BACKGROUND:

Children are a gift from God and He cares about how they are raised (*Psalm 127:3*; *Psalm 34:11*; *Proverbs 23:13-14*) Being a parent is one of the most challenging yet rewarding opportunities one will ever experience. Thankfully, God gives us instructions how to parent well. Last week Pastor Tom looked at *Ephesians 6:1-4* through the lense of how children should relate to their parents. This week Pastor Jason focuses on God's design for parenting.

DIGGING DEEPER:

- 1. Being a good parent is all about raising children who will follow your example in obeying and worshiping the Lord.
 - a. Children can learn a lot from direct teaching. They learn even more by observing and imitating others. How can parents model obedience and worship of the Lord for their children to imitate?
 - b. What kind of models were your parents? How did that affect your views on parenting?
- 2. Godly parents are to raise their children "in the discipline and instruction of the Lord."
 - a. How would you describe the difference between discipline and instruction?
 - b. Paul was intentional to combine discipline and instruction. How might this combination change a parent's view of their role?
 - c. God disciplines His children (*Proverbs 3:11; Hebrews 12:5*) and expects earthly parents to do the same (*Proverbs 23:13; Psalm 94:12*). How can disciplining our children conform them into the image of Christ?
- 3. Read Deuteronomy 6:7-9 and Proverbs 22:6
 - a. How can a parent's lifestyle, and lifetime of teaching, edify the child in their faith?
 - b. We don't always instruct alone. We also rely on others to teach our children about God. What are some Godly resources we can utilize to teach our children well?
 - c. How can you encourage your children that they serve and honor God by honoring you?

- 4. In both the Old and New Testaments, God makes it clear that His children are to honor their parents and care for them. This may include caring for our aging parents.
 - a. How does providing physical, spiritual and emotional support to our aging parents demonstrate God's love and grace to our own children?
 - b. As an adult child yourself, how can you honor your parents? (If your parents are deceased, how can you honor their memory and legacy?)
- 5. In Ephesians 6:4 and Colossians 3:21 Paul instructs fathers (parents) not to provoke their children.
 - a. To provoke means to arouse feelings of irritation, aggravation, or exasperation. What would be some reasons why parents should avoid provoking their children?
 - b. What behaviors by a parent can provoke a child to anger?
 - c. How has God demonstrated for us the type of parent He wants us to be?

TAKING IT HOME:

Psalm 127:3 reminds us that children are a "heritage from the Lord." God places them in families and gives parents guidance in how they are to be raised.

- a. What is your goal within parenting?
- b. What can you do as a parent to equip your children to know God and honor Him with their lives?
- c. If you have a strained, broken, or estranged relationship with your child, how can this group or we as a church be praying for you?
