Commitment Time

It is our custom to sing a hymn of commitment at the close of each worship service. This time of "invitation" provides an opportunity to reflect upon the Bible message and make an appropriate personal commitment to the Lord. During this time, our pastors are available at the front to:

Pray with you regarding your commitment to Jesus Christ or another matter of personal concern.

<u>Counsel</u> with you regarding a challenging situation or decision you are facing, especially committing your life to Jesus Christ.

Encourage you as you seek to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord.

<u>Receive</u> your request for membership at Cleveland First Baptist Church.

You may become a CFBC member in the following ways:

By Public Profession of Faith in Jesus Christ as your Savior and Lord, following Him in obedience by scriptural baptism by immersion.

<u>By Baptism</u> if you already have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ but have never been scripturally baptized by immersion and are willing to be baptized.

By Transfer of Membership if you already have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ, scripturally baptized by immersion, and are a member of another Southern Baptist congregation. We will contact your former church to arrange for the transfer of your membership.

By Statement of Faith that you have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ and have been scripturally baptized by immersion.

*By Watch care: Individuals temporarily living in the area but who do not wish to transfer their church membership may come under the watch care of CFBC. They will be extended the privileges of fellowship and participation in church activities but may not vote in business meetings or serve in positions that require church membership.

All candidates for membership will complete an "Application for Membership," indicating how they're coming (profession, baptism, transfer, statement). All requests for membership will be shared with the congregation at the end of the worship service, and all candidate names will be presented for church approval at a regularly scheduled business meeting.





No Matter What: Committed Service to a Holy and Faithful God Pt. 26: "Signed, Sealed...but Delivered?" (Nehemiah 9:38-10:31)

God's people took the practical step of creating a written, sealed document to hold themselves accountable to their promises to the Lord. But did they deliver?

• In Nehemiah 9:38–10:31, God's people reached a turning point: they stopped merely **talking** about change and put it in **writing**.

1. Signed: A Response to Mercy (Neh. 9:38)

• The commitment wasn't a desperate attempt to earn God's **favor**, but a response to His historical **faithfulness**.

2. Sealed: The Public Ledger of Accountability (Neh. 10:1-31)

- The document wasn't just a **<u>private</u>** note; it was a **<u>public</u>** contract involving the whole community.
- Practical Vows: They focused on three specific, measurable areas: <u>Purity</u>, <u>Priorities</u>,
 Provision.

3. Delivered? The Sobering Reality

• **The Result:** After a short time (by Nehemiah 13), Nehemiah returned to find the people already had **broken** their **vows** regarding the Sabbath, temple support, and foreign marriages.

Practical Applications for the New Year:

- A) Document your Commitments.
- B) Invite Accountability.
- c) Rely on Grace.

Remember...While you may fail to deliver, God remains the ultimate "Covenant Keeper" who empowers you to start again!

If you've never trusted Jesus Christ as your Savior, come today and begin to experience that "new things have come" in Him (cf. 2 Cor. 5:17). He also will help you keep the commitments you make for the New Year (cf. 2 Tim. 1:12)!

Sub-Saharan African Peoples

Chad and Miriam Pumpelly both grew up as missionary kids, with Chad witnessing his parents share the gospel daily in Uganda. One life that deeply impacted him was Fred, a former criminal involved in car theft. After hearing the gospel, Fred gave his life to Christ. Moved by Fred's transformation, Chad placed his faith in Christ and was baptized the same day as Fred.

In high school in Kenya, Chad met Miriam, his future wife. After college, they married and pursued ministry, earning three master's degrees and having two children. They eventually found an opportunity to return to Africa, teaching at the Baptist Theological Seminary of Malawi.

Their ministry thrived, but not all of their children adapted well to life overseas. Trusting God's plan, they returned to the U.S. However, while leading a church group to Missions College in Richmond, Virginia, Chad felt it was time to return to the mission field.
