- What's one place you've visited (or lived) where you felt like a foreigner? How did that experience help you understand what it means to be a "citizen" of another place?
- Read Philippians 3:20-21.
 - What do you think Paul meant when he said, "Our citizenship is in heaven" to believers in Philippi, a
 Roman colony?
- In today's culture, what "passports" or identities compete with our allegiance to Jesus (political, national, racial, economic, etc.)? Which one do you personally wrestle with most?
- Jesus says in Matthew 6:33: "Seek first the Kingdom of God."
 - What does it practically look like for you to seek His Kingdom in your work, family, and daily decisions?
- Paul says we "await a Savior from there" (Phil. 3:20).
 - How does remembering Jesus' return anchor us in hope when the world feels chaotic?
- Where have you seen Christians confuse being citizens of the Kingdom with being citizens of a nation?

 How can we guard against that?
- Think about your own life this past week: what did your time, words, or money reveal about where your "citizenship" is?
- If someone asked you what it means to be a citizen of heaven, how would you explain it in a way that invites them into God's Kingdom?
- As a group, what's one practical way you can live as an outpost of the Kingdom this week—showing your community a glimpse of "heaven's culture" on earth?
