Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I was speaking with someone recently about how sometimes evil speaks to us in a way that may be soothing or comforting or may even sound like God. When I was in the hospital with covid pneumonia, and things were not looking good, in my head I heard a voice saying, "It's okay, you've worked hard, you've done what you could do, it's okay to let go. You've done well, you're tired and worn, and you don't want to go back into the battles. You've earned the right to go home," (meaning a heavenly home).

I heard this voice, I had heard the voice of the doctor saying I was probably going to die, and I thought, "yes that's right, I've worked hard, I am worn out, I can just let go and be done." The problem was the voice was not the voice of God. I don't know where that voice came from, somewhere not good, it was telling me to give up, to let myself be silenced, but that wasn't God's voice. I know that because that night, immediately before I was transferred to the ICU because I was seemingly going downhill and picking up speed, a woman came into the room to clean the floor, take out the trash and clean and to be God's voice, to speak God's word to me. Because what I really needed was to hear God speak, to hear His word.

She quoted Scripture, she spoke truth and made sure I was listening by repeatedly asking me, "Ain't that right pastor?" Over and over she beat me with God's word, in a loving way, and told me that I needed to listen, to listen to God. If God had not placed her there in that moment, I very likely would not be here in this one.

Why be better prepared to share the hope that is in us through Christ? Or as Peter writes: Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you. (1 Peter 3:15) Why must we share the good news, witness to God's work in our lives, tell others about the beauty of God's grace, invite others to be a part of our family? Because we never know when that might save a life, when that might pull someone from despair, when the good news might just sink in for the first time in someone's life and change their life forever. We never know when we're the one God sent to this person because He wanted them to hear Him.

I don't know that woman's name, but she was a messenger from God, an angel. She heard God call her, send her, and she shared the word, she shared her faith.

I have heard so many amazing stories of God's work in the lives of His people here and I want to encourage you to share those with others. I have witnessed so much faithful caring, giving and loving, and I want to again encourage you to share this with everyone. You are a gift that God has placed here, you are a gift that is needed in my life, the life of our brothers and sisters in Christ, and in the lives of those who simply have never seen or understood or experienced the beauty of God's grace.

Share the hope, share the good news and let your light shine.

Remember, a new, warm pair of socks is the best defense against frozen tootsies!




