Wowza! What A Summer!

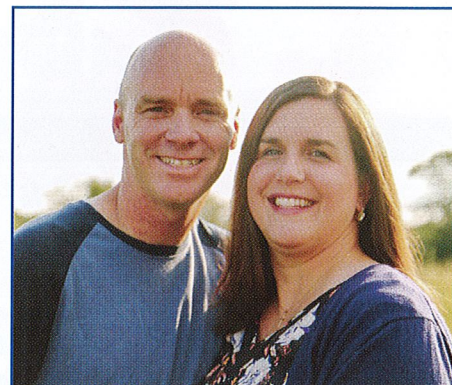
Life is neverending movement this summer.

TCCS. While Ezmae and Luke will be our only two at Tri-County this year. School starts in two to three weeks, and they are READY, and so am I.

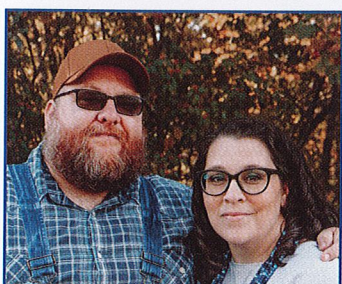

Shifting roles is keeping us very busy.

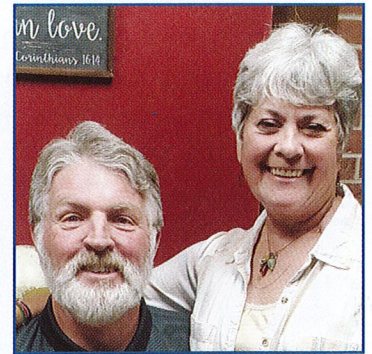
Dear Friends,

2. Norbert Kendrick, our Rural Postal Carrier, has been great at redirecting our mail from the box near Shiloh

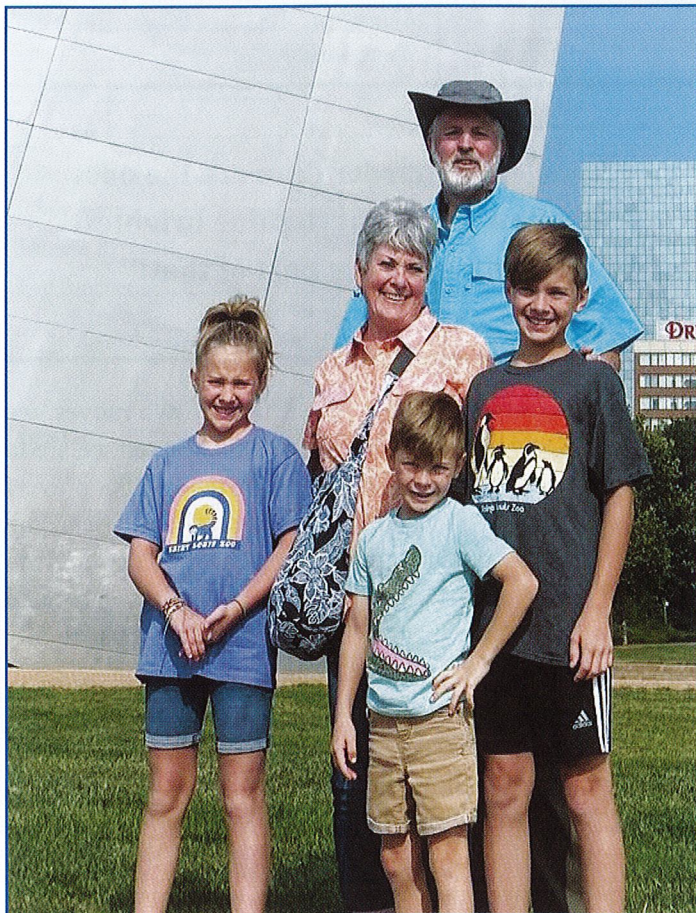

new house next door to us. Our boy Christopher has absolutely loved working with him through this process and has learned so much! He says he wants to be a contractor when

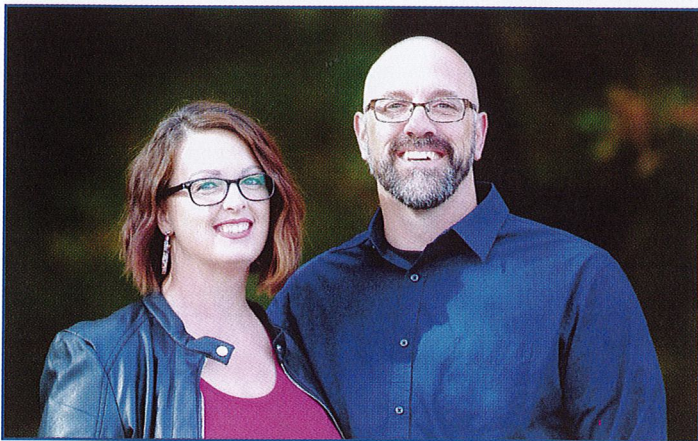

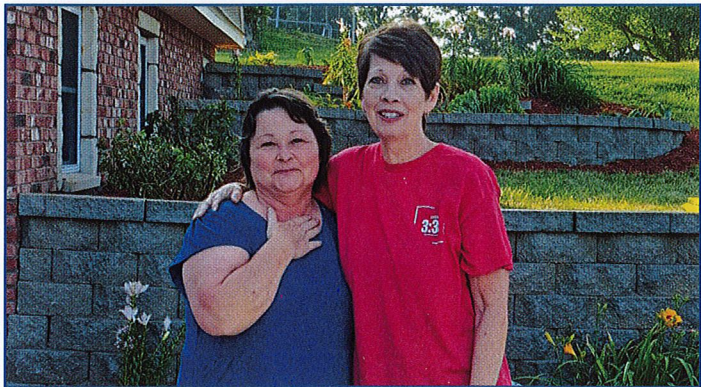

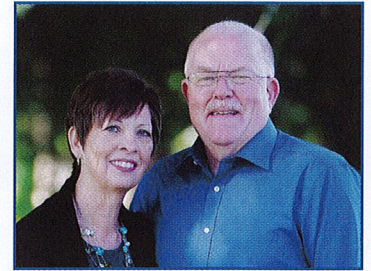
