Key Texts

Judges 2:10–23; Judges 3:1–4; Deuteronomy 6:1–9; Hebrews 12:5–11

Summary

God keeps His covenant and lovingly disciplines His people. Israel's failure to pass on faith, remember God's character, and embrace His discipline led to cycles of compromise—warning us to train the next generation and trust God's refining love. We can learn much from examining Israel's failures in the book of Judges.

1. Failure to Prepare the Next Generation

- After Joshua died, "another generation arose who did not know the Lord" (Judg. 2:10).
- Deuteronomy 6 commands parents to teach God's ways **daily in ordinary moments**, forming hearts that delight in what is good, not merely enforcing rules.
- True gospel-centered discipleship starts in the home and shapes identity before outward public witness.

2. Failure to Remember God's Nature

- God left some nations in Canaan to **test and train** Israel (Judg. 3:1–4), using concrete experiences to reveal His character.
- Like A.R. Luria's research showing that experiential knowledge precedes abstract reasoning, God knew that Israel needed lived encounters to truly "know" Yahweh.
- When stories of God's works were not passed down, spiritual amnesia led to idolatry and apostasy.

3. Failure to Recognize and Receive Discipline

- Those remaining enemies became instruments of **loving discipline**, fulfilling God's warnings.
- Hebrews 12 teaches that trials—though painful—produce holiness and maturity for those who submit to God's training.
- Believers today are called to see hardships as God's providential opportunities for growth, further formation and deepened faith.

4. The Covenant Question Answered at the Cross

 Judges raises a question about whether God's covenant is conditional or unconditional. But we do not receive an answer to that question until we reach the Cross and we see that:

Jesus fulfills the law perfectly so God can love His people unconditionally.

Discussion Questions

- 1. **Passing on the Faith** What everyday habits in your home or church can help the next generation meet and follow Jesus and love God with all of their heart, soul, and might?
- 2. **Knowing God** How can we keep the stories of God's faithfulness alive so that experiential knowledge of Him is not lost?
