PASTOR'S DEVOTIONAL



1 Samuel 15:34 - 35

Then Samuel left for Ramah, but Saul went up to his home in Gibeah of Saul. ³⁵ Until the day Samuel died, he did not go to see Saul again, though Samuel mourned for him. And the LORD regretted that he had made Saul king over Israel.

1 Samuel 16:1—The LORD said to Samuel, "How long will you mourn for Saul, since I have rejected him as king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and be on your way; I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem. I have chosen one of his sons to be king."







Saul for his partial obedience, we find Samuel mourning the rejection of Saul. And when we meet Samuel again in 1 Sam. 16:1 we find Samuel in the same place where we left him, mourning for Saul. We don't know how long Samuel was in that place, but however long it was it was too long for God. God's question to Samuel at the opening of verse 1, suggests that Samuel had been mourning the loss of Saul for a considerable time. So much so that Samuel's mourning had become a pattern of behavior.

The word for mourning in verse 16:1 doesn't just speak of the emotional state of grieve, it refers to the observation of mourning rites. In ancient Israel when someone suffered a loss usually associated with a death, they would put on mourning clothes and cover their faces with dust, as an indication to the people around them that they were in a state of mourning. That is what Samuel had done for Saul. Samuel had returned home put on sackcloth, covered his face in ashes, and would spend all day crying over Saul.

But even when mourning the death of a loved one, there was an expected period for observing these mourning rites. And the fact that God asks Samuel "how long will you mourn for Saul," suggests that this period had long since passed. Samuel is mourning Saul longer alive than he would have had Saul died. That's how painful it can feel when we have to separate from some people, it can feel just like or worse than if they had died.

Miss Havisham is a wonderful character in Charles Dickens' novel, "Great Expectations." I personally think her one of the greatest characters in all of literature. Miss Havisham was born to a wealthy family and after her father died when she was only a teenager, she inherited his great wealth. As an adult she fell in love with a man named Copeyson. Copeyson proposed and Miss Havisham accepted but on her wedding day, while she was still dressing, at twenty minutes to nine, she learned that her fiancé had left her at the altar. Miss Havisham had all the clocks in her mansion stopped at that exact point in which she learned of her betrayal. She never moved on; she never let go.

When Miss Havisham is introduced, Dickens describes her wearing a stained yellow dress, the wedding gown she never took off since the day of her supposed wedding. She only wears one shoe because she was in the process of getting dressed and there is a rotten molded wedding cake left uneaten on the table. She was still a teenager when she was left at the altar, Dickens never says how old she is and in the book, but she is described as a skeleton with moving eyes. That's how paralyzing and painful the experience of a relationship ending can be, it can hurt just as much as having that loved one pass away. And because of his pain, Samuel is on the verge of becoming an ancient version of Miss Havisham.

But when God comes to Samuel in his state of mourning, God doesn't come to comfort Samuel. He comes instead to confront Samuel. 1 Samuel chapter 16:1 is God's challenge to Samuel to take off his grieving clothes, wash his face, go from his place of mourning and move into a new place of service to God. Because God has rejected Saul, the relationship between the two men is ended. God's expectation for Samuel is he must move on. And God carries that same expectation for us. We may not openly mourn the loss of a friend or partner the way Samuel did, but we can hold on to their memory to such an extent that we remain stuck and unwilling to

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move on from our place of inactivity. It is inappropriate for God to reject someone in our life, for God to say no, and for us to continue to mourn that relationship without moving on.

I know. I have been there where I have established a relationship with someone, grown to care about someone, and for reasons known to him alone and sometimes for reasons known to both of us, God has removed that person from my life. God has said no to any continued relationship between me and that person. Leaving me at times empty and angry because I gave of my time, my resources, my energies, and of myself to that relationship that did not turn out like I wanted. And when that does happen, the thing to do is not continuously grieve the loss but to move on. Because if God is sovereign over your life, he also has to be sovereign over all your relationships as well. You may have wanted the relationship to go another way, you may have wanted a different outcome, and God may have said yes for a season in your life, but when God says no to someone, get your cry on, grieve, and mourn, if you have to, but then move on.

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT



ike Miss Havisham, are you holding on to a relationship that has ended. Have you been grieving the loss of that relationship for a long

time? Don't allow the loss to kill your joy anymore. Let God, in His sovereignty, give you peace; and purpose in your heart to "wash your face, go from your place of mourning and move into a new place of service to God."
