Commitment Time

<u>Counsel</u> with you regarding a challenging situation or decision you are facing, especially committing your life to Jesus Christ.

Encourage you as you seek to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord.

<u>Receive</u> your request for membership at Cleveland First Baptist Church.

You may become a CFBC member in the following ways:

By Public Profession of Faith in Jesus Christ as your Savior and Lord, following Him in obedience by scriptural baptism by immersion.

<u>By Baptism</u> if you already have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ but have never been scripturally baptized by immersion and are willing to be baptized.

By Transfer of Membership if you already have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ, scripturally baptized by immersion, and are a member of another Southern Baptist congregation. We will contact your former church to arrange for the transfer of your membership.

By Statement of Faith that you have been saved through faith in Jesus Christ and have been scripturally baptized by immersion.

*By Watchcare: Individuals temporarily living in the area but who do not wish to transfer their church membership may come under the watchcare of CFBC. They will be extended the privileges of fellowship and participation in church activities but may not vote in business meetings or serve in positions that require church membership.

All candidates for membership will complete an "Application for Membership," indicating how they're coming (profession, baptism, transfer, statement). All requests for membership will be shared with the congregation at the end of the worship service, and all candidate names will be presented for church approval at a regularly scheduled business meeting.





Cleveland First Baptist Church – Sunday, October 19, 2025 Message by Dr. Phillip E. Weaver

No Matter What: Committed Service to a Holy and Faithful God Pt. 19: "Maintaining Joyful Hearts in a Wounded World" (Nehemiah 8:9-12)

The Jews rebuilt the walls of Jerusalem and assembled as "one man" to hear Ezra read God's Law. After decades of neglect, the Word of God was unveiled again! Obedience to God's Word can transform godly sorrow into joy, helping us to "maintain joyful hearts in a wounded world."

Summary of Nehemiah 8:9-12

- I. The people's **mourning** (Neh. 8:9)
- II. A command to rejoice (Neh. 8:9-11)
- III. A call to <u>celebration</u> and <u>generosity</u> (Neh. 8:10-11)
- IV. The source of **strength** (Neh. 8:10)
- **V.** The result of **understanding** (Neh. 8:12)

Three key points of application:

- 1) Acknowledge the <u>wound</u> but don't <u>wallow</u> in it.
 - **Conviction** reveals our **need** for God (cf. 2 Cor. 7:10).
- 2) Lean on the <u>Lord</u>, His <u>Law</u> (<u>Word</u>), and His <u>love</u>.
 - The joy of the Lord is a **gift** and a **command** (cf. 2 Cor. 6:10).
- 3) Share the joy of <u>Jesus</u> with a wounded <u>world</u>.
 - "Minister **grace**" as a **conduit** of God's love to the lost (cf. Phil. 4:4; 1 Pet. 4:10).

The path to lasting joy begins with facing your brokenness through the lens of God's Word. You can choose not to be defined by your sorrows but to stand firm, strengthened by the joy of the Lord. Why not commit your life to Jesus Christ today and rely upon His strength to help you maintain a joyful heart no matter what you may experience within this wounded world?

South Asian Peoples

IMB missionaries Owen and Mila Stoddard moved to South Asia when their son Jamin was just six months old. By age two, Jamin showed significant developmental delays, but resources were scarce. Years later, a speech-language pathologist visited a homeschool conference, invited by the IMB's Asia educational consultant. Jamin's assessment indicated serious challenges, and Mila worried they might need to leave the mission field. Instead, the consultant assured them that the IMB would support Jamin's progress. The family partnered with the U.S.-based pathologist on a development plan, committing to try it for a year before re-evaluating. Though often overwhelmed, Mila said God's faithfulness sustained her. Each year, Jamin improved significantly, enabling the Stoddards to continue their work in South Asia. They credit God's provision and generous givers for making it possible to remain on the mission field and continue their ministry.



Through our support of the Cooperative Program, our church helps missionaries like the Stoddards remain on the mission field while providing necessary medical care for their son.
