with what God says about you?

Potential Response:

Encourage them to be specific—maybe it’s praying for a friend, inviting someone to church, or trusting God to move through them. When we believe God can use us, He *does*.

7. If God isn’t waiting for us to be older, holier, or more prepared... what’s stopping you from letting Him use you now?

Potential Response:

Nothing but our mindset. When we believe that God still does the supernatural—and wants to do it through us—we step into the life He designed.
