



1. What's one unfinished project, puzzle, or goal in your life that drives you crazy when it's incomplete? How does that feeling mirror the longing we have for the "finished" story God promises?
2. Read Revelation 21:1-5. This passage says God is "making all things new." How is that different from Him making "all new things"? Why is that distinction important?
3. Where in creation — or your own life — do you most long to see renewal? What does this longing reveal about the way God wired us?
4. The early church heard Revelation while suffering under Roman oppression. In what ways does the promise of renewal give strength to people walking through hardship today?
5. Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-4; 12-26. Paul compares resurrection to a seed becoming a tree.
  - a. What part of that picture stands out to you the most?
6. How does the truth of resurrection change the way you view:
  - a. Suffering?
  - b. Death?
  - c. Purpose?
  - d. Daily decisions?
7. What do you think you'll feel, think, or experience differently in your resurrected body?
  - a. What aspect of that hope means the most to you personally?
8. Read Romans 8:18-25. This passage says creation "groans" like a woman in labor.
  - a. Where do you see that groaning most clearly in our world today?
9. Victory doesn't mean ease — it means completion. Where do you need to be reminded that God will finish what He started in your life?
