Commitment Time

<u>Receive</u> your request for membership at Cleveland First Baptist Church.

You may become a CFBC member in the following ways:

By Public Profession of Faith in Jesus Christ as your Savior and Lord, following Him in obedience by scriptural baptism by immersion.

By Baptism if you already have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ but have never been scripturally baptized by immersion and are willing to be baptized.

By Transfer of Membership if you already have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ, scripturally baptized by immersion, and are a member of another Southern Baptist congregation. We will contact your former church to arrange for the transfer of your membership.

By Statement of Faith that you have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ and have been scripturally baptized by immersion.

*By Watchcare: Individuals temporarily living in the area but who do not wish to transfer their church membership may come under the watchcare of CFBC. They will be extended the privileges of fellowship and participation in church activities but may not vote in business meetings or serve in positions that require church membership.

All candidates for membership will complete an "Application for Membership," indicating how they're coming (profession, baptism, transfer, statement). All requests for membership will be shared with the congregation at the end of the worship service, and all candidate names will be presented for church approval at a regularly scheduled business meeting.





No Matter What:

Committed Service to a Holy and Faithful God Part 8: "Removing the Trash to Reveal the Truth" (Nehemiah 4:10-14)

We've all heard the saying, "One man's trash is another man's treasure!" Is that always true—especially in our spiritual lives? Sometimes, what we casually toss aside—or worse, what we cling to—becomes the very thing that chokes our testimony and halts our progress for the Kingdom of God.

• The people cried, "There's so much <u>rubbish</u> we can't <u>rebuild</u> the wall" (Neh. 4:10).

How can we remove the trash to reveal the truth?

- 1. Recognize the **Rubbish** (Neh. 4:10).
 - "Let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us" (Heb. 12:1).
 - Spiritually, our "trash" may look like **guilt**, despair, **compromise**, busyness, or the idol of self-reliance.
- **2.** Confront the "<u>Trash Talk</u>" (Neh. 4:11-12).
 - "The weapons of our warfare are not of the <u>flesh</u>, but divinely powerful for the destruction of fortresses" and helping us to take "every thought captive to the <u>obedience</u> of Christ" (2 Cor. 10:4-5).
- 3. Empty the **Dumpster** (Neh. 4:13-14).
 - A) Confess and Repent (1 Jn. 1:9).
 - **B)** Realign Your **<u>Priorities</u>** (Matt. 6:33).
 - C) Renew Your Mind (Rom. 12:2).
 - **D)** Rebuild on the **Rock** (Matt. 7:24-25).
 - E) Resist the **Return** of Rubbish (Gal. 6:8-9).

Rubbish has no rightful place in God's building site—your heart, your home, your church. If you're still in the rubble of unbelief, still paralyzed by fear, Jesus Christ offers you a hand to pull you from the pit.

Let Christ "remove the trash to reveal the truth" today!
