Rather's Day is a day set apart to celebrate fatherhood, recognize the influence of fathers in our homes and society, and foster paternal bonds. It is also celebrated to honor



and commemorate our fathers and forefathers. While it is celebrated in the U.S. on the third Sunday of June, in many other countries the officially recognized date of Father's Day varies. It is believed that Father's Day was first observed on June 19, 1910, in Spokane, Washington, through the efforts of Sonora Smart Dodd, a Christian woman and the daughter of American Civil War veteran William Jackson Smart. Sonora's mother died when she was age 16, and she wanted a day that would commemorate and honor fathers like her own, who had raised her and five other children.

Once she began soliciting the idea of an official Father's Day, she met some opposition and even derision, but she persevered. A bill was introduced in Congress in 1913, and in 1916, President Woodrow Wilson spoke at a Father's Day celebration in Spokane, Washington, wanting to make it an official holiday, but Congress still resisted. In 1924, Calvin Coolidge became involved, and in 1930 a national committee was formed by various trade groups in an effort to legitimize the holiday. The battle continued, and in 1966 President Lyndon Johnson made a proclamation for the third Sunday of June to be Father's Day. Finally, it was made an official national holiday when President Nixon signed a similar proclamation in 1972.

The Bible recognizes a special place of honor for men who were leaders or examples of excellence in certain skills, such as Jabal, who was "the father of those who live in tents and raise livestock" and his brother Jubal, who was "the father of all who play the harp and flute" (Genesis 4:20-21). Also, when Abram's name was changed to Abraham, God told him, "I have made you a father of many nations" (Genesis 17:5), clearly indicating fatherhood as a place of honor in His eyes.

The theme of fatherhood in the very person of God Himself through countless scriptures (Matthew 5:45; 6:9,32; Romans 1:7; 15:6; 1 Corinthians 8:6). There are many instances that speak of Jesus Christ, the Son, honoring His Father and honoring the will of His Father (e.g., John 17:1 and John 17:5).

Today, the day honoring fathers is celebrated in the United States on the third Sunday of June. In other countries—especially in Europe and Latin America—fathers are honored on St. Joseph's Day, a traditional Catholic holiday that falls on March 19.


- **Ephesians 6:4:** "Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord."



Pastor's Devotional



VS HUMILITY

Luke 20:45-47 — While all the people were listening, Jesus said to his

disciples, ⁴⁶"Beware of the teachers of the law. They like to walk around in flowing robes and love to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces and have the most important seats in the synagogues and the places of honor at banquets. ⁴⁷They devour widows' houses and for a show make lengthy prayers. These men will be punished most severely."

t the end of end of Luke 20:47 Jesus condemns the teachers of the law for one final thing, the length of their public prayers. When the teachers of the law prayed in the synagogues, they were more concerned with displaying their eloquence and being seen than with truly addressing God and making their needs known. They prayed the prayers that Jesus criticizes in Matthew 6:19, the type of prayer that is the mark of hypocrites, "And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others."

And though Jesus is critical of the teachers of the law who crave the spotlight, behind all this is also a condemnation of the culture that creates the environment for men like this to flourish. It is because they lived in a culture that valued celebrity, a culture that places a high worth on clothes and money and position that these teachers of the law felt a need to lift themselves up. They were given special greetings and accorded a special status because people were and continue to be impressed by celebrity rather than character. It happens today in our culture where we create celebrities out of Instagram influencers all because they project a type of lifestyle that suggest fame and wealth. I believe in Luke 20:47 by criticizing the teachers of the law, Jesus is teaching his disciples to avoid the pursuit of and a desire to be false celebrities.

Central you remember Tareq and Michaele Salahi? You might not recall the names, but you remember their actions. Tareq and Michaele was the couple that famously crashed the White House state dinner held in honor or Israeli Prime Minister Manmohan Singh during President Barak Obama's second term. Camera crews followed them around as they got dressed for this celebrated black-tie event; and when they arrived at the White House, they were able to pass through two security checks without an invitation. The security crews thought that because they dressed the part and had a camera crew filming them, they were invited guests. During the dinner the couple managed to take photographs with then White House chief of staff Rahm Emmanuel, Vice President Joe Biden, and they even took a picture of with President Obama, a photo that Michaele later that night posted on her Facebook.

