You may become a CFBC member in the following ways:

By Public Profession of Faith in Jesus Christ as your Savior and Lord, following Him in obedience by scriptural baptism by immersion.

<u>By Baptism</u> if you already have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ but have never been scripturally baptized by immersion and are willing to be baptized.

By Transfer of Membership if you already have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ, scripturally baptized by immersion, and are a member of another Southern Baptist congregation. We will contact your former church to arrange for the transfer of your membership.

By Statement of Faith that you have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ and have been scripturally baptized by immersion.

*By Watchcare: Individuals temporarily living in the area but who do not wish to transfer their church membership may come under the watchcare of CFBC. They will be extended the privileges of fellowship and participation in church activities but may not vote in business meetings or serve in positions that require church membership.

All candidates for membership will complete an "Application for Membership," indicating how they're coming (profession, baptism, transfer, statement). All requests for membership will be shared with the congregation at the end of the worship service, and all candidate names will be presented for church approval at a regularly scheduled business meeting.



No Matter What: Committed Service to a Holy and Faithful God Pt. 12: "Standing Firm in the Truth (When Others Are Stretching It)" [Neh. 6:1-9]

When faced with the dastardly deeds and deception of his opposition, Nehemiah stood firm in the truth when others were stretching it! Stretching isn't so innocent, especially when it comes to the truth. Twisting words, bending facts, and rationalizing sin carry eternal consequences!

- "Standing firm": Refusing to change one's position, decision, or beliefs, especially when facing opposition.
- "Stretching the truth": Exaggerating or saying something that is not completely honest, especially to one's advantage.

The Context: Nehemiah's Opponents and His Response (6:1-9)

- **A.** Their <u>Strategy</u> (6:1–4): <u>Twisting</u> Nehemiah's faithful mission into a political conspiracy.
- **B.** Their **Temptation** (6:5–9): **Luring** Nehemiah to the plain (and temple) under the pretense of diplomacy.
- C. His **Response** (6:3, 8-9): **Praying**, refusing every diversion, and keeping his hands on the work, trusting God for strength.

Why the Truth Gets Stretched—and Why It Matters:

- * Sinful, Selfish **Ambition**: People warp facts to protect reputations (Prov. 28:1).
- * Fear and Intimidation: People twist the truth when they feel threatened (Ps. 31:13–15).
- * Spiritual Warfare: The devil is "the father of lies" (Jn. 8:44).

4 Ways to Stand Firm in the Truth When Others Are Stretching It:

- 1. <u>Anchor</u> Yourself in God's Word (Ps. 119:11, 160; Jn. 17:17).
- 2. Keep Your Eyes on the Mission (Prov. 4:25-27).
- 3. Clothe Yourself with Spiritual <u>Armor</u> (Eph. 6:10-18).
- 4. Pray for Wisdom and Boldness (Jas. 1:5; Josh. 1:9).

Will you be like Nehemiah—undaunted, unwavering, and unashamed? The world is filled with "Silly Putty theology"—truth stretched until it snaps back into dangerous distortion. However, God calls us to **stand firm in the truth**, keep our hands on His work, and trust His power to strengthen us.

Jesus didn't stretch the truth, but He stretched out His hands on the cross for you! Will you **stand in the truth**? No more bending. No more twisting. Stand unshakably in Christ today—no matter what!
