September 21, 2025

President John Nyquist called the meeting to order at 12:23 PM.

Pastor Sean Motley shared a devotion and invited all council members to share how each person has seen Jesus moving in his or her life recently.

SECRETARY REPORT - John Nyquist moved to approve the June 2025 council meeting minutes, 2nd by Sue Ulmer and the motion carried.

TREASURER REPORT -Cindy Jevons shared the May, June and July financial statements. Cindy Jevons moved to accept the March, April, May, June and July financial statements, 2nd by Diann Ohman and the motion carried.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY REPORT - No report

STEWARDSHIP & FINANCE - Dan Rustmann reported that every Board has submitted a budget for their board except Church properties at this time, and that the Board will start working on the entire church budget. Dan further reported there have been some new members that have indicated interest in joining the Board, and that the Board continues to consider putting together a time and talent questionnaire for the congregation.

CHURCH PROPERTIES - Pastor Sean Motley reported that the church maintenance person has now retired. One water heater is in need of service.

EVANGELISM - Patrick Quinlan shared a summary of key materials for Grow 300 to the Council, which is to be shared to each of the Boards, for review and welcomed any input from the Council.

SOCIAL ACTION - Diann Ohman reported that the sock drive has started and will continue until the beginning of October. The food drive for Christmas will start October 11 and run through November 20. Diann further shared that Grosse Pointe Memorial Church will be involved with a Furniture Bank event at G.P. South H.S. on October 25 from 10 AM-1 PM for anyone that has furniture to donate.

FELLOWSHIP - Rose Bush reported continuing birthdays celebrated during the last Sunday of month at coffee hour. There will be a Senior Luther League event on October 2 on Visiting Italy, Fall Fest on October 19, Thanksgiving Eve pie social, Carol-A-Long on December 7 and another Senior Luther League event on December 18, a Christmas party with a white elephant gift exchange.
