## The question is...How do we suit up?

**Ephesians 6:10-20** answers that exact question!

"Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. **Put on the whole armor of God,** that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand."

"Stand therefore, having **girded your waist with truth**, having put on the **breastplate of righteousness**, and having shod **your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace**; above all, taking **the shield of faith** with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the **helmet of salvation**, and the **sword of the Spirit**, which is the word of God; praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints - and for me, that utterance may be given to me, that I may open my mouth boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains; that in it I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak."

- **1. The first thing to do is STAND** and put on the belt of truth. The Bible makes it clear throughout that we are in a battle. Be aware of this and acknowledge it. The battle is true, and isn't it interesting that we can't put on a belt sitting down?
- **2. Second, put your shoes on** that prepares you with the gospel of peace.
- **3. Take up your shield of faith** because you'll need it to stop the fiery accusations that come from the devil. He talks a lot of trash!
- **4. Guard your mind** & weaponize yourself with the Word of God. Satan knows the Word and has distorted it from the beginning. If you don't know what God has really said, you will be defeated.
- **5. Pray.** The Word says to pray without ceasing. You've got to listen for the Holy Spirit's prompting and direction. This is how we stay connected to our LORD.
- **6. Be watchful.** Sleep, but never allow your mind to think satan is sleeping. Before you go to sleep ask the Lord to keep watch over you through-out the night. When you awake, acknowledge God's presence as you start the day, suited up with the full armor of God. Stand, dressed in the strongest and finest armor, ready to fight the battle God has equipped you for.

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ: even as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blemish before him in love."

A boat ride on the Sea of Galilee helped me imagine Jesus walking on the stormy sea, and rescuing a frightened Peter as he began to sink.





## The Prodigal Daughter

I've always related to the story of the Prodigal Son. Not because I squandered my financial inheritance, but because I also left the protection of my (heavenly) Father and tried to make my own way.

"But when he was still a great way off, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and fell on his neck and kissed him."

Luke 15:20

When my first marriage ended in divorce, I found myself alone at 30 with two toddlers to raise. Afraid and desperate, I turned to the world and not to God for security. Making my own way resulted in a disastrous second marriage that also ended in divorce. But through it all, God loved me, never left me, and restored me. In 1995, He brought me Laddie -- the most incredible, godly husband, who raised my sons as his own and has been my earthly rock.

It's sometimes hard to forgive ourselves, even though we recognize God's forgiveness. Yet, like the Prodigal Son, when we turn to our Father and ask for forgiveness, the Word says the Lord is faithful and just to forgive our sins and cleanse us of all unrighteousness. The enemy knows this and loves to accuse and remind us of our failures.

At a women's retreat, I found myself hearing the enemy's accusations. As the speakers gave their testimonies, I suddenly felt I didn't belong. I left the room, found a solitary place, and poured out my heart to Jesus. I told Him that I felt my past made me "different" than the other women and I felt ashamed. At that moment, I clearly heard Him say: "That is who you were; this is who you are." Those words meant so much to me that I had "Beloved" in Hebrew tattooed on my inner wrist, as a constant reminder of His love and forgiveness.

# Instant Pot Kale Potato Soup

#### **Ingredients:**

- 3 carrots, peeled and sliced (~ 1+ cup)
- 2 celery ribs, chopped (~ 1+ cup)
- 2 cups Kale, de-stemmed, finely chopped
- 4 cloves Garlic
- 1 tsp Oregano, dried
- 1/2 tsp Parsley, dried
- 1/2 tsp Thyme, dried
- 1 White onion, diced (~ 2 cups)
- 2 lb. Yukon gold or red potatoes
- 3 1/2 cups Vegetable broth
- 1 squeeze Lemon juice, fresh
- 1 Salt and pepper to taste



#### **Directions:**

Assemble all ingredients in a Instant Pot or Slow Cooker and cook according to appliance directions for soup, at least 2 hours.

For added protein, a pound of cooked and crumbled sausage or diced chicken breast or thigh meat can be added once the soup is done.



# Pumpkin Spice Quick Bread

#### **Ingredients:**

1 ½ cup all-purpose flour

1 tsp baking soda

1 tsp ground nutmeg

1 tsp ground cinnamon

1 tsp ground cloves

1 tsp ginger or allspice

½ tsp baking powder

½ tsp salt

4 large eggs

1/2 cup white sugar

1/2 cup light brown sugar

½ tsp vanilla extract

1 can pumpkin (15-16 oz can)

1/2 cup vegetable oil

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Grease 2 loaf pans (or 4 mini loaf pans)

Combine left column of ingredients in a large bowl; mix well and set aside.

#### **Directions:**

Beat eggs, sugars, and vanilla extract in a large bowl on high speed until combined, about 1 minute or so. Beat in pumpkin and oil.

Add flour mixture and mix until batter is blended and smooth. Pour batter into the prepared loaf pans. Bake in the preheated oven until the top is dark brown and an inserted toothpick comes out clean.

Internal temperature when done is 190 degrees; will take from 50 to 70 minutes depending on loaf size.

Leave in pans to cool a few minutes. Cut larger loaves into 1" thick slices. ENJOY!


