

"A Letter to the Faithful" Small Group Discussion Guide

Small Group Discussion Guide: ONE — Paul's Letter to the Faithful (Ephesians) Based on the teaching by Pastor Todd Cullen.

Opening:

Begin with a short prayer asking God to open hearts and minds to understand His Word and grow in faithfulness and unity.

- 1. Getting Started: Setting the Context
- Who was Paul? Why was he writing to the church in Ephesus?
- What do you know about the church in Ephesus?
- Why do you think Paul emphasizes faithfulness and unity in this letter?
- 2. The Faithful People (Ephesians 1:1-2; 15-16)
- Paul greets the believers as "faithful." What does it mean to you to be faithful in Christ?
- How is faithfulness expressed not just personally but in community?
- Todd Cullen mentions that Paul "does not cease to give thanks" for them. How can we cultivate a similar attitude toward other believers?
- 3. Our Faithful God (Ephesians 1:3-10)
- How would you describe God's faithfulness based on these verses?
- What spiritual blessings has God given us through Christ? Which of these blessings stand out to you today?
- Why is it important to remember God's faithfulness when facing challenges?
- 4. Our Faithful Position in Christ (Ephesians 1:7-14)
- Paul talks about being chosen, predestined, adopted, redeemed, forgiven, etc. What stands out to you about the position God gives believers?
- The content mentions confusion about "chosen" and "predestined." How do you think we should handle theological mysteries like these?
- How can understanding our identity in Christ affect the way we live and treat others?
- 5. A Faithful Purpose (Ephesians 1:10; 1:15-23)
- What is the faithful purpose or mission God has given to the church?
- How does faithfulness relate to unity in the church? Why is unity essential to God's purpose?

- Todd emphasizes obedience over debating mysteries. Why might obedience be more important than complete understanding?
- How can we personally contribute to unity within our church or faith community?

6. Living as One Body (Ephesians 4:4-6)

- What does it mean practically to be "one body and one Spirit" called to "one hope"?
- How can we "stay together, both outwardly and inwardly," as The Message translation encourages?
- What challenges might you face in living out unity and faithfulness, and how can the group support each other?

7. Reflection and Application

- Reflect on the question: Are you currently living faithfully in your relationship with God and His people? What might God be calling you to change or improve?
- How can the group encourage each other toward greater faithfulness and unity this week?
- What practical step will you take this week to exhibit faithfulness or strengthen unity within the church?

8. Closing Prayer

Pray for faithfulness in God's people, unity in the church, and the courage to obey God's revealed will rather than getting caught up in divisive debates.

Optional Activity:

Invite group members to write down one way they feel God is calling them to be more faithful or more united with others and share if comfortable.
