FROM OUR PASTOR

To my CrossPoint family,

Every year at this time, we as a community pause, look back with gratitude, and look ahead with expectancy.

I REMAIN IN AWE OF WHAT GOD HAS DONE OVER THE PAST YEAR—WE'VE SEEN A MOVE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT IN SO MANY WAYS.

We've seen more than 50 people choose to follow Jesus, 68 baptisms, a whole church initiative through GPS (to discover and activate God's purposes in our lives through our Gifts, Passions, and Story), and record growth in our NextGen sports camp, CrossPoint Communities, financial generosity, and attendance in our weekend gatherings.

These are just a few of the ways we are seeing God move among us as a community that is helping people trust and fully follow Jesus.

This year, I keep coming back to a picture: a sailboat.

Our calling as a church is a lot like building a sailboat. We design and strengthen the structure. We invest in the crew. We set the sails in the direction we sense the Spirit desires for us to go. All of this takes intentional prayer, sacrifice, effort, and strategy.

However, no matter how well we build, a sailboat cannot move without the wind.

That's why we remain utterly dependent on the Spirit of God and founded on the Word of God. The Holy Spirit is the wind in our sails. Without him, our efforts stall. But with the Holy Spirit, we are carried into places we could never reach on our own.

This past year the Holy Spirit has clearly put wind in our sails. There has been cultivation—crafting the structure, preparing the ship, and setting the sails. In the year ahead, we will continue in this work, along with expectant expansion—watching where the Spirit is already moving and joining him.

I'm grateful for the way you, CrossPoint family, have prayed, served, given, and engaged. Let's keep building faithfully, setting the sails boldly, and trusting the Spirit to lead us forward into God's future.

Each time **Jena** walks to the front of the Worship Center to pray with people on a Sunday morning, she recognizes the significance of her service. "I've always had a heart for prayer," she says. "It's a blessing to pray with and for other people."

Our Sunday morning prayer team is just one of the many ways we live out our discipleship priority of **LIFE AS PRAYER.** We want to be a people who practice prayer as a lifestyle, both individually and corporately.

"PRAYER IS THE WAY TO CONNECT WITH GOD," SAYS JENA. "WE SEE THAT AT CROSSPOINT THROUGH 24/7 PRAYER, FREEDOM PRAYER, HOUSE OF PRAYER, IN OUR COMMUNITIES, PRAYER TEAM ON SUNDAYS—IT'S IMPORTANT IN ALL THOSE VENUES."

That commitment to prayer had a direct impact on a teenager named **Leah** this year. She started attending CrossPoint after an invitation from a friend, and her curiosity and hunger for Jesus grew. She participated in 24/7 Prayer, and within the same week came to House of Prayer, where she experienced the move of the Spirit and responded by putting her trust in Jesus for the first time.

Leah chose to get baptized on Easter Sunday—where her older brother witnessed the life transformation in his sister, heard the gospel message, and responded by saying yes to Jesus!

It's amazing what prayer can do, isn't it? And while we all find ourselves praying during life's crisis moments, followers of Jesus can experience an abundant life through regular, daily, ongoing prayer.



It's exciting to watch adults experience transformation as they encounter Jesus. But it's extra fun when kids and teens grow in their faith as they pursue and engage in our discipleship priority of being **GUIDED BY THE SCRIPTURES**.


"Before I started coming to Middle School Academy," one student says, "I never really opened my Bible, and now I read it every single day, which is awesome—I wanted to do that more. Now I tell my mom I really want to and look forward to going to church on Sundays, whereas before this, I used to dread coming because I thought it was boring. But now I like it because I get to come and worship God."

As followers of Jesus, we want to order our lives from the truth in God's Word, teaching and building up the body of Christ with God-given wisdom.

WHEN THAT FOUNDATION IS BUILT DURING CHILDHOOD OR ADOLESCENCE, IT'S AMAZING TO SEE WHAT HAPPENS.

"In our experience with other churches we've attended or visited over the years, it was often difficult for our boys to feel comfortable or excited about going to church," **Jeremy** says. "That's why it's been such a gift to see the complete change in them since coming to CrossPoint. From day one, they've been excited to attend kids' worship, connect with their friends in class, and genuinely look forward to Sunday mornings.

