a bit of a challenge, we are always sure to have lots of hands to help!


We were able to end the school year with a beautiful ap-

✓ Some things need done each day...no matter HOW CRAZY the day may start out or what lies ahead, start in His Word. Satan tried to steer me away today with the long list of "gotta dos" beginning the minute I woke up, but as I settled in and began devotions this morning, there's a peace that could only come from our Father! (Think that's what kept me from losing it today!!!)
