Big Picture Question: How many gods are there? There is one true God who alone deserves worship.

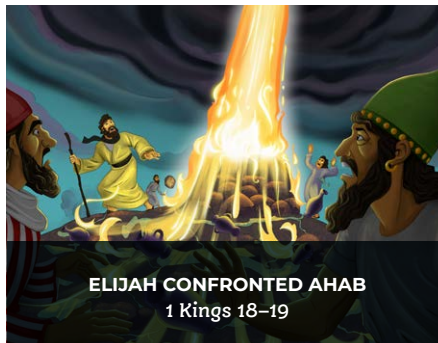

UNIT 14 - THE NORTHERN KINGDOM

As a result, God judged Israel’s idolatrous sin by allowing the nation of Assyria to destroy the Northern Kingdom.

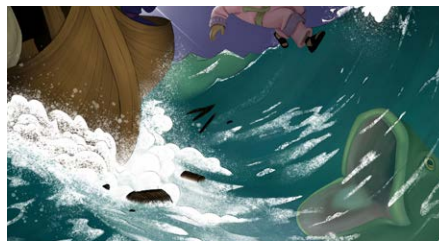
Big Picture Question: Why do Christians continue to sin? Christians continue to sin because we still have a sin nature, but when Jesus returns, He will make us sinless like Him.

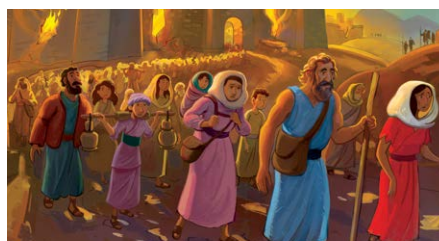

UNIT 15 - THE SOUTHERN KINGDOM