"As parents, that brings us so much comfort and joy—to know our kids are not only being cared for but also being discipled in a way that draws them closer to Jesus. We thank God for the kids ministry and the environment of love and intentionality you and your team have created."



God calls us to be the church—a group of Christ-followers who are experiencing transformation and renewal through the Spirit, who redeems, sanctifies, and heals. And as part of the shared pursuit of our discipleship priority to be **EMPOWERED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT**, our worship team added a new service opportunity this past year that you probably haven't heard about: presence coach.

"My primary responsibility is to help team members develop a deeper understanding of God's presence, both individually and collectively, as they lead us in worship," says **Polly,** one of our presence coaches.

"It involves learning to discern the Holy Spirit, worship with authenticity, and lead in a way that invites the congregation to have a profound encounter with God."

Rebecca, another one of our presence coaches, echoed those sentiments.

"EACH PERSON ON THE TEAM IS A WORSHIP LEADER. WORSHIP IS BIRTHED IN OUR HEART FIRST. THE SACRIFICE OF PRAISE WE OFFER IS A VISUAL EXPRESSION THAT INSPIRES OTHERS TO DO THE SAME."

People talk to us about similar encounters with the Holy Spirit beyond the in-person services, including in our CrossPoint Communities, our serve teams, our ministry opportunities with local and global partners, and our online gatherings.

"I've noticed that during my prayer time with people, I just feel the Holy Spirit," says **Molly**, a host for our online services. "I think God can show up anywhere, at any time, through any media. I've seen that online, and I feel him growing my heart for others."



Followers of Jesus aren't called to live life alone. We're called to walk alongside each other in community—we're called to **RELATIONAL LIVING**. We are made for relationships, and we experience transformation through community in the family God is building. This happens as we gather in formative environments and engage in spiritual practices and the sacraments of baptism and communion.

A group on the Prairie lived out this priority through the birth of a CrossPoint Community with people from Winchester, Cottonwood, Culdesac, Grangeville, and Lewiston. The connection began during the spring session of Rooted, as they gathered for 10 weeks, shared their stories, and discovered the power of Jesuscentered community. Out of this group, a couple of people chose to trust and fully follow Jesus, and four people got baptized this summer!

THEY'VE BEEN CONNECTING WITH EACH OTHER THROUGH SENDING PRAYER REQUESTS, ENCOURAGING EACH OTHER, AND HELPING ONE ANOTHER THROUGH SOME ROUGH TIMES.

This is the kind of growth and multiplication we've been praying to see in our region, and we are excited to watch as more CrossPoint Communities are birthed. We believe everyone is called to be part of one of our communities, so if you haven't taken that step yet, we invite you to join us!

We also saw tremendous growth among our young adults with more than 50 people regularly gathering to seek authentic community, deeper relationship with Jesus, and a greater impact on the world. God is stirring something incredible in their lives, and we can't wait to see what happens in the coming months.



Pause for a moment and think about the ways God has blessed you, has met your needs, has provided for you. But let's be honest: You probably need more than just a moment to think of all the ways, right?

Here at CrossPoint, we have seen God's faithfulness again and again and again. And we also have witnessed a church family that has faithfully and consistently demonstrated **SACRIFICIAL GENEROSITY** throughout its history.

Whether it's people paying \$5 coal bills, selling land for pennies on the dollar, donating estates, joining together to pay off our mortgage, or mobilizing to fund missions and ministry, the generosity of thousands of people have laid a foundation for what CrossPoint is today—and what CrossPoint will become.

BECAUSE GOD IS THE ABUNDANT OWNER OF ALL THINGS, WE LIVE AS GENEROUS STEWARDS TO REFLECT THE GOODNESS OF GOD.

A few months back, a group of people from CrossPoint participated in a Journey of Generosity and explored what it means to lead truly generous lives.

"God has gifted us with resources—not just with money, but with our time, our effort, and even our conversations," says **Mark**, who was part of that pilot Journey of Generosity retreat. "We can be generous with all of those.

