

Volunteerism

As followers of Christ, we all have a calling on our life to serve as we are led. "Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it. And God has placed in the church first of all apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, of helping, of guidance, and of different kinds of tongues." 1 Corinthians 12:27-29 NIV.

National Volunteer Week is April 17-23, 2022 so we are highlighting volunteerism and service. National Volunteer Week was established in 1974. Although volunteering is not new, today, probably more than ever, people strive to lead lives that reflect their values through the expression of civic life. Since the formal establishment of National Volunteer week, thousands of volunteer projects are scheduled during that period, all with the intention of improving the life of others. President George H. W. Bush established Points of Light in 1990 with the mission - to inspire equip and mobilize people to take actions as volunteers that change the world; to encourage everyone to discover the power of making a difference in creating vibrant healthy and participatory communities.

Volunteerism is as beneficial to the receiver as it is to the giver. Gordon Hinckley said, "One of the great ironies of life is this: He or she who serves almost always benefits more than he or she who is served." There are innumerable capacities in which one can serve and everyone can serve. One can serve remotely (on line or on the telephone) or in person; individually or as part of a group; in small projects and in large ones. Examples of ways you can help:

- Help a neighbor with errands such as picking up mail, reading and responding to mail, reading magazines or books
- promoting events
- registration and attendance for events
- elder care and child care
- after school activities
- at food banks
- graphic design
- building websites
- as greeters and waiting room attendants
- giving directions and handing out literature

- helping to organize conferences and workshops
- leading small group activities.

Volunteerism enriches your own life by providing you with a purpose; giving you a sense of belonging through a community; helps you to meet new friends; helping you to increase your social skills; teaches you new skills and providing you with job opportunities. It also combats depression and provides a happiness effect. As the saying goes, "Life is a matter of give and take." When we give we also get. Also, regarding the need to serve, Muhammed Ali said, "Service to others is the rent you pay for your room here on earth" and we serve out of gratitude because the price has already been paid. Look for opportunities to volunteer service to a person or a cause.

In your times of Silence and Solitude (see page 3), when your mind starts to wander, ask the Lord how you help with Central's Service Events. We will need your time and your hands to help with the preparations and distributions.

Pastor's Devotional



Mark 16:1-3 — When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb and they asked each other, "Who will

roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?"

t is now early morning on the first ever Easter Sunday, and a group of women wake up to complete a task that had been left undone, to do one last thing on behalf of Jesus before they move on to wherever life will take them next. Joseph of Arimathea rushed to bury the body of Jesus before the start of the Jewish Sabbath on Friday and had no time to anoint the body for burial. So, with fragrant spices and ointment in hand Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome set out to honor Jesus' body by giving him a proper burial. These were among the women who had traveled with Jesus and supported his earthly ministry. They were there at the foot of the cross when Jesus took his last breath and now as a final tribute, they wanted to pour oil and fragrances over his body to keep the smell and the stench of death away.

As they were walking, the women realized that there was an obstacle in the way that would prevent them from completing the task they wanted to do, a dead end on top of an already dead end. There was a large stone that had been placed at the entrance of the tomb and the presence of the stone gave rise to this deflating question that the women asked themselves in the beginning of verse 3, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb." The women had prepared for everything. They had purchased the spices needed to anoint the body of Jesus ahead of time, they knew that the intense Palestinian heat would make their job more difficult by causing the body to sweat and stink, so they prepared in advance for that by arriving at the tomb



in the cool of the early morning. The women had seemingly prepared for everything. But the stone was an obstacle that they hadn't prepared for, nor were they equipped to deal with. The very nature of the question they ask who will remove, rather than how will we remove, seems to suggest that the women knew that dealing with this stone was something beyond their strength.

This is the very challenge of life; you can prepare all that you want to, draw up detailed plans, but life has a way of placing obstacles in your path that you can't prepare for and that you are not equipped to handle. You can prepare for your financial future planning for financial freedom and stability, but no one ever prepares for the day that you lose your job and run out of savings. Your preparations for spending a lifetime together can be deterred by the unexpected obstacle of divorce or death. Our plans are no guarantee that we will be prepared for any and all obstacles that we will face in life. There is no way to plan and prepare for life's dead ends.

But even in times that life hits us with obstacles and dead ends that we are not prepared for, know that God can still meet you with a miracle. Knowing that the stone that lay in front of the tomb was a dead end to their intended plans, not knowing if there would be anyone there to help them with their efforts to remove the stone, the women decide to do something remarkable they continue to the tomb anyway. They

don't know who or how, but they walk in faith believing there is a way. And often God reserves his greatest miracles for those who continue in faith despite the obstacles that they believe stand in their way.

Sometimes what determines whether or not we will see God move in our life, what controls whether or not we receive the blessing or the miracle that we are asking God for, is our determination to move forward in spite of the obstacles that stand in our way.

There is an old legend of a benevolent king who had his men place a great heavy stone on a certain roadway over which all his subjects would be forced to travel. The stone was so large that it was impossible to navigate around, and the citizens of the land would be left with one of two decisions, either they could turn around and take a more indirect route to their destination or they could struggle to try to move the stone. The king then hid himself to see what his subjects would do when they encountered the stone. One by one people came to the stone and, intimidated by its size and perceived immovability, they turned around, often cursing loudly and blaming the king for not keeping the roadway clear. Finally, a poor peasant farmer on his way to town with a load of vegetables to sell in the marketplace for a profit to feed his family, came to the blocked roadway. In haste, he laid down his load and with considerable effort and loss of time he managed to move the great stone to the side of the roadway. Then, turning to leave, the farmer saw a purse which had been place under the stone. When he opened the purse and found it to be filled with pieces of gold, and a note from the king indicating that it was to be the property of the one who would removed the stone.

And for those of us who determine to move forward who won't turn back because of the obstacles that lie ahead, if you just press on, if you just push through you will discover that God has a miracle and a blessing on the other side. The threat of a potential obstacle should not challenge our faith or cause us to turn around, there is a blessing for those who are determined to move forward in spite of the obstacles that we may encounter.

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

For those of us who continue to pray day after day even when we don't see any tangible results; stay in a troubled marriage even when our spouse gives no indication that they will ever change; continue to serve without experiencing the results of our service, keep walking in faith believing that God is and that He rewards those who earnestly seek him (Hebrews 11:6).

"Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

The Good News: With each sunrise, God teaches you that He is great and that He can guide you through the darkness of the night.
