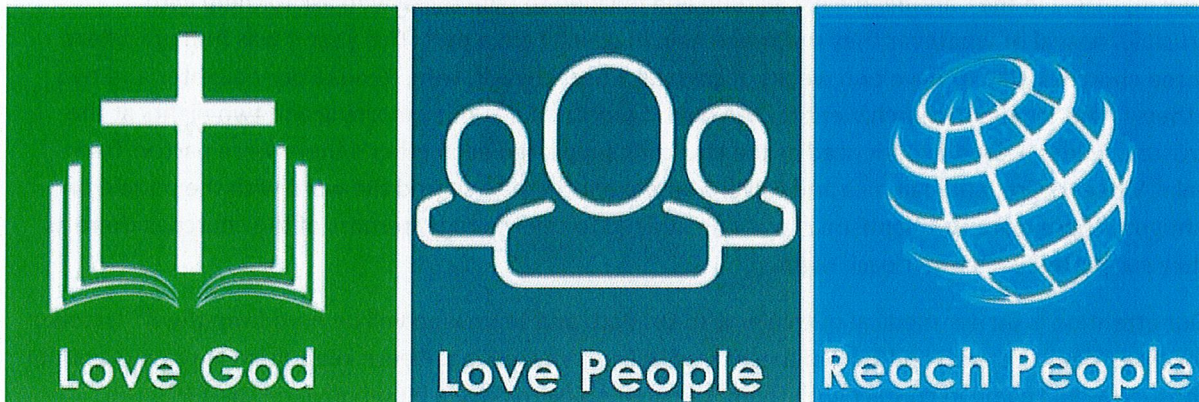


GUYANA MISSION

We are please to share few things God is doing here at Alness Revival Christian Church in Guyana.

On Mother's Day we saw forty-six (46) mothers out at fellowship and gifts were given to them and word of encouragement. The third Sunday is our women anniversary and they took the service to celebrate what God is doing for and through them. Its always a joy to see them gave themselves to the service of the Lord.

After years of not having VBS because of the cost the Fox Creek Christian Church youths led by Micah Mead came in July to help us return to it, which was from 7th---11th where we had one hundred and eleven children on the last day. We were not sure what the attendance would be after years of not having it. This showed us the children are looking forward for it. We have to see if we will do it again next year. The team did a fantastic job coping with the heat and teaching our children, our children were blessed.

The Friday night our children were introduced to camp fire which some adults went out too.

On the 27th July the women ministry had their second-year backpack drive. We continue to see the need of this ministry as the parents reached out to us to help them with backpack and stationary with help from Pastor Ian Taylor from Renew and Transform Ministries in Florida USA and Sis. Beryl Smith and family, we were able to give out close to three hundred children. We say a big thank you to them for allowing God to used them to help our people here.

If that was not all in August a team of seventeen came from New Hampshire for day came that started on the 6th-11th which was the first for us with that among of people. Some of the children from VBS were there and some older ones. It was a great ministry at the end we had five youths and an adult were baptized on the 12th August. We thank God for what He did through those teams that answered the called to come here and served, we can see it was rewarding.

After few years of not having Caribbean Christian Youth Convention this year it was returned in the Island of Barbados with youths from Guyana, Saint Vincent, Grenada and host Barbados. We had seven youths from our church went and took part with my wife Cynthia had to go because the parents would not have sent their children. From report it was a success and our youths were encouraged.

Few ministers in the Caribbean have a group and decided to help those who ask for help with crusade/revival or whatever they may need help in which I am a part. This year it was Antigua where three churches plan to have two weeks of crusade where myself, wife, Rennae our daughter and two others ladies from our church went for ten days. I preached a Sunday morning and two nights at the crusade. It was a good experienced as the churches supported each other's there were pastors from Saint Vincent, Grenada, Jamaica and Guyana who went there to shared the word with the people of Antigua. There were few baptisms. I was encouraged to see the togetherness of the churches there as they supported each other each night.

Our attention is on our medical outreach with Dr. Patti and team who will be here from the 8th October for three days outreach and special teaching with Bro. Wayne King. Please keep them in prayers and for those they will come in contact with them. We are hoping to have a blood drive on the 11th.

The women third conference on the 20th October with the main speaker Sis. Roseline Miller from Jamaica and her husband Pastor Theophilus will accompany her and will preach on the 19th. This conference is growing so we are expecting God to draw women closer to Him through this conference. Help us pray for this.

On the 26th October will be our harvest/thanksgiving service so we are expecting a great time and harvest of souls for this harvest.

Little about our family, Cynthia went to the doctor after experiencing some pain and went the tests were done she was told she has fibroid and should have surgery so we are praying for healing. Our daughter Rennae just finished her post-graduate degree in education from our University and our son Renako just started his second year at the University, I am hoping to have some time to relax and recharge after next as we will look into the new year.