"Our culture says that what we have is ours, and that's not the biblical mandate. God has gifted us with all these resources, and it's just for a short time. It is a gift from God, and we are just stewards of it."



If you've been hanging out around CrossPoint for even just a few weeks, you've heard us talk about the importance of **COMMITTED SERVICE.** We believe it's essential to serve one another, our neighbors, and the nations.

"SERVING IS LIKE, 'OH I WANT TO HELP THESE PEOPLE,' BUT IN TURN IT ACTUALLY HELPS YOU," SAYS SYDNEY, WHO SERVED AT THIS YEAR'S SUMMER SPORTS CAMP.

Serving on a team is a stellar way to build relationships and feel connected, says **Bryson**, a drummer on our worship team.

"Playing for so many years and having so many people I've played with for these 13 years, that's helped us build chemistry and we can lean on each other and rely on each other well," he says. "And as the team has grown, it's really fun seeing the different backgrounds of people coming onto the team."

As more people serve, CrossPoint can have a greater impact, including through our Wellness Ministry. We want to help people experience spiritual, emotional, physical, and mental wellness through Stephen Ministry and Freedom Prayer.

That's why we loved seeing nine people go through our Stephen Ministry training at the beginning of 2025, discovering how to meaningfully walk alongside people experiencing loss, grief, and major life transitions. And our Freedom Prayer team continues to provide prayer sessions with individuals to help them address inner hurts and wounds, identify and break strongholds, and bring healing and freedom, all with the purpose of knowing God better.



Faith in action. The hope of Jesus. God's work of renewal. Love and acts of justice. Disciples who encounter the saving grace of Jesus. We want to be **DRIVEN IN MISSION** in everything we do here at CrossPoint.

"I CAN LIVE MY LIFE ON MISSION EVERY DAY JUST BY BEING A LIGHT FOR JESUS AND JUST BEING THERE FOR OTHER PEOPLE," SAYS KATY, "WHETHER IT'S AT WORK OR WITH MY FRIEND GROUP OR HERE AT THE CHURCH."

One of the ways **Katy** lives that out is through her involvement in our missions team, which supports local and global ministry partners. **Scott**, another member of that team, pointed to Matthew 28 and Jesus' call to make disciples of all nations.

"It's part of our commission as a church and as individuals," he says. "I enjoy seeing what God is going to do in the lives of people. You're part of God's mission."

As our church pursues that mission, we hear stories of transformation. This past year, a young adult came to CrossPoint having experienced relational difficulty. She took a step of faith to engage in Rooted and experienced powerful healing. Since then, she has stepped into serving and leading in several spaces around CrossPoint.

Another woman in our church knew about Jesus and had all the right "Christian" answers, but she had yet to experience the peace of Christ and fully surrender her heart to him. She encountered Jesus this year! She has since been baptized and continues to live in transformational community—a reminder of what God can do when we as a church stay focused on our mission.



Our lead pastor may be a former math teacher, but we won't be dropping algebra quizzes on a Sunday morning. (Whew!) When it comes to multiplication, however, we're huge fans here at CrossPoint.

We are committed to **INTENTIONAL MULTIPLICATION** because we want to make disciples who build the kingdom of God through developing and sending leaders, church multiplication, and investment in global missions.

SOMETIMES THAT MULTIPLICATION HAPPENS ON A PERSONAL LEVEL, LIKE THE TIME PETER INVITED SAM TO BE AN USHER.

"It was nice for **Peter** to recognize me and just have that insight about me—God gave it to him, for sure," **Sam** says. "My greatest joy is helping people, getting to know people, and just being able to help them in a worship experience. I just believe that we have to invest in people, and I just want to invest."

We're always encouraging people to be part of our multiplication by making the kind of invite **Peter** extended to **Sam.** In other areas this past year, we've strategically expanded the number of global ministry partners who are focused on planting churches in some of the most unreached areas in the world. We've seen CrossPoint Communities multiply, and we're praying for even more of it in the coming year.

And we're eager to see what God does in the lives of our teens and leaders who traveled to the LIFE Conference in Indianapolis this summer. Of the eight CrossPoint students who attended, five of them—yes, five!—are sensing a call into vocational ministry in the future. God's work is multiplying in the next generation!


