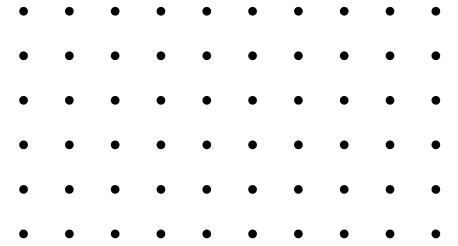

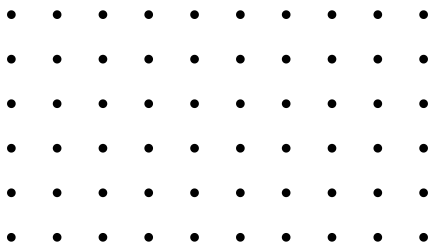


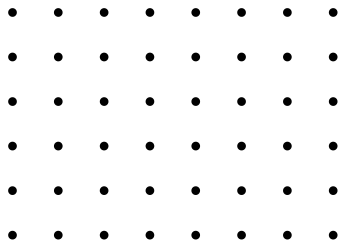
GENESIS 15

MEETING GUIDE

For use in 1 on 1
Discipleship Meetings





STEPS OF A DISCIPLESHIP MEETING!

Your time together should be around 1 hour to 1.5 hours.
Plan to meet at a consistent time weekly, or biweekly.

STEP 1: HAVE A GENERAL LIFE CHECK-IN!

How are you both doing...

1. Mentally/Emotionally
2. Physically
3. Relationally
4. Spiritually

Any Praise reports from last time?

STEP 2: PRAY OVER YOUR TIME TOGETHER

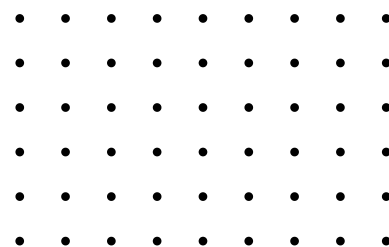
The opening prayer is a way for us to invite God into our time together, center our hearts on Him, and prepare ourselves for the discussions ahead. This is an opportunity to thank God for His presence, ask for His guidance and wisdom, and open our hearts to what He wants to teach us.

STEP 3: READ AND DISCUSS!

Read the scripture and go through the questions on the following page!

STEP 4: PRAY!

Discuss any prayer requests each of you might have, then pray over each other before leaving!





READ: GENESIS 15

QUESTIONS

1. How might our lives change if we truly believed that God is our shield, as He promised to Abram? What areas of our lives do we struggle to trust God with?
2. In what ways do we sometimes try to 'get ahead of God' in our lives, like Abram and Sarai did? How can we learn to stay behind God's shield?
3. How does understanding God's covenant with Abram (walking between the animals) impact our view of His faithfulness and commitment to us?
4. What are some modern-day equivalents to the 'smoking fire pot and flaming torch' that demonstrate God's presence and work in our lives?
5. How does the concept that salvation is entirely God's work challenge or comfort us? What implications does this have for our daily walk with God?
6. In what areas of your life do you struggle to see or understand God's work, like Abram did? How can we respond faithfully in times of uncertainty?
7. How does the idea that God upholds and accomplishes His own mission impact our understanding of our role in His plan?
8. What parallels can we draw between God's promises to Abram (protection, people, possession, pathway) and His promises to us today?
9. How might our approach to evangelism and ministry change if we truly believed that it is 'God who is working in you both to will and to work according to his good purpose' (Philippians 2:13)?
10. In what ways can we cultivate a deeper trust in God's timing and methods, even when His plans seem delayed or different from our expectations?
