CROSSING THE JORDAN: THE PROMISED [AND

BIBLE BASIS:

Joshua 3-4

KEY VERSE:

Psalm 105:5

BIG IDEA:

God wants us to remember all of the great things He has done for us.

SMALL GROUP GUIDE

CROSSING THE JORDAN: THE PROMISED LAND

OPENING QUESTION:

Can you recall a meaningful milestone or "crossing" moment in your life? How did that experience shape you or your faith?

- Joshua 3-4 (NIV)
- Psalm 105:5 (NIV) "Remember the wonders he has done, his miracles, and the judgments he pronounced"

- God goes before us and makes a way, even when obstacles seem impossible.
- 2. God calls us to step out in faith, trusting in His promises.
- God desires that we remember and celebrate His mighty works in our lives.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- What "Jordan Rivers" are you facing in your life right now, and how might God be leading you to trust Him?
- 2. Read Joshua 3:15-17. How did the Israelites demonstrate faith, and why was stepping into the water significant?
- 3. What are some practical ways we can "set up stones of remembrance" today to remind ourselves and others of God's goodness?
- 4. How can sharing our stories of God's faithfulness impact others in our church or community?
- 5. What is one area where you want to remember God's past faithfulness to give you courage for something new?

KEY TAKEAWAYS:

- 1. God is faithful to lead His people into new seasons and challenges.
- Stepping out in faith often requires us to move before we see God's provision.
- 3. Marking spiritual milestones is vital for our own growth and future generations.
- 4. Remembering God's works helps us strengthen our trust in Him.
- Sharing what God has done encourages and builds up the whole community.

- Reflect this week on one area where God has brought you through; write down what you learned.
- 2. Memorize Psalm 105:5 (NIV) and recite it when facing challenges.
- 3. Pair up with a group member to share stories of God's faithfulness and pray for one another's current challenges.
- 4. Set aside time as a group or individual for thanksgiving prayer, remembering what God has done.
- 5. Brainstorm together a way to visibly "mark" or celebrate a recent victory or answer to prayer as a reminder to share with others.

THE JUDGES: DEBORAH

BIBLE BASIS:

Judges 4-5

KEY VERSE:

Psalm 145:3

BIG IDEA:

God is sovereign and worthy of our praise.

SMALL GROUP GUIDE

THE JUDGES - DEBORAH

OPENING QUESTION:

Can you think of a time when someone unexpected made a big difference in your life or community? How did that impact you?

- Judges 4–5
- Psalm 145:3 (NIV)

- 1. Even in times of chaos, God raises up unlikely leaders.
- 2. Deborah's courage and faith point us to God's sovereignty.
- 3. God alone deserves our praise for victories and deliverance.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1. When have you seen God use someone you wouldn't expect to make a positive impact? How did that affect your faith?
- What do Judges 4 and 5 reveal about Deborah's character and leadership style? How did her faith influence those around her?
- 3. In what situations do you find it hard to trust God's sovereignty? How can Deborah's story encourage you in those times?
- 4. Why is praise important after a victory or answered prayer? How does Psalm 145:3 (NIV) reinforce this?
- 5. What is one area this week where you can intentionally recognize and praise God's hand at work?

KEY TAKEAWAYS:

- 1. God often works through unexpected people and situations
- 2. Faith, obedience, and courage open the way for God's power.
- 3. True leadership points others back to God.
- 4. After every victory, our response should be praise.
- God's greatness is beyond our understanding—He is always worthy
 of praise (Psalm 145:3 NIV: "Great is the Lord and most worthy of
 praise; his greatness no one can fathom.").

- Identify one challenge where you can choose trust over fear this
 week
- 2. Memorize Psalm 145:3 (NIV) and reflect on what it means daily.
- 3. Partner with someone in your group to pray for bold faith, like Deborah.
- Set aside five minutes each day to praise God, regardless of circumstances.
- Find a way to serve or support someone who might be unnoticed or underestimated in your community.

THE JUDGES: GIDEON

BIBLE BASIS:

Judges 6-7

KEY VERSE:

Psalm 115:1

BIG IDEA:

God is great, so we should give Him all the glory.

SMALL GROUP GUIDE

THE JUDGES: GIDEON - GIVING GOD THE GLORY

OPENING QUESTION:

Can you think of a time when someone else received credit for something you did, or when you had to set aside your own pride for the good of a team or family? How did you feel in that moment?

- Judges 6–7
- Psalm 115:1 (NIV)

- 1. Gideon's humble beginnings and God's unlikely choice
- 2. God's plan to reduce Gideon's army to show His power
- 3. Victory belongs to God, so all glory goes to Him

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1. When have you felt unqualified or inadequate, like Gideon? How did God use you in that situation?
- Read Judges 7:2 (NIV). Why did God want to reduce the number of soldiers with Gideon, and what does that reveal about God's character?
- 3. How can we practically give God the glory in our daily lives, especially in seasons of success?
- 4. What are some ways pride or self-reliance can get in the way of honoring God's work?
- 5. This week, what is one area where you need to step back and let God receive the credit, even if it's hard?

KEY TAKEAWAYS:

- God intentionally chooses unlikely and ordinary people so His greatness will shine through.
- Our limitations do not limit God—His power is made perfect in our weakness.
- True success is measured by God's work, not personal achievement.
- Giving God the glory keeps our hearts humble and focused on His purposes.
- 5. "Not to us, Lord, not to us but to your name be the glory, because of your love and faithfulness" (Psalm 115:1 NIV).

- Identify a recent success or answered prayer and intentionally thank God for it publicly this week.
- 2. Memorize or meditate on Psalm 115:1 (NIV).
- 3. Share with your accountability partner one area where you struggle to give God the glory, and ask for support.
- 4. Dedicate time each day this week to prayer, specifically asking God to increase your humility and awareness of His work.
- 5. Look for a way to serve others this week where your name is not at the front—do something anonymously or that gives God all the credit.

THE JUDGES: SAMSON

BIBLE BASIS:

Judges 13-16

KEY VERSE:

James 1:19-20

BIG IDEA:

God loves righteousness and wants us to control our anger.

SMALL GROUP GUIDE

THE JUDGES: SAMSON - CONTROLLING OUR ANGER

OPENING QUESTION:

Think about a recent situation that made you angry. How did you react, and what was the outcome?

- Judges 13–16
- James 1:19-20 (NIV)

- Samson was chosen by God but struggled with self-control, especially in the area of anger.
- 2. Unchecked anger led Samson to make poor decisions with serious consequences.
- 3. God's desire is for us to pursue righteousness and control our anger.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- In what ways do you relate to Samson's challenges with anger or self-control?
- 2. According to James 1:19-20, why is it important to be "quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry"?
- 3. What practical strategies can help us control our anger before it controls us?
- 4. How can your past responses to anger be opportunities for growth in your faith and relationships?
- 5. What steps will you take this week to invite God into your moments of frustration or anger?

KEY TAKEAWAYS:


- 1. God calls us to a higher standard than our emotions.
- 2. Anger left unchecked can disrupt God's plans for our lives.
- 3. True strength comes not from physical power, but from surrendering our impulses to God.
- 4. Righteousness is seen in our ability to listen and seek self-control.
- 5. With God's help, our weaknesses can become testimonies of His grace.


- Identify one area where you tend to struggle with anger, and ask God for help daily in this area.
- 2. Memorize James 1:19-20 (NIV): "Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires."
- Partner with a group member for encouragement and accountability about anger this week.
- 4. Commit to praying before reacting when frustration arises.
- 5. Find a way to bless someone you've felt angry toward, demonstrating the love and self-control God calls us to.