You may ask what would motivate a couple to take that

risk knowing if they were discovered they would face federal charges; there are some people in this world who crave attention so much, who desire recognition so much, who want to rub shoulders with so called important people so much, who want to be noticed so much, that they will do anything to get it. A disciple of Jesus cannot be that way. And moreover, God is not pleased by those who are seeking human attention rather than pursuing divine approval.

Jesus will say to us at the end of v. 47 that though people may be impressed with celebrity, with clothes and money and status, God is not. The same people who were ushered to the head of the table, who were given the most impressive seats in the synagogue are the same people who God has reserved special punishment for. Jesus says that God will have a VIP section in hell for people who seek human approval rather than doing God's will. God is not impressed with our status. God will not make room for us at his table because of our position. What impresses God is obedience and the people for whom God makes room at his table are those who humble themselves.

TAKING CARE OF OUR TEMPLE



On Palm Sunday, Elder Chris Phillips had a massive heart attack. We were all shocked because we had just seen him on church and he looked perfectly healthy. Duriring the crisis, his heart stopped for 6 minutes and the days and weeks that followed were filled with prayer, and all forms of congregation reaching out to the family. On Sunday, May 21, seven weeks later, Elder Chris was back at church worshipping with us. At the end of service he thank the Central family for their prayers and support. He also urged us to get annual phyicals and discuss the details of your health with your healthcare provider and do the what they recommend. Don't be just a hearer of the "word" but be a "doer."

We need to care for our health and one thing we can do is be mindful of what we eat and get ample exercise. *The Medical News Today* website publishes a cardiac diet and below is a portion of that article.

Keep Elder Chris and his family in prayer and ask God to lead you and guide you, and keep you as you take care of your temple. Remember it's not for your sake obly you want to be healthy, but your gifts and talents are needed to build up the Body of Christ.

ABOUT THE CARDIAC DIET

The cardiac diet prioritizes foods such as vegetables, whole grains, and oily fish. These foods are beneficial for heart health. The diet also limits processed foods that are high in sugar and salt, as these can increase the risk of heart disease.

The cardiac diet aims to reduce the risk of cardiovascular disease by encouraging people to eat heart-healthy, anti-inflammatory foods.

According to the American Heart Association (AHA) Trusted Source, these are the basic principles of the cardiac diet:

- include a wide variety of vegetables and fruits
- ♦ limit sugar and salt
- choose whole grains instead of highly refined or white grains





- ♦ get protein from plant sources such as legumes, nuts, and seeds, whenever possible
- if including animal products in the diet, try to choose:
- fish and seafood
- ♦ lean meats
- ♦ low fat or fat-free dairy
- cook with liquid non-tropical plant oils, such as olive oil
- ♦ limit highly processed foods
- if including alcohol in the diet, try to do so in moderation (consider removing alcohol from their diet.)

The cardiac diet also involves adjusting calorie intake and exercise levels to reach or maintain a moderate weight. This can have numerous health benefits, including reducing the risk of developing heart disease and diabetes.



URBACAD STARTS IN SEPTEMBER

What is URBACAD?

The Life of Christ, Based on Matthew's Gospel, is a six-part series of studies which engage the head, the heart, and the "hands" of the disciple.

We will delve into:

- Christ's introduction and infancy (Book 1)
- •the year of preparation (Book 2)
- •the year of popularity (Book 3)
- •the year of passion (Book 4 & 5)
- •His Risen Life (Book 6)

The workbooks use a simple programmed-instruction approach, with continual review and reinforcement of knowledge and structure. These workbooks serve as a virtual "teacher," presenting

essential truths about the Bible, theology, Bible background, and practical use of Bible truths in daily living and church leadership. Typically, these workbook units are completed individually between group meetings.

The Life of Christ books are most effective in the context of a cohort of students meeting together weekly to review the lessons learned, share insights from the Scripture, and encourage one another to grow in their walk with the Lord Jesus. And the "hands" of the students are engaged through required ministry assignments which reinforce the studies and the input of other students through practical application.

A group leader keeps the students focused on the unit objectives, but he/she is not a "teacher" or lecturer. The students learn to articulate their own understanding of the Scriptures, and to respond to others' ideas, in a godly and mature manner.

3-year commitment (2 semesters per year, Fall & Spring) 13 - 15 weeks
