

A Word from the Pastor "Healing"

1 JOHN 1:9

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. (NIV)



n 1 John 1:9 John the beloved apostle extols the virtue of confession. Confession is important in the Christian life in that it opens up the possibility of forgiveness; confession means that potentially our sins can be dealt with, but it doesn't guarantee it.

Imagine if it was that easy that in life and in love and in law that all you had to do was admit that you did something wrong and then all would be pardoned.

"Yes, officer I was doing seventy in a school zone."
"Ok, you confessed; you are now free to go without a ticket.

"Baby I just wanted to let you know that I lost our life savings and the kids college tuition betting on the Jets to win a game."

"So long as you admitted it, that's all-right Sweetie."

"Boss, I didn't do the project that you told me to do, I was out this weekend and I didn't feel like finishing."

"You didn't? That's perfectly fine. Your job is safe."

If only it were that easy! The act of confessing doesn't exonerate us in life. The judge might reduce your sentence, but he won't suspend it. Likewise, your mere confession doesn't secure your forgiveness with God either. Now I am not saying that confession is of no value in the Christian life; confession is one of the chief spiritual disciplines. We should all be in the practice of confessing the same way we are in the practice of sinning, daily and continually. But confession, opening up to God

about our behavior, being honest with God about what we have done, only allows for the possibility of forgiveness. For John, our forgiveness is not rooted in the power of our confession, but the character of God. The real reason behind our forgiveness is God's faithfulness and His righteousness.

In the second part of verse 9 John describes God as faithful and just. God is faithful because he keeps his promises. *Psalm 145:13 says, The Lord is trustworthy in all he promises and faithful in all he does.* God's righteousness is His justice; He does not let sin go unpunished.

On the surface, a faithful and just God seems incompatible with a forgiving God because if God were just, he would punish us for our sins. That is why the cross becomes so important. On the cross, God judged Jesus for the sins you and I committed. We are guilty of the crime; Jesus received the judgment.

Confession opens the door to forgiveness; God forgives because of who He is. John says that there are two things that happen as a result of God's character after we confess. The first is that our debt is cancelled, that is what it means to forgive. In the ancient world when you were in debt to someone that carried legal obligations, they actually carried papers on you that said you owe them money. And when the debt was paid off, the paper was thrown up or burned. Never to go back to. When God forgives, he tears up the paper of our sin. Which means He forgets completely our offense.

Isaiah 43:25 says "I, even I, am He who blots out your transgressions, for my own sake, and remembers your sins no more."

In "A Forgiving God in an Unforgiving World," Ron Lee Davis retells the true story of a priest in the Philippines, a much-loved man of God who carried the burden of a secret sin he had committed many years before. He had repented but still had no peace, no sense of God's forgiveness. In his parish, was a woman who deeply loved God and who claimed to have visions in which she

spoke with Christ and He with her. The priest, however, was skeptical. To test her he said, "The next time you speak with God, I want you to ask Him what sin your priest committed while he was in seminary." The woman agreed. A few days later the priest asked, "Well, did God visit you in your dreams?"

"Yes, he did," she replied.

"And did you ask him what sin I committed in seminary?"

"Yes."

"Well, what did he say?"

"He said, 'I don't remember.""

APPLICATION

As we approach Christmas, reflect on this from the Abundant Life Study Book, Lesson 3—Faith and Forgiveness. "About 2,000 years ago an angel appeared to a man called Joseph and told him that his fiancée, the virgin Mary, would give birth to a baby. The angel said: You are to give him the name Jesus, because He will SAVE his people from their sins. Matthew 1:21." Later in the lesson we read, "It is very important for you to understand clearly the greatness of God's forgiveness. The forgiveness of your sins which Jesus obtained for

you through His death on the cross is complete. Think about this wonderful truth: God forgives all the sins of the one who puts his (or her) faith in Jesus."

Acts 10:43—Everyone who believes in him (Jesus) receives forgiveness of sins."
