

Advent Wreath Lighting

Reader 1: Today, we light the Advent candle of Joy. Just as this small light can fill a dark room, may Christ illumine our lives, bringing joy to our heart and to those around us.

Reader 2: Joy is at the heart of the Christmas story. In Luke 1 the virgin Mary, considering who it was she would give birth to, burst into song:

Reader 2: Great Joy: God has come to save us and is delighted to live among us! The long-awaited Messiah has come.

when I restore your fortunes


for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth,

⁵²he has brought down the mighty from their thrones and exalted those of humble estate;


⁵³he has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent empty away.

Sermon: The First Christmas Carol

Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made: who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. 

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


Prayer After Communion
